
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2488 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2488 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, the municipal court may impose any conditions of probation or suspension of sentence that the court deems proper, including requiring that the defendant make reparation or restitution to the aggrieved party for damage or loss directly caused by the defendant's crime. HB 2488 would allow the court to include any increase in the aggrieved party's insurance premiums caused by the defendant's crime.

Both the Insurance Department and the Office of Judicial Administration report that HB 2488 would have no fiscal effect. Any potential fiscal effect would apply to the parties affected by the case and payment of insurance premium cost increases.
