CHAIRWOMAN WILLIAMS AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS:

Thank you for allowing us to testify in opposition to HB 2382. This bill sets out several provisions that would lead to security risks for the district and board members, reveal correspondence from patrons intended to be private, and potentially create chaos at board meetings.

Our biggest objections, however, involve the legislative overreach into decisions that should be made locally about how to manage local board meetings and information. According to the Kansas Constitution, locally elected boards maintain, develop and operate local public schools under the general supervision of the Kansas State Board of Education. For local boards of education to carry out their constitutional responsibilities, we believe the entity best positioned

to determine policy regarding the manner in which local board meetings will proceed is the local board, with input from patrons. Furthermore, patrons and board members are able to collaboratively develop policies that best fit their needs without legislative one-size-fits-all solutions.

Finally, this bill requires standards of "transparency" that the Legislature has not and would never require of its own members. Requiring another elected body to provide information to the public that you would never require of yourself as an elected official seems disingenuous. For these reasons we request the Committee not forward HB 2382 to the full House.
