# HOUSE BILL No. 2699

> AN ACT concerning crimes, punishment and criminal procedure; relating to crimes involving property; creating the crime of home invasion and aggravated home invasion and providing criminal penalties for violation thereof.

## Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Home invasion is, without authority, using physical force or the threat of physical force to enter into any dwelling or locked or secured portion of any dwelling:
(1) With intent to terrorize any person in such dwelling or portion of the dwelling;
(2) with knowledge that the dwelling or portion of the dwelling being entered is or may be occupied by another person and entry is not authorized;
(3) when the offender knows or reasonably should know that such entry will result in great bodily harm or death to any person; or
(4) when the offender is armed with a dangerous weapon or firearm.
(b) Aggravated home invasion is home invasion, as defined in subsection (a), when:
(1) The offender uses a dangerous weapon or firearm in the course of the home invasion; or
(2) the home invasion results in great bodily harm or death to any person.
(c) (1) Home invasion as defined in:
(A) Subsection (a)(1) or (a)(2) is a severity level 6, person felony; and
(B) subsection (a)(3) or (a)(4) is a severity level 5, person felony.
(2) Aggravated home invasion as defined in:
(A) Subsection (b)(1) is a severity level 4, person felony; and
(B) subsection (b)(2) is a severity level 2, person felony.
(d) A person who violates the provisions of this section may also be prosecuted for, convicted of and punished for any other person felony.
(e) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas criminal code.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
publication in the statute book.
