AN ACT concerning disability services; relating to telecommunications 1 2 and information access services; establishing the blind information 3 access act; requiring the state librarian to contract with an organization 4 to provide on-demand information access services to persons who are 5 blind, visually impaired, deafblind or print disabled; establishing the 6 blind information access fund; requiring the transfer of moneys from 7 the Kansas universal service fund to provide for such services; 8 amending K.S.A. 66-2010 and repealing the existing section.

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10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

11 New Section 1. (a) This act shall be known and may be cited as the 12 blind information access act.

(b) The state librarian shall estimate the cost of entering into a 13 14 contract with an organization that delivers on-demand information access 15 services to persons who are blind, visually impaired, deafblind, print disabled or who have another disability. Such services shall provide access 16 to digital content through audio, electronic text and braille reading 17 18 technologies and other related services, including, but not limited to, 19 publications, Kansas specific publications, national international 20 publications, breaking news sources and localized emergency weather 21 alerts. Such on-demand information access services shall be provided 22 using telecommunication services or internet services.

(c) On or before-January 8, 2024 November 1 of each year, the state
 librarian shall submit a report to the legislature and the state corporation
 commission that specifies the estimate of the cost to enter into a contract
 to provide such on-demand information access services-

27 (d) On March 15, 2024, and on March 15 each year thereafter, the 28 state librarian and shall certify the such cost to enter into or renew such 29 contract to the director of accounts and reports and the administrator of the 30 Kansas universal service fund. Upon receipt of such certification, the total 31 amount certified shall be transferred by the administrator of the Kansas 32 universal service fund from the Kansas universal service fund to the state 33 treasurer-who shall in the following calendar year by 12 equal monthly installment payments. Upon receipt of each such payment, the state 34 35 treasurer shall deposit such amount in the state treasury and credit such amount to the blind information access fund. 36

(e)(d) Upon receipt of the amount certified pursuant to subsection-(d)
 (c), the state librarian shall enter into or renew the contract required
 pursuant to this section.

4 (f)(e) There is hereby created in the state treasury the blind 5 information access fund. All moneys credited to the blind information 6 access fund shall be used by the state librarian to implement the provisions 7 of this section. All expenditures from the blind information access fund 8 shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the 9 director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by 10 the state librarian or the state librarian's designee.

11 (g)(f) The state librarian shall promote the information access 12 services to persons who may be eligible for such services.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 66-2010 is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-2010. (a) The commission shall utilize a competitive bidding process to select a neutral, competent and bonded third party to administer the KUSF.

16 (b) The administrator shall be responsible for: (1) Collecting and 17 auditing all relevant information from all qualifying telecommunications telecommunications carriers 18 public utilities. or wireless 19 telecommunications service providers receiving funds from or providing funds to the KUSF; (2) verifying, based on the calculations of each 20 21 qualifying telecommunications carrier, telecommunications public utility 22 or wireless telecommunications service provider, the obligation of each 23 such qualifying carrier, utility or provider to generate the funds required by 24 the KUSF; (3) collecting all moneys due to the KUSF from all 25 telecommunications public utilities, telecommunications carriers and wireless telecommunications service providers in the state; and (4) 26 27 distributing amounts on a monthly basis due to qualifying 28 telecommunications public utilities, wireless telecommunications service 29 providers and telecommunications carriers receiving KUSF funding.

(c) Any information made available or received by the administrator
from carriers, utilities or providers receiving funds from or providing
funds to the KUSF shall not be subject to any provisions of the Kansas
open records act and shall be considered confidential and proprietary.

34 (d) The administrator shall be authorized to maintain an action to 35 collect any funds owed by any telecommunications carrier, public utility or 36 wireless telecommunications provider in the district court in the county of 37 the registered office of such carrier, utility or provider or, if such carrier, 38 utility or provider does not have a registered office in the state, such an 39 action may be maintained in the county where such carrier's, utility's or 40 provider's principal office is located. If such carrier, utility or provider has 41 no principal office in the state, such an action may be maintained in the 42 district court of any county in which such carrier, utility or provider 43 provides service.

(e) (1) The KUSF administrator shall be responsible to ensure that 1 2 funds do not fall below the level necessary to pay all amounts collectively owed to all qualifying telecommunications public utilities, wireless 3 telecommunications service providers-and, telecommunications carriers 4 and the information access services contracted for pursuant to section 1, 5 and amendments thereto. The administrator shall have the authority to 6 7 retain and invest in a prudent and reasonable manner any excess funds 8 collected in any period to help ensure that adequate funds are available to 9 cover amounts payable in other periods.

(2) Subject to the provisions of appropriations acts, for fiscal year-10 2013, the KUSF administrator may transfer moneys from the KUSF to the 11 state treasurer. Upon the receipt of any payment, the state treasurer shall 12 deposit the entire amount in the state treasury and credit it to the KAN-ED 13 14 fund. Any such payments shall be made after all payments required by 15 K.S.A. 66-2008, and amendments thereto, for the month are made from-16 the KUSF.

17 (2) Upon receipt of the certification from the state librarian issued 18 pursuant to section 1, and amendments thereto, the KUSF administrator 19 shall transfer the total amount of moneys certified by the state librarian 20 from the KUSF to the state treasurer in the following calendar year by 12 21 equal monthly installment payments. Upon receipt of each such payment, 22 the state treasurer shall deposit such amount in the state treasury and 23 credit-it such amount to the blind information access fund. 24

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 66-2010 is hereby repealed.
