HOUSE BILL No. 2022

AN ACT concerning the Kansas highway patrol; providing for appointment of the superintendent by the attorney general; establishing the highway patrol as a division under the jurisdiction of the attorney general; transferring functions concerning the highway patrol from the governor to the attorney general; amending K.S.A. 66-1302, 68-2025, 74-2113 and 74-2114 and repealing the existing sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

9 Section 1. K.S.A. 66-1302 is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-10 1302. The superintendent of the Kansas highway patrol may adopt rules 11 and regulations to secure proper and efficient enforcement of the laws of 12 the state in relation to motor carriers of passengers and property for hire, 13 not inconsistent with or in derogation of the powers, duties, and 14 responsibilities placed by existing statutes upon the corporation commission. It is declared necessary for the corporation commission, the 15 department of transportation, the department of revenue, and the Kansas 16 highway patrol to cooperate and to coordinate their actions and effort for 17 18 the proper and efficient enforcement of laws relating to motor carriers of 19 passengers and property for compensation.

20 If the corporation commission, department of transportation or 21 department of revenue-shall feel aggrieved by determines any order, rule, 22 or regulation adopted by the superintendent of the Kansas highway patrol 23 and shall desire to resist is not consistent with the laws of the state and is 24 opposed to the same, it shall serve, within 30 days after its adoption, 25 written notice upon the superintendent that it appeals from the order, rule 26 or regulation to the governor attorney general, and the superintendent shall 27 forthwith promptly certify to the governor attorney general the order, rule or regulation so appealed from, and the governor attorney general shall fix 28 29 a time and place for a hearing thereon. The superintendent shall cause all 30 interested parties to be notified of such time and place of such hearing, and 31 at the hearing, all persons interested shall be given opportunity to be fully 32 heard, and the governor attorney general shall thereupon decide the 33 appeal, and the decision of the governor attorney general shall be final, 34 conclusive and binding.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 68-2025 is hereby amended to read as follows: 68-2025. The Kansas turnpike authority and the superintendent of the Kansas

1 highway patrol are hereby authorized to provide by contract or agreement, 2 as provided-herein by this section, for the policing of any toll or turnpike 3 constructed and operated as permitted and provided by law. On and after 4 July 1, 2023, all such contracts or agreements shall be subject to the 5 approval of the governor attorney general and, if made, shall provide that 6 the total cost of-said such policing, including, but not limited to, all 7 salaries, expenses, uniforms, equipment, retirement benefits provided for 8 members of the Kansas highway patrol assigned to any toll or turnpike 9 facility, vehicles, communication equipment, training of members and 10 other items properly chargeable as costs of said policing shall be paid by the Kansas turnpike authority. Payments to the Kansas highway patrol due 11 12 under such contracts or agreements shall be made not less than monthly 13 and amounts so paid by the Kansas turnpike authority shall be deposited in 14 and credited to such fund as may be used for the support of the Kansas 15 highway patrol and shall be available for its use: Provided, That. Payments 16 made to provide retirement benefits shall be deposited in and credited to 17 the state highway patrol pension Kansas public employees retirement fund.

18 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 74-2113 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-19 2113. (a) There is hereby created a Kansas highway patrol. The patrol shall 20 consist of: (1) A superintendent, who shall have the rank of colonel and 21 who shall have special training and qualifications for the position; (2) an 22 assistant superintendent, who shall have the rank of lieutenant colonel; and (3) officers and troopers who are appointed in accordance with 23 24 appropriation acts and as provided in this section. The superintendent and 25 assistant superintendent shall be within the unclassified service under the 26 Kansas civil service act. The assistant superintendent shall be appointed by 27 the superintendent from among the members of the patrol, and shall serve 28 at the pleasure of the superintendent. If a person appointed as 29 superintendent, assistant superintendent or major is a member of the patrol 30 when appointed, the person in each case, upon termination of the term as 31 superintendent, assistant superintendent or major, respectively, shall be 32 returned to a rank not lower than the rank the person held when appointed 33 as superintendent, assistant superintendent or major. If the rank is filled at 34 that time, a temporary additional position shall be created in the rank until 35 a vacancy occurs in such rank. All other officers, troopers and employees 36 shall be within the classified service under the Kansas civil service act.

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(b) On and after July 1, 2023:

(1) The Kansas highway patrol is hereby under the jurisdiction of the
 attorney general, a division to be known as the Kansas highway patrol.

40 (2) The superintendent of the patrol shall be appointed by the 41 governor attorney general, subject to confirmation by the senate as 42 provided in K.S.A. 75-4315b, and amendments thereto, and shall receive 43 an annual salary fixed by the governor attorney general. Except as 1 provided by K.S.A. 46-2601, and amendments thereto, no person 2 appointed as superintendent shall exercise any power, duty or function as 3 superintendent until confirmed by the senate. The assistant superintendent 4 shall receive an annual salary fixed by the superintendent and approved by 5 the <u>governor</u> attorney general.

6 (3) All of the powers, duties and functions of the attorney general 7 concerning the Kansas highway patrol are hereby transferred to and 8 conferred and imposed upon the attorney general. The attorney general shall be the successor in every way to the powers, duties and functions of 9 the governor concerning the Kansas highway patrol in which the same 10 were vested prior to July 1, 2023. Every act performed in the exercise of 11 12 such powers, duties and functions by or under the authority of the governor concerning the Kansas highway patrol shall be deemed to have 13 the same force and effect as if performed by the attorney general in which 14 such powers, duties and functions were vested prior to July 1, 2023. 15 16 Whenever the governor, or words of like effect concerning the Kansas 17 highway patrol, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other 18 document, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the 19 attorney general. All orders and directives of the governor concerning the 20 Kansas highway patrol in existence on July 1, 2023, shall continue to be 21 effective and shall be deemed to be orders and directives of the attorney 22 general until revised, amended or nullified pursuant to law.

(c) All other members of the patrol shall be appointed by the superintendent in accordance with appropriation acts and with the Kansas civil service act. No person shall be appointed as an officer of the patrol, other than superintendent, unless the person has had at least five years of service in the patrol as an officer or trooper. No person shall be appointed as a trooper unless the person meets the following requirements:

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(1) Is a citizen of the United States;

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(2) is at least 21 years of age at the time of appointment;

(3) has not been convicted by any state or the federal government of a
 crime which is a felony or its equivalent under the uniform code of
 military justice;

(4) has been fingerprinted and a search of local, state and national
 fingerprint files has been made to determine whether the applicant has a
 criminal record;

(5) is the holder of a high school diploma or furnishes evidence of
 successful completion of an examination indicating an equivalent
 achievement; and

40 (6) is free of any physical or mental condition which might adversely
41 affect the applicant's performance of duties as a trooper and whose
42 physical health has been certified by an examining physician appointed by
43 the superintendent.

1 (d) No member of the patrol shall:

2 (1) Hold any other elective or appointive commission or office, 3 except:

4 (A) In the Kansas national guard or in the organized reserve of the 5 United States army, air force or navy.

- (B) In the governing body of a municipality:
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- (i) If the position to be held is appointed; or(ii) if the position to be held is elected on a nonpartisan basis.

9 (C) On any appointed board, commission or task force which the 10 superintendent of the highway patrol deems necessary as part of the 11 member's or officer's duties.

(2) Accept any employment or compensation from any licensee of the
 director of alcoholic beverage control of the department of revenue or
 from any licensee of the Kansas racing commission or from any officer,
 director, member or employee of any such licensee.

(3) Accept any employment or compensation for services which
require the use of any state-owned equipment provided by the Kansas
highway patrol or the wearing of the patrol uniform.

(4) Accept any reward or gift pertaining to the performance of the
 member's or officer's duties except with the written permission of the
 superintendent.

(e) For the purposes of this section, the terms "governing body" and
"municipality"-shall have the meanings ascribed to such terms mean the
same as defined in K.S.A. 12-105a, and amendments thereto.

25 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 74-2114 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-2114. (a) The personnel of the Kansas highway patrol shall be paid 26 27 compensation for their services as determined by the superintendent in 28 accordance with provisions of applicable laws, rules and regulations. 29 Military service of any member of the Kansas highway patrol who leaves 30 or has left the patrol for the purpose of serving in any branch of the armed 31 forces of the United States, during any war or national emergency and who 32 returns to the patrol within 60 days after release therefrom, shall be 33 considered as service with the patrol for the purpose of calculating any 34 longevity pay increase. The governor shall determine when a national 35 emergency exists or has existed.

36 (b) The salary of each member of the Kansas highway patrol shall be 37 fixed by the superintendent in accordance with the Kansas civil service 38 act. All members of the patrol shall receive their actual and necessary 39 traveling expenses and all salaries shall be paid monthly. On and after July 40 1, 2023, the Kansas highway patrol superintendent shall hold office at the pleasure of the governor attorney general. The personnel of the Kansas 41 42 highway patrol other than the superintendent shall serve upon first 43 appointment for a probationary period of one year. The superintendent is

authorized to assign any major, captain, lieutenant, sergeant or trooper for
 duty other than the place to which presently assigned. In such cases, the
 superintendent shall pay necessary moving expense from moneys
 appropriated for the Kansas highway patrol from the state general fund and
 available therefor in accordance with K.S.A. 75-3225, and amendments
 thereto.
 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 66-1302, 68-2025, 74-2113 and 74-2114 are hereby
 repealed.

9 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 10 publication in the statute book.
