Senator Mark Taddiken introduced the speaker, Dr. Gary Pierzynski from K-State, Manhattan, Kansas.

Dr. Gary Pierzynski expressed appreciation at being able to address the joint meeting. He introduced the KSU staff present at this meeting. Then he referred to the booklet "Making a Difference for All Kansans: 2012 Report to the Legislature." (on file at K-State)

He highlighted activities of K-State Research and Extension. This report described programs aimed at improving nutrition; providing 4-H youth programs; planning smoke management in the Flint Hills; and offering training for feedlot personnel. Also, the booklet map shows statewide offices and research facilities districts.

Dr. Pierzynski remarked on the budget, which is fairly complicated. County and district offices are funded through county and state appropriations. K-State has both state and federal appropriations. Also, tuition fits the academic and research sides.
