**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 307 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 307 is respectfully submitted to your committee.


SB 307 would amend the Kansas Fights Addiction Act. The will would add for-profit private entities to the definition of “qualified applicant.”

The Office of the Attorney General states that the bill would increase the number of potential recipients of grants as awarded by the Kansas Fights Addiction Act Grant Review Board. However, the bill would not have a fiscal effect on the agency.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, the Department of Corrections, the Department for Aging and Disability Services, and the Board of Pharmacy state that the bill would not have a fiscal effect. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 307 is not reflected in *The FY 2024 Governor’s Budget Report*.

The Kansas League of Municipalities indicates that the bill could affect cities if a city is awarded a grant from Kansas Fights Addiction Act Grant Review Board. This bill would increase the number of potential recipients and therefore could decrease the total amount that could be awarded to cities.
