1 AN ACT concerning education; relating to school districts; open
2 enrollment; providing for continued enrollment of students who attend
3 a school district of nonresidence; **allowing parents to appeal the denial**
4 **of an open enrollment application;** amending K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-
5 3123 and repealing the existing section.

7 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

8 Section 1. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-3123 is hereby amended to read as
9 follows: 72-3123. (a) Beginning in school year 2024-2025, ~~any child of~~
10 ~~school age pursuant to K.S.A. 72-3118, and amendments thereto, may~~
11 ~~attend a school operated by a school district where such child does not~~
12 ~~reside if such school district has open seats as determined pursuant to this~~
13 ~~section.~~

14 ~~(b)~~—the board of education of any school district shall permit
15 nonresident students to enroll in and attend the schools of the district if
16 such school district has open seats as determined pursuant to this section.

17 ~~(e)~~(b) Each school district shall determine capacity in each school of
18 the school district for the following school year as follows:

19 (1) For kindergarten and grades one through eight, the classroom
20 student-teacher ratio in each grade level; and

21 (2) for grades nine through 12, the student-teacher ratio for each
22 school building or program in each school building, including, but not
23 limited to, advanced placement or international baccalaureate programs.

24 ~~(d)~~(c) (1) On or before May 1 of each year, each school board shall
25 determine for each grade level in each school building of the school
26 district for the next succeeding school year the:

27 (A) Capacity as determined pursuant to subsection ~~(e)~~ (b);

28 (B) number of students expected to attend school in the school
29 district; and

30 (C) number of open seats available to nonresident students.

31 (2) On or before June 1 of each year, each school district shall publish
32 on such school district's website the number of open seats available to
33 nonresident students in each grade level for each school building of the
34 school district for the next succeeding school year.

35 (3) From June 1 through June 30, each school district shall accept
36 applications from nonresident students. Applications shall be on a form

1 and in a manner determined by the school district.

2 (4) If the number of applications for a grade level in a school building
3 is less than the number of available seats for such grade level in such
4 school building, the nonresident students shall be accepted for enrollment
5 and attendance at such school district. If the number of applications for a
6 grade level in a school building is greater than the number of available
7 seats for such grade level in such school building, the school district shall
8 randomly select nonresident students using a confidential lottery process.
9 Such process shall be completed on or before July 15 of each year.

10 (5) The school district shall provide to the parent or person acting as
11 parent of a nonresident student who was not accepted for or denied
12 enrollment at such school district the reason for the nonacceptance or
13 denial and an explanation of the nonresident student selection process *on*
14 *or before July 30 of each year.*

15 *(6) If an application by a nonresident student is denied by the*
16 *school district, the parent or person acting as parent of such student may*
17 *appeal such denial to the school district board of education. If the*
18 *appeal is unsuccessful, the parent or person acting as parent may appeal*
19 *to the commissioner of education who shall conduct a hearing on the*
20 *appeal in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act.*

21 ~~(e)~~(d) (1) Subject to capacity, school districts shall give priority to
22 any sibling of a nonresident student who ~~was~~ *is enrolled in and attending*
23 *such school district or who is* accepted to enroll in and attend such school
24 district. Priority shall be given when the nonresident student is first
25 accepted and, if necessary, at any other time the school district considers
26 transfer applications. Any such sibling shall not be subject to the open seat
27 lottery.

28 (2) Subject to capacity, school districts shall give priority to any
29 nonresident student who is a military student as defined in K.S.A. 72-
30 5139, and amendments thereto. Priority shall be given when the military
31 student is first accepted and, if necessary, at any other time the school
32 district considers transfer applications. Any such military student shall not
33 be subject to the open seat lottery.

34 (3) Any child who is in the custody of the department for children
35 and families and who is living in the home of a nonresident student who
36 transfers may attend school in the receiving school district.

37 (4) Any nonresident student who has a parent or person acting as
38 parent employed by a school district shall be permitted to enroll in and
39 attend such school district as if the student is a resident of the school
40 district. Any such student shall not be subject to the open-seat lottery
41 established pursuant to subsection ~~(d)~~ (c) when enrolling in and attending
42 the school district where the parent or person acting as parent is employed.

43 (5) Any child who is experiencing homelessness shall be permitted to

1 enroll in and attend the school district of origin or the school district of
2 residence.

3 ~~(f)~~(e) A school district shall not:

4 (1) Charge tuition or fees to any nonresident student who transfers to
5 such school district pursuant to this section except fees that are otherwise
6 charged to every student enrolled in and attending school in the district; or

7 (2) accept or deny a nonresident student transfer based on ethnicity,
8 national origin, gender, income level, disabling condition, proficiency in
9 the English language, measure of achievement, aptitude or athletic ability.

10 ~~(g)~~(f) (1) A nonresident student ~~who has been~~ accepted for enrollment
11 and attendance at a receiving school district *on or after June 1, 2024*, shall
12 be permitted to continue such enrollment and attendance in such school
13 district until such student graduates from high school, unless such student
14 is *deemed as* no longer in good standing.

15 (2) *A nonresident student who was enrolled in and attended a school*
16 *district of nonresidence during school year 2023-2024 shall be permitted*
17 *to continue such enrollment and attendance in such school district until*
18 *such student graduates from high school, unless such student is deemed as*
19 *no longer in good standing.*

20 (g) A receiving school district may deem ~~a~~ any nonresident student as
21 not in good standing in accordance with such school district's nonresident
22 transfer policy. Prior to making any determination to deem a nonresident
23 student as not in good standing, a district shall consider a student's status
24 as a homeless child and the resulting factors of homelessness on such
25 student's standing.

26 (h) A student may always enroll at any time in the school district
27 where such student resides.

28 (i) Except for a child in the custody of the department for children
29 and families or a child who is experiencing homelessness, a nonresident
30 student shall not transfer more than once per school year to one or more
31 receiving school districts pursuant to the provisions of this section.

32 (j) ***Neither a resident school district nor*** a receiving school district
33 shall ~~not~~ be required to provide transportation to nonresident students,
34 ***unless otherwise required by applicable law.*** If space is available on
35 school district transportation vehicles, a school district may provide
36 nonresident students an in-district bus stop where transportation may be
37 provided by such school district to and from such bus stop and the school
38 for such nonresident students. A school district shall ensure that
39 transportation for nonresident homeless students is provided comparably
40 to that of housed students.

41 (k) Each school district board of education shall submit to the state
42 department of education the school district's policy adopted pursuant to
43 K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-3126, and amendments thereto, the number of

1 nonresident student transfers approved and denied by such board in each
2 grade level and whether the denials were based on capacity or in
3 accordance with the policy adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-
4 3126, and amendments thereto. The state department of education shall
5 collect and report such data on such department's website and make such
6 data available to the legislative division of post audit.

7 (l) (1) Each year, the state department of education, as part of the
8 department's enrollment audit, shall audit the nonresident student capacity
9 and enrollment.

10 (2) In calendar year 2027, the legislative post audit committee shall
11 direct the legislative division of post audit to conduct an audit of
12 nonresident student transfers pursuant to this section. Such audit shall be
13 reported to the legislative post audit committee on or before January 15,
14 2028, and subsequently presented to the house standing committee on K-
15 12 education budget and the senate standing committee on education, or
16 any successor committees.

17 (m) Nothing in this section shall be construed to exempt any
18 nonresident student who transfers to a receiving school district pursuant to
19 this section from the policies and requirements of the activities association
20 referred to in K.S.A. 72-7114, and amendments thereto.

21 (n) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any school
22 located on a military installation as defined in K.S.A. 72-8268, and
23 amendments thereto.

24 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-3123 is hereby repealed.
