AN ACT concerning experience requirements for certain contractors; amending K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 12-1509, 12-1526 and 12-1542 and repealing the existing sections.

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5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 12-1509 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 12-1509. (a) Any county or city requiring the licensure of 8 plumbers practicing within the county or city may conduct examinations 9 designated by K.S.A. 12-1508, and amendments thereto, for the purpose of determining the competency of applicants for such licensure and shall not 10 be allowed to ask further questions not designated on such examination. 11 12 The board of county commissioners of such county or the governing body 13 of such city shall adopt rules and regulations: (1) Governing the conduct 14 and grading of such examinations; (2) prescribing a minimum score of 15 75% for passage of examinations; (3) fixing a uniform fee to be charged 16 all applicants taking each such examination; and (4) requiring all persons 17 receiving such license annually to obtain not less than 12 hours biennially 18 or six hours annually of continuing education approved by such local 19 governing body. Not less than six hours biennially or three hours annually 20 shall consist of code education. Continuing education may be provided by 21 the local governing body, a nationally recognized trade association, 22 community college, technical school, technical college or other provider 23 approved by the local governing body. All hours of education shall consist 24 of training relative to construction, maintenance and code update training. 25 Neither the county commission nor the governing body of such city shall 26 impose any restriction on the number of providers of such continuing 27 education.

28 The certificate of competency received by any person who (b) 29 completes the experience requirements specified in subsection (e) and who 30 successfully passes an examination designated by K.S.A. 12-1508, and 31 amendments thereto, shall be valid proof of competency for licensure, 32 without additional examination, in any county or city of the state which 33 requires licensure of plumbers practicing within such county or city. The 34 county or city shall issue the appropriate license certificate to any 35 applicant therefor who presents such a certificate of competency and who 36 demonstrates that such applicant has met the experience requirements

1 specified in subsection (e). The county or city shall fix a uniform fee to be 2 charged all such applicants for licensure.

(c) All new licenses issued by a county or city upon the basis of 3 successful passage of an examination designated by K.S.A. 12-1508, and 4 5 amendments thereto, shall bear a distinctive notation identifying the 6 testing agency and the specific test by name. All such licenses renewed 7 upon the basis of completed continuing education as provided by 8 subsection (a) shall bear a distinctive notation to verify such completion. 9 All such licenses shall be valid in any other county or city which requires 10 examination and licensure of plumbers for practice in such county or city.

(d) No person who was certified or licensed prior to July 1, 1989, 11 12 upon the basis of passage of a standard examination designated as such under the provisions of article 15 of chapter 12 of Kansas Statutes 13 Annotated, and amendments thereto, and whose certificate or license was 14 issued by a political subdivision which prescribed a minimum score of not 15 16 less than 70% for passage of such examination, shall be required to be 17 reexamined for renewal of certification or licensure

18 (e) Before sitting for the standard examination designated by K.S.A. 19 12-1508, and amendments thereto, an applicant for a journeyman-20 certificate shall demonstrate issuing a journeyman certificate, the issuing 21 jurisdiction shall verify the validity of the applicant's documented proof of 22 a minimum of two years field experience. "Field experience" means 23 working under the direct supervision of a person having a valid 24 journeyman certificate or master certificate or attending trade related 25 schooling. No more than one year of the requirement may be satisfied by trade related schooling. Schooling shall consist of a minimum of 240 hours 26 27 classroom training.

28 Before sitting for the standard examination designated by K.S.A. (f) 12-1508, and amendments thereto, an applicant for a master certificate 29 30 shall demonstrate issuing a master certificate, the issuing jurisdiction shall 31 verify the validity of the applicant's documented proof of having a valid 32 journeyman certificate for a minimum of two years or having field 33 experience for a minimum of four years.

34 (g)(1)No person shall install, improve, repair, maintain or inspect a 35 medical gas piping system within a county or city unless such person: (A) 36 Is licensed under the provisions of K.S.A. 12-1508 et seq., and 37 amendments thereto; and (B) is certified under the appropriate professional 38 qualifications standard or standards of ASSE Series 6000. All installers 39 shall obtain a proper permit from the county or city for which the medical 40 gas is being installed, all inspections shall be done by a third party agency certified under the appropriate professional qualifications standard or 41 standards of ASSE Series 6000 for medical gas systems inspectors and all 42 43 documentation of the inspections and certifications of installers and

1 inspectors shall be provided to the county or city prior to any occupancy of 2 the building or unit of the building in which the medical gas piping has 3 been installed until an occupancy permit is issued. This subsection shall 4 not apply in counties or cities in which building codes require an inspector 5 certified by a nationally-recognized code organization to inspect medical 6 gas installation prior to an occupancy permit being issued or to limited 7 maintenance on a medical gas piping system previously installed in a 8 hospital when performed by hospital maintenance personnel.

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(2) As used in this subsection (g):

(A) "Medical gas piping" means the piping used solely to transport
 gasses used for medical purposes at a health care facility or the place of
 business of a health care provider;

(B) "limited maintenance" means minor repair or replacement ofincidental parts and any related inspection or testing; and

15 (C) "hospital" means a medical care facility as defined in K.S.A. 65-16 425, and amendments thereto, and includes within its meaning any clinic, 17 long-term care facility, limited care residential facility and joint enterprises 18 for the provision of health care services operated in connection with the 19 operation of the medical care facility.

20 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 12-1526 is hereby amended to read as 21 follows: 12-1526. (a) Any county or city requiring the licensure of 22 electricians practicing within the county or city may conduct examinations 23 designated by K.S.A. 12-1525, and amendments thereto, for the purpose of determining the competency of applicants for such licensure and shall not 24 25 be allowed to ask further questions not designated on such examination. 26 The board of county commissioners of such county or the governing body 27 of such city shall adopt rules and regulations: (1) Governing the conduct 28 and grading of such examinations; (2) prescribing a minimum score of 29 75% for passage of examinations; (3) fixing a uniform fee to be charged all applicants taking each such examination; and (4) requiring all persons 30 31 receiving such license to obtain not less than 12 hours biennially or six 32 hours annually of continuing education approved by such local governing 33 body. Not less than six hours biennially or three hours annually shall 34 consist of code education. Continuing education may be provided by the 35 local governing body, a nationally recognized trade association, 36 community college, technical school, technical college or other provider 37 approved by the local governing body. All hours of education shall consist 38 of training relative to construction, maintenance and code update training. 39 Neither the county commission nor the governing body of such city shall 40 impose any restriction on the number of providers of such continuing 41 education.

42 (b) The certificate of competency received by any person who 43 *completes the experience requirements specified in subsection (e) and who* 1 successfully passes an examination designated by K.S.A. 12-1525, and 2 amendments thereto, shall be valid proof of competency for licensure, 3 without additional examination, in any county or city of the state which 4 requires licensure of electricians practicing within such county or city. The 5 county or city shall issue the appropriate license certificate to any 6 applicant therefor who presents such a certificate of competency and who 7 demonstrates that such applicant has met the experience requirements 8 specified in subsection (e). The county or city shall fix a uniform fee to be 9 charged all such applicants for licensure.

10 (c) All new licenses issued by a county or city upon the basis of successful passage of an examination designated by K.S.A. 12-1525, and 11 12 amendments thereto, shall bear a distinctive notation identifying the 13 testing agency and the specific test by name. All licenses renewed upon the basis of completed continuing education as provided by subsection (a) 14 shall bear a distinctive notation to verify such completion. All such 15 16 licenses shall be valid in any other county or city which requires 17 examination and licensure of electricians for practice in such county or 18 city.

(d) No person who was certified or licensed prior to July 1, 1989,
upon the basis of passage of a standard examination designated as such
under the provisions of article 15 of chapter 12 of Kansas Statutes
Annotated, *and amendments thereto*, and whose certificate or license was
issued by a political subdivision which prescribed a minimum score of not
less than 70% for passage of such examination, shall be required to be
reexamined for renewal of certification or licensure.

26 (e) Before sitting for the standard examination designated by K.S.A. 27 12-1525, and amendments thereto, an applicant for a journeyman or-28 residential certificate shall demonstrate issuing a journeyman or 29 residential certificate, the issuing jurisdiction shall verify the validity of the applicant's documented proof of a minimum of two years field 30 31 experience. "Field experience" means working under the direct supervision 32 of a person having a valid journeyman certificate, residential certificate or 33 master certificate or attending trade related schooling. No more than one 34 year of the requirement may be satisfied by trade related schooling. 35 Schooling shall consist of a minimum of 240 hours classroom training.

(f) Before sitting for the standard examination designated by K.S.A.
12-1525, and amendments thereto, an applicant for a master certificate
shall demonstrate issuing a master certificate, the issuing jurisdiction shall
verify the validity of the applicant's documented proof of having a valid
journeyman certificate for a minimum of two years.

41 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 12-1542 is hereby amended to read as 42 follows: 12-1542. (a) Any county or city requiring the licensure of 43 mechanical heating, ventilation and air conditioning contractors and

master and journeyman heating, ventilation and air conditioning 1 2 mechanics practicing within the county or city may conduct examinations 3 designated by K.S.A. 12-1541, and amendments thereto, for the purpose of 4 determining the competency of applicants for such licensure and shall not 5 be allowed to ask further questions not designated on such examination. 6 The board of county commissioners of such county or the governing body 7 of such city shall adopt rules and regulations: (1) Governing the conduct 8 and grading of such examinations; (2) prescribing a minimum score of 9 75% for passage of examinations; (3) fixing a uniform fee to be charged 10 all applicants taking each such examination; and (4) requiring all persons receiving such license annually to obtain not less than 12 hours biennially 11 12 or six hours annually of continuing education approved by such local 13 governing body. Not less than six hours biennially or three hours annually 14 shall consist of code education. Continuing education may be provided by the local governing body, a nationally recognized trade association, 15 16 community college, technical school, technical college or other provider 17 approved by the local governing body. The county or city shall issue the appropriate license certificate to any applicant 30 31 therefor who presents such a certificate of competency and who 32 demonstrates that such applicant has met the experience requirements 33 specified in subsection (e). The county or city shall fix a uniform fee to be 34 charged all such applicants for licensure.

(c) All new licenses issued by a county or city upon the basis of 35 36 successful passage of an examination designated by K.S.A. 12-1541, and 37 amendments thereto, shall bear a distinctive notation identifying the 38 testing agency and the specific test by name. All licenses renewed upon the 39 basis of completed continuing education as provided by subsection (a) 40 shall bear a distinctive notation to verify such completion. All such 41 licenses shall be valid in any other county or city which requires 42 examination and licensure of mechanical heating, ventilation and air 43 conditioning contractors and master and journeyman heating, ventilation

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1 and air conditioning mechanics for practice in such county or city.

(d) No person who was certified or licensed prior to July 1, 1989, upon the basis of passage of a standard examination designated by the political subdivision and whose certificate or license was issued by such political subdivision which prescribed a minimum score of not less than 70% for passage of such examination, shall be required to be reexamined for renewal of certification or licensure.

8 (e) Before sitting for the standard examination designated by K.S.A. 9 12-1541, and amendments thereto, an applicant for a journeyman heating, ventilation and air conditioning mechanic certificate shall demonstrate-10 issuing a journeyman heating, ventilation and air conditioning mechanic 11 12 certificate, the issuing jurisdiction shall verify the validity of the applicant's documented proof of a minimum of two years field experience. 13 "Field experience" means working under the direct supervision of a person 14 15 having a valid journeyman certificate or master certificate or attending 16 trade related schooling. No more than one year of the requirement may be 17 satisfied by trade related schooling. Schooling shall consist of minimum of 18 240 hours classroom training.

19 (f) Before sitting for the standard examination designated by K.S.A. 20 12-1541, and amendments thereto, an applicant for a master heating, 21 ventilation and air conditioning mechanic certificate shall demonstrate-22 issuing a master heating, ventilation and air conditioning certificate, the 23 issuing jurisdiction shall verify the validity of the applicant's documented 24 proof of having a valid journeyman certificate for a minimum of two years 25 or having field experience for a minimum of four years. 26 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 12-1509, 12-1526 and 12-1542 are hereby
