Rule 1306. Voting in Committees. (a) All final actions by a committee shall be taken at a called meeting while the Legislature is in session.

(b) Final action shall be taken on any bill that has had a hearing for which a motion has been approved by a two-thirds vote of the members of the committee to consider such action on the bill. The final action taken—along with each individual member's vote shall be recorded in the committee minutes.—An individual member's vote may be recorded at the member's request. An individual member's vote may be recorded at the member's request.

(b)(e)(b) The committee chairperson may vote but shall not be required to vote unless the committee is equally divided. If the chairperson's vote makes the division equal, the question shall be lost.

(e)(d)(c) An action formally taken by a committee cannot be altered in the committee except by reconsideration and further formal action of the committee.

(d)(e)(d) A motion to take from the table may be adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members present at any called meeting of the committee.
