SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2113 by House Committee on Vision 2020

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2113 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2113 would increase the statewide property tax mill levy for the Educational Building Fund (EBF) from 1.0 mill to 4.0 mills beginning in 2011 and each year thereafter. The bill would also allow community colleges and technical schools to receive funding from the EBF. Currently, only the Regents universities may access the EBF.

The Department of Revenue estimates that HB 2113 would increase EBF revenues by \$90,420,000 in FY 2012.
