Chairman Goico recognized Dennis Hodgins who provided an overview of <u>HCR 5031</u> that would encourage TRICARE and the Department of Defense to consider, recognize, and authorize military personnel and their families to participate in substance abuse programs in Kansas.

Chairman Goico recognized Representative Judith Loganbill, a member of the Joint Committee on Kansas Security. Representative Loganbill supports <u>HCR 5031</u>; pointing out that TRICARE Health Alliance will cover mental disorders. The resolution encourages TRICARE to authorize substance abuse treatment without having to first diagnose a military member with a mental disorder. No written testimony provided.
