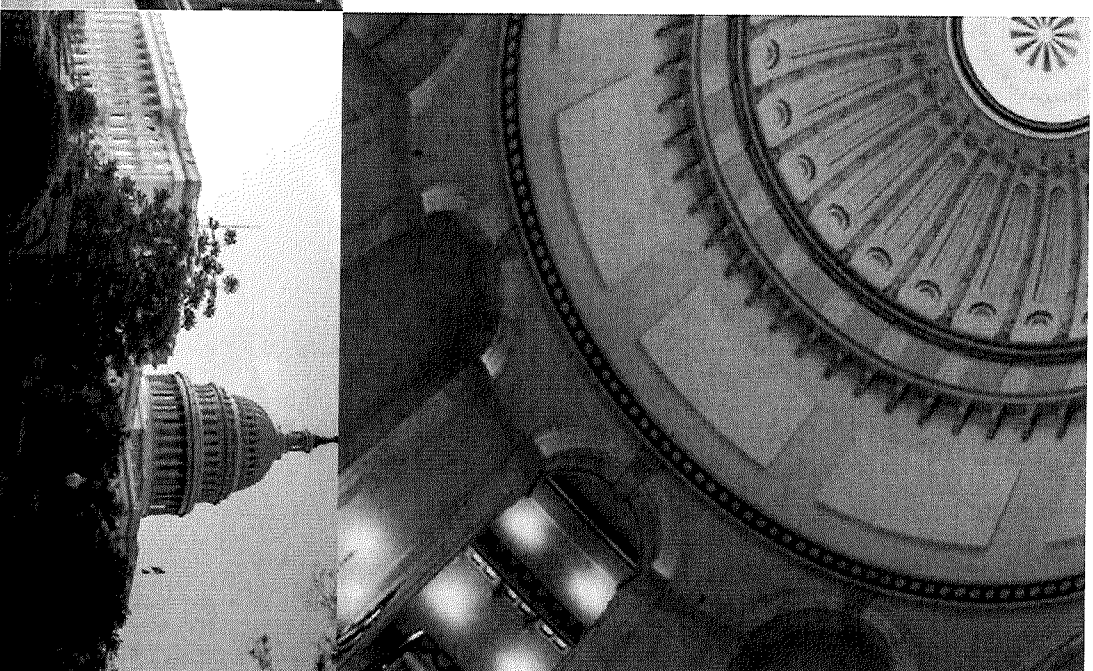
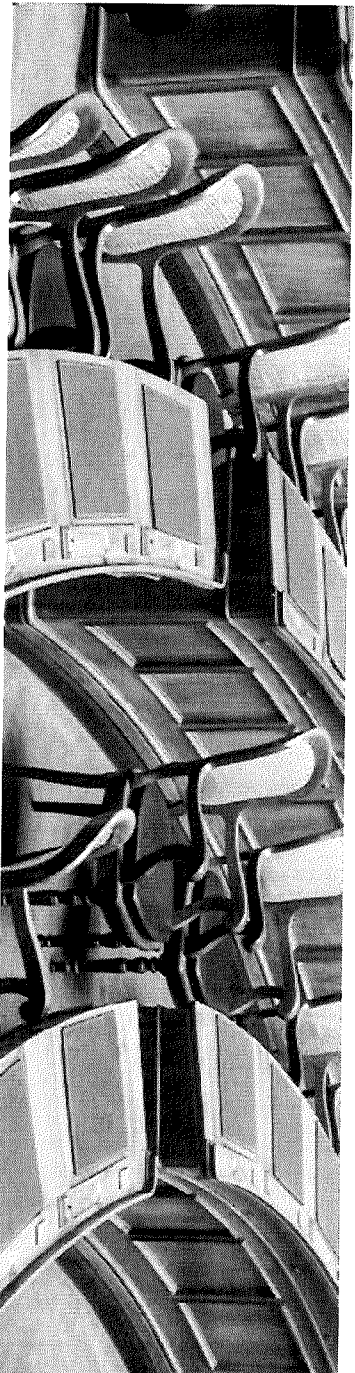

NCSL provides trusted, nonpartisan policy research and analysis



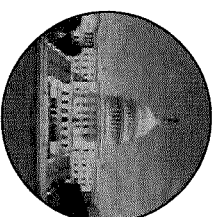
## Connections

NCSL links legislators and staff with each other and with experts



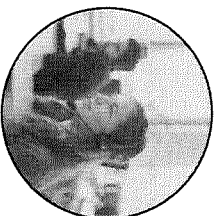

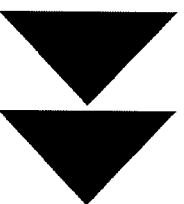
## Disinformation and change in campaigns

- **The election of 1800**
  - Supported by Thomas Jefferson, political journalist James Callender attacked John Adams stating he wanted to crown himself king and start war with France
- **Elections have adjusted to new technologies before**
  - TV and radio ads
  - Internet
- **Disinformation spreads quicker today due to the internet and phones**

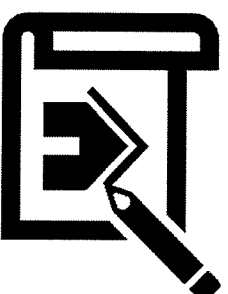
# How AI differs



- Widely accessible through ChatGPT or Midjourney
- Little skill needed



- Faster to use than Photoshop



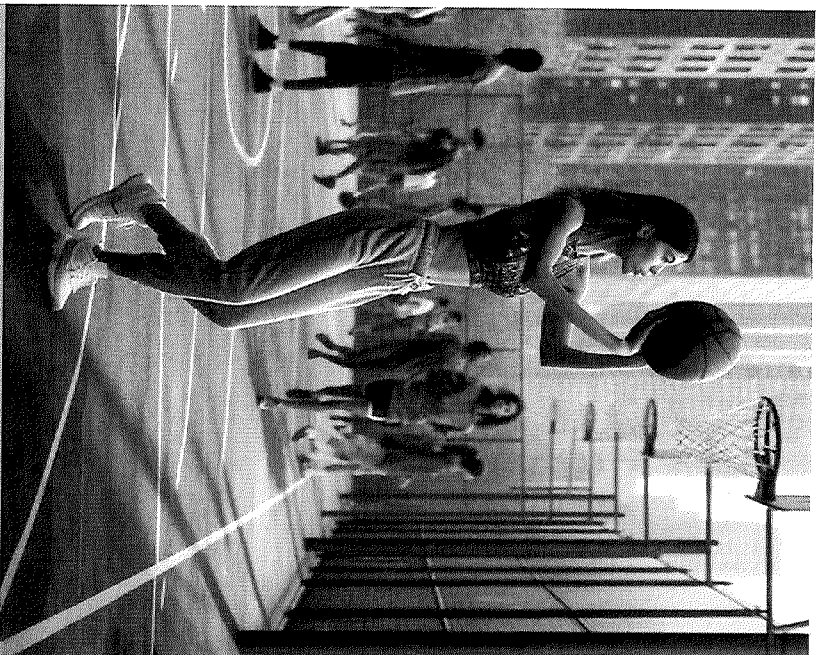
- Highly realistic



- 58% think AI will increase misinformation<sup>1</sup>

## What are deepfakes and how are they created?



- **States use different terms when referring to AI**
  - Deepfakes, synthetic media, deceptive media, doctored media, etc.
- **Deepfakes create realistic images or audio of things that never happened**
- **“Generative Adversarial Networks” (GAN) do the work**

How deepfakes have been used in campaigns

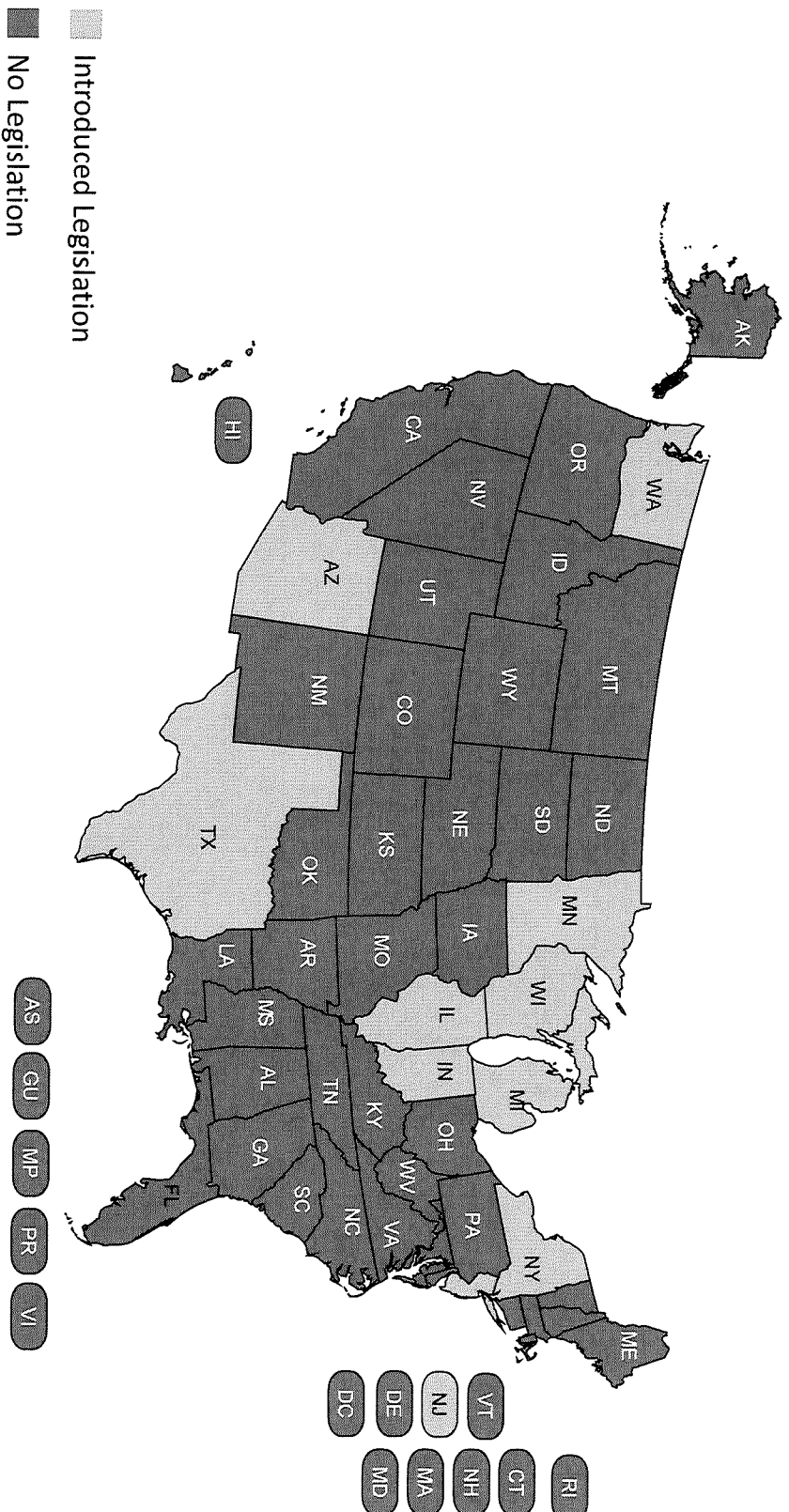
**Fake Biden robocall telling Democrats not to vote is likely an AI-generated deepfake**

The state's attorney general's office said the call was probably an effort at voter suppression ahead of Tuesday's primary.

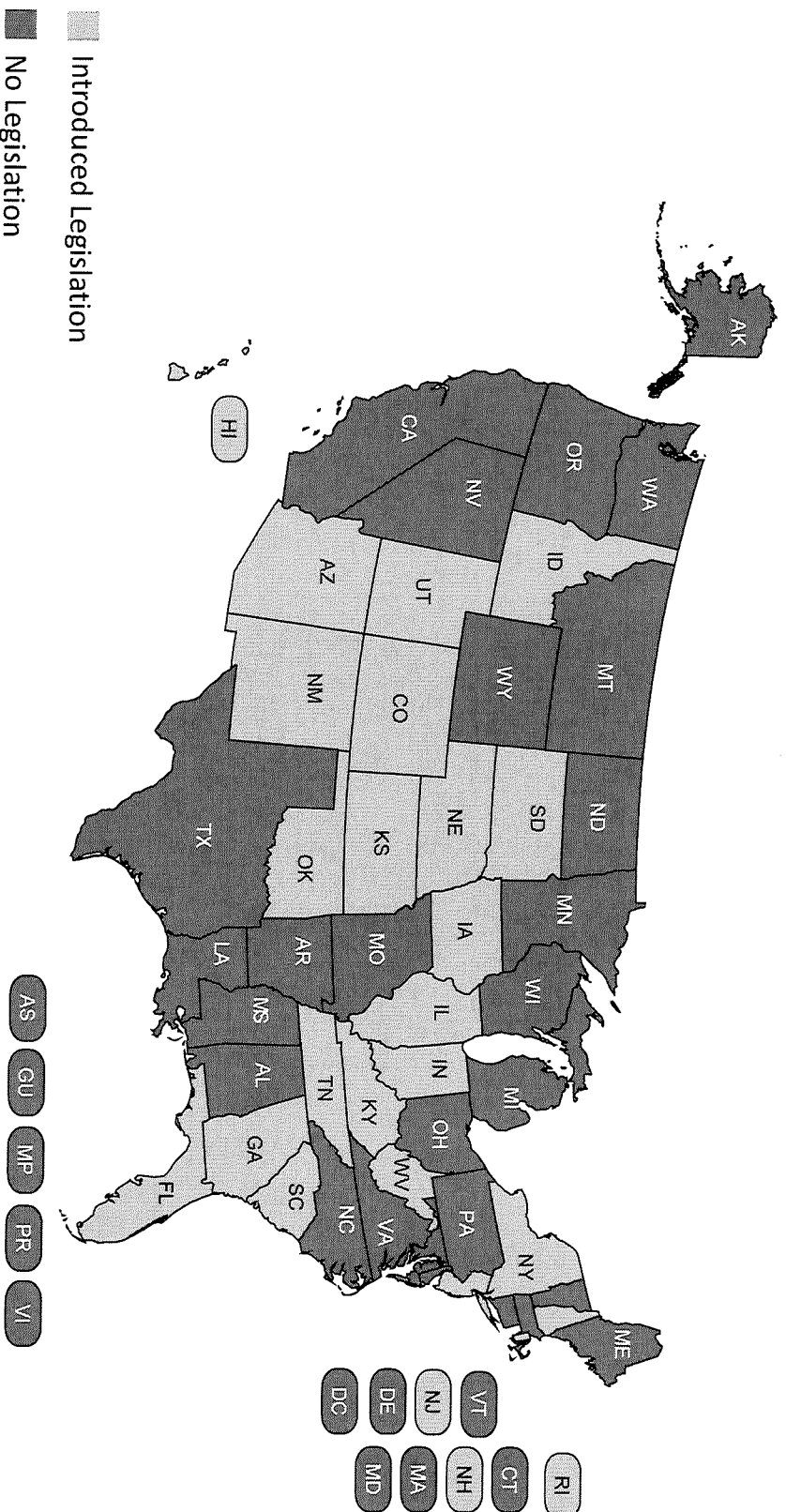

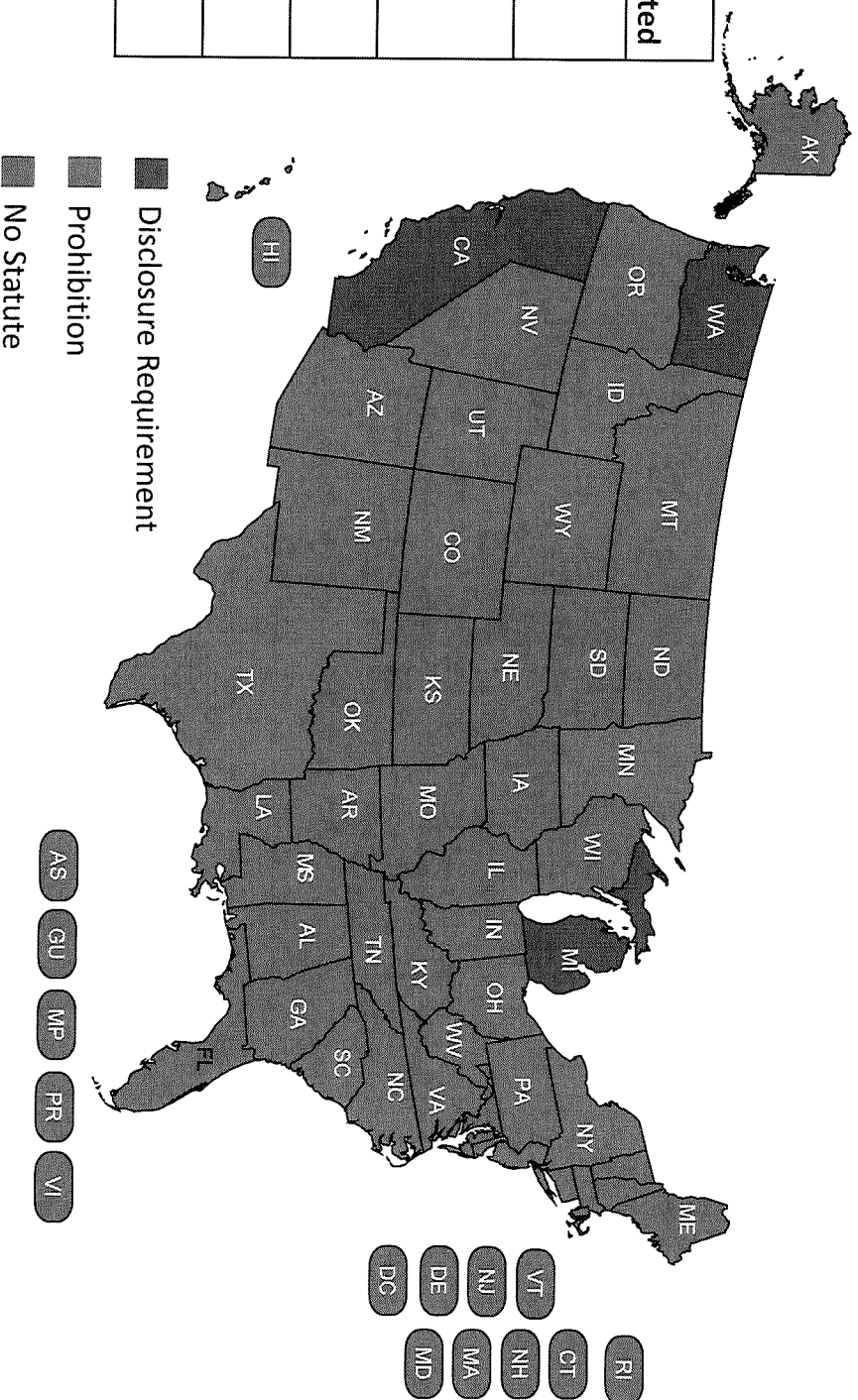

State	Statute	Year Enacted
California	Cal. Election Code §20010	2019
Michigan	Mich. Comp. Laws §§168.932f, 169.247	2023
Minnesota	Minn. Stat §609.771	2023
Texas	Tex. Election Code Ann. §255.004	2019
Washington	Wash. Rev. Code §42.62.020	2023



# AI prohibition states



## **Minnesota and Texas**

- Prohibit the dissemination (or entering into an agreement to disseminate) deepfakes with the intent to injure a candidate or influence an election
- Prohibited a certain number of days prior to an election

## AI disclosure requirement states

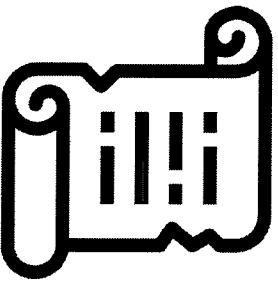


- **California, Michigan and Washington**
- Disclosure must be as large as the average size of other text on screen
- Must appear for the duration of the video
- If audio, must be stated at the beginning and end

## Other approaches states can consider

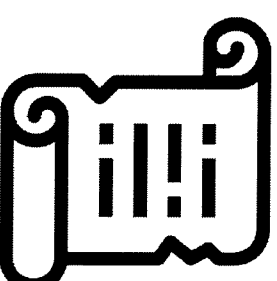
- **Review current statutes**
    - Wisconsin 1973 statute states: No person may knowingly make or publish, or cause to be made or published, a false representation
  - **Require information in metadata**
    - Colorado HB 1147 (2024): Requires the metadata to include the disclosure statement, the identity of the tool used to create the deepfake, and the date and time the deepfake was created.
- (Metadata describes behind-the-scenes data, e.g. data owner, data type, file creation date, who last modified the data and when.)

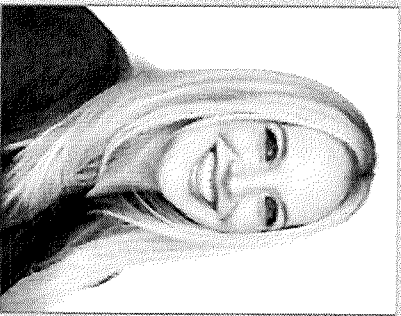

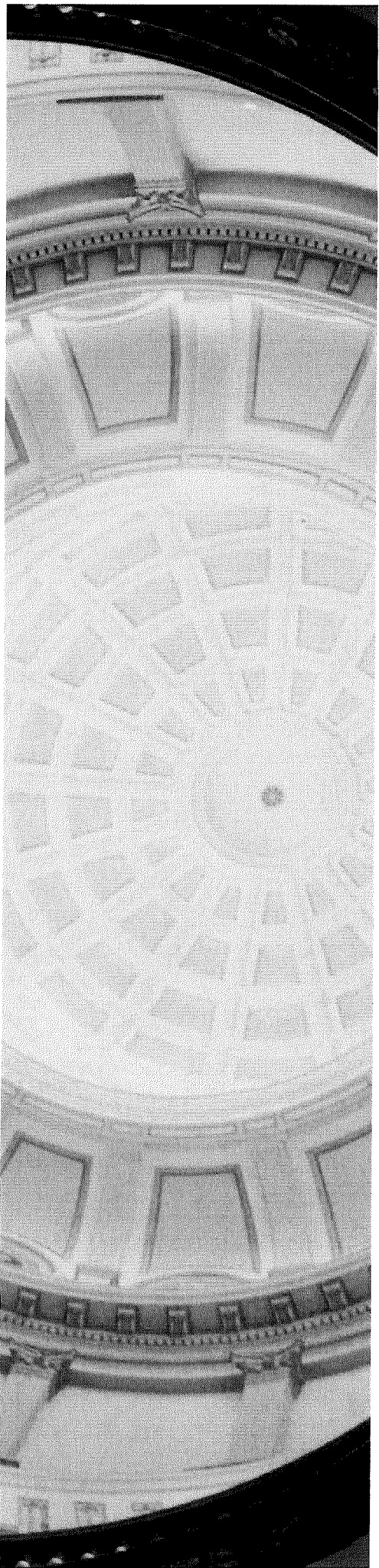
