SENATE BILL No. 184

1 AN ACT concerning education; relating to certain nonpublic schools; 2 requiring participation in state assessments; requiring website 3 publication of performance accountability and longitudinal 4 achievement reports; amending K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-5178 and 5 repealing the existing section.

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7 WHEREAS, This act shall be known as the consumer research and 8 transparency act.

9 Now, therefore:

10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

11 New Section 1. (a) Each nonpublic school in this state shall 12 administer the statewide assessments provided by the state board of 13 education in K.S.A. 72-5170, and amendments thereto, to students 14 enrolled in the appropriate grades for each such assessment at such school.

(b) As used in this section, "nonpublic school" means an accredited or
nonaccredited private elementary or secondary school. "Nonpublic school"
does not include a home school or home school organization, community
consortium or group.

19 K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-5178 is hereby amended to read as Sec. 2. 20 follows: 72-5178. (a) On or before January 15 of each year, the state 21 department of education shall prepare and digitally update on the website 22 of the state department of education the performance accountability reports 23 and longitudinal achievement reports upon all students enrolled in any 24 public school or-accredited nonpublic school in the state, each school 25 district, each school operated by a school district and each-accredited-26 nonpublic school.

27 (b) Each performance accountability report shall be prepared in a 28 single-page format containing the information that is required to be 29 reported under the federal elementary and secondary education act, as 30 amended by the federal every student succeeds act, public law 114-95, or 31 any successor federal acts, and the college and career readiness metrics 32 developed and implemented by the state board. The report shall use the categories for achievement identified under the federal every student 33 34 succeeds act, public law 114-95, or any successor achievement categories. 35 All categories and metrics included in the report shall be clearly defined.

36 (c) Each longitudinal achievement report shall provide the

achievement rates on the state assessments for English language arts, math
 and science for all students and each student subgroup and the change in
 achievement rate year-over-year starting with the school year in which the
 state board first implemented new achievement standards on such state
 assessments.

6 (d) On or before January 15 of each year, the state department of 7 education shall prepare written academic achievement reports to provide a 8 summary of student achievement in this state and shall submit such reports 9 to the governor and the legislature. Such written academic achievement 10 reports shall:

(1) Provide a statewide summary of the performance accountability
 reports and longitudinal achievement reports prepared pursuant to this
 section. Such summary report shall provide:

(A) Achievement data from the English language arts assessments
and math assessments over the preceding five years for all students and
student subgroups to show whether there are statewide trends in academic
improvement or learning loss among all students and student subgroups;

18 (B) a comparison to any other evaluation metric used by the state 19 board of education to evaluate student achievement such as college and 20 career readiness measurements or graduation rates;

(C) a comparison to other educational assessments that measure
 academic performance such as the national assessment of educational
 progress;

(D) an analysis of the trends in student achievement outcomes and a
 review of conditions that are impacting recent student achievement
 outcomes;

27 (E) a review of the academic interventions that school districts are 28 using to improve student performance, whether the state board of 29 education has any specific recommendations regarding academic 30 interventions to improve academic achievement and an estimation of the 31 academic achievement gains that can be expected from such interventions; 32 and

(F) a summary of the performance levels and the scale and cut scores
 for the statewide assessments and how such information should be used to
 draw conclusions about student achievement; and

36 (2) provide a student-focused longitudinal achievement report that 37 provides information on the academic achievement of certain student 38 cohort groups to show the achievement gains or learning losses that are 39 occurring for such students. Such report shall begin with the students who 40 are entering grade three and grade eight in school year 2022-2023. The report shall summarize the longitudinal achievement of such students over 41 42 a three-year period and shall be repeated every three years for the students 43 entering such grade levels. The longitudinal report shall provide:

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1 (A) A summary of the improvement or learning loss that is occurring 2 within such student cohort groups over such three-year period for all such 3 students and the student subgroups;

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(B) an analysis of the evaluations and metrics that are used to measure the year-over-year achievement of such student cohort groups;

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6 (C) a review of the academic interventions that school districts are 7 using to improve student performance within such student cohort groups, 8 whether the state board of education has any specific recommendations 9 regarding academic interventions to improve academic achievement and 10 an estimate of the academic achievement gains that can be expected from 11 such interventions; and

12 (D) the achievement results from the English language arts 13 assessments and math assessments for such student cohort groups and any 14 other assessment data pertaining to such student cohort groups, including, 15 but not limited to, the national assessment for educational progress, the 16 ACT college entrance exam and the pre-ACT assessment.

(d) All reports prepared pursuant to this section shall be published in
 accordance with K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-1181, and amendments thereto.

19 (e) As used in this section, "nonpublic school" means an accredited 20 or nonaccredited private school that regularly offers education at the 21 elementary or secondary level. "Nonpublic school" does not include a 22 home school or home school organization, community, consortium or 23 group.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-5178 is hereby repealed.

25 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 26 publication in the statute book.
