Rule 2707. Vote Required for Adoption of House Resolutions and Concurrent Resolutions.

(a) A majority of the members then elected (or appointed) and qualified voting in the affirmative shall be necessary to adopt House resolutions and concurrent resolutions, except as otherwise specified in these rules.

(b) Adoption of concurrent resolutions to amend the Constitution of the state of Kansas, to call a Kansas constitutional convention, to extend a session of the Legislature in even-numbered years, to ratify any amendment of the Constitution of the United States, and to make any application for Congress to call a convention for proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States and shall require the number of votes required by the Constitution of the state of Kansas to pass such concurrent resolution. When required by the joint rules of the House and Senate, a concurrent resolution shall require a 2/3 majority of the members then elected (or appointed) and qualified, voting in the affirmative.
