# **Agency Estimate**

The **agency** submits a revised estimate of \$8.4 million, all from special revenue funds, in FY 2023. This is an increase of \$1.2 million, or 16.6 percent, above the FY 2023 approved amount. This increase is due to the addition of \$1.2 million, all from federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, as aid to local governments through the Kansas Firefighters Recruitment and Safety Grant (KFRSG) program. This program provides no-match funds to volunteer and part-time fire departments primarily for personal protective equipment. Further, the agency requests language authorizing a transfer from the Elevator Safety Fee Fund to the Fire Marshal Fee Fund to reimburse start-up expenditures associated with implementing provisions of 2022 HB 2005, creating the Elevator Safety Act. This act directs the agency to license elevator inspectors, contractors, and mechanics; however, the program is not anticipated to draw revenue from license fees until January 2023.

The revised estimate includes 69.3 FTE positions, which is a decrease of 3.0 FTE positions below the FY 2023 approved number. The position decrease is mainly from the Administration Division and Fire Prevention Division.
