## HOUSE BILL No. 2742

1 AN ACT concerning real and personal property; relating to the medical 2 assistance recovery program; amending K.S.A. 39-702, 58-3957, 58a-3 818, 59-1501, 59-2239 and 59-2250 and K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 39-709, 4 59-1507b, 59-2222 and 59-2247 and repealing the existing sections. 5 6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 7 Section 1. K.S.A. 39-702 is hereby amended to read as follows: 39-8 702. The following words and phrases when used in this act shall, for the 9 purposes of this act, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in 10 this section: (a) "Secretary" means the secretary of social and rehabilitation 11 12 services, unless otherwise specified. 13 "Applicants" means all persons who, as individuals, or in whose (b) 14 behalf requests are made of the secretary for aid or assistance. 15 (c) "Social welfare service" may include such functions as giving assistance, the prevention of public dependency, and promoting the 16 17 rehabilitation of dependent persons or those who are approaching public 18 dependency. 19 (d) "Assistance" includes such items or functions as the giving or 20 providing of money, food stamps or coupons, food, clothing, shelter, 21 medicine or other materials, the giving of any service, including 22 instructive or scientific, and the providing of institutional care, which may 23 be necessary or helpful to the recipient in providing the necessities of life 24 for the recipient and the recipient's dependents. The definitions of social 25 welfare service and assistance in this section shall be deemed as partially 26 descriptive and not limiting. 27 (e) "Aid to families with dependent children" means financial 28 assistance with respect to or on behalf of a dependent child or dependent 29 children and includes financial assistance for any month to meet the needs 30 of the relative with whom any dependent child is living. 31 (f) "Medical assistance" means the payment of all or part of the cost 32 of necessary: (1) Medical, remedial, rehabilitative or preventive care and 33 services which are within the scope of services to be provided under a 34 medical care plan developed by the secretary pursuant to this act and 35 furnished by health care providers who have a current approved provider agreement with the secretary; and (2) transportation to obtain care and 36

services which are within the scope of services to be provided under a
 medical care plan developed by the secretary pursuant to this act.

3 (g) "Dependent children" means needy children under the age of 18, 4 or who are under the age of 19 and are full-time students in secondary 5 schools or the equivalent educational program or are full-time students in a 6 program of vocational or technical training if they may be reasonably 7 expected to complete the training before attaining age 19, who have been 8 deprived of parental or guardian support or care by reasons of the death, 9 continued absence from the home, or physical or mental incapacity of a 10 parent or guardian, and who are living with any blood relative, including those of the half-blood, and including first cousins, uncles, aunts, and 11 12 persons of preceding generations are denoted by prefixes of grand, great, 13 or great-great, and including the spouses or former spouses of any persons 14 named in the above groups, in a place of residence maintained by one or 15 more of such relatives as their own home. The secretary may adopt rules and regulations which extend the deprivation requirement under this 16 17 definition to include being deprived of parental or guardian support or care by reason of the unemployment of a parent or guardian. The term 18 19 "dependent children" also includes children who would meet the foregoing 20 requirements except for their removal from the home of a relative as a 21 result of judicial determination to the effect that continuation therein 22 would be contrary to the welfare of such children, for whose placement 23 and care the secretary is responsible, who have been placed in a foster 24 family home or child care institution as a result of such determination and 25 who received aid to dependent children in or for the month in which court proceedings leading to such determination were initiated, or would have 26 27 received such aid in or for such month if application had been made 28 therefor, or in the case of a child who had been living with a relative 29 specified above within six months prior to the month in which such 30 proceedings were initiated, would have received such aid in or for such 31 month if in such month such child had been living with and removed from 32 the home of such a relative and application had been made therefor.

(h) "The blind" means not only those who are totally and permanently
 devoid of vision, but also those persons whose vision is so defective as to
 prevent the performance of ordinary activities for which eyesight is
 essential.

(i) "General assistance" means financial assistance in which the cost
of such financial assistance is not participated in by the federal
government. General assistance may be limited to transitional assistance in
some instances as specified by rules and regulations adopted by the
secretary.

42 (j) "Recipient" means a person who has received assistance under the 43 terms of this act. 1 (k) "Intake office" means the place where the secretary shall maintain 2 an office for receiving applications.

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(l) "Adequate consideration" means consideration equal, or reasonably proportioned to the value of that for which it is given.

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5 (m) "Transitional assistance" means a form of general assistance in 6 which as little financial assistance as one payment may be made during 7 each period of 12 consecutive calendar months to an eligible and needy 8 person and all other persons for whom such person is legally responsible.

9 (n) "Title IV-D" means part D of title IV of the federal social security 10 act (42 U.S.C. § 651, *et seq.*), or acts amendatory thereof or supplemental 11 thereto as in effect on May 1, 1997.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 39-709 is hereby amended to read as follows: 39-709. (a) *General eligibility requirements for assistance for which federal moneys are expended*. Subject to the additional requirements below, assistance in accordance with plans under which federal moneys are expended may be granted to any needy person who:

17 (1) Has insufficient income or resources to provide a reasonable 18 subsistence compatible with decency and health. Where a husband and 19 wife are living together, the combined income or resources of both shall be considered in determining the eligibility of either or both for such 20 21 assistance unless otherwise prohibited by law. The secretary, in 22 determining need of any applicant for or recipient of assistance shall not 23 take into account the financial responsibility of any individual for any 24 applicant or recipient of assistance unless such applicant or recipient is 25 such individual's spouse or such individual's minor child or minor stepchild if the stepchild is living with such individual. The secretary in 26 27 determining need of an individual may provide such income and resource 28 exemptions as may be permitted by federal law. For purposes of eligibility 29 for aid for families with dependent children, for food stamp assistance and for any other assistance provided through the department of social and 30 31 rehabilitation services under which federal moneys are expended, the 32 secretary of social and rehabilitation services shall consider one motor 33 vehicle owned by the applicant for assistance, regardless of the value of 34 such vehicle, as exempt personal property and shall consider any equity in 35 any additional motor vehicle owned by the applicant for assistance to be a 36 nonexempt resource of the applicant for assistance.

37 (2) Is a citizen of the United States or is an alien lawfully admitted to38 the United States and who is residing in the state of Kansas.

(b) Assistance to families with dependent children. Assistance may be granted under this act to any dependent child, or relative, subject to the general eligibility requirements as set out in subsection (a), who resides in the state of Kansas or whose parent or other relative with whom the child is living resides in the state of Kansas. Such assistance shall be known as aid to families with dependent children. Where husband and wife are
 living together both shall register for work under the program
 requirements for aid to families with dependent children in accordance
 with criteria and guidelines prescribed by rules and regulations of the
 secretary.

6 (c) Aid to families with dependent children; assignment of support 7 rights and limited power of attorney. By applying for or receiving aid to families with dependent children such applicant or recipient shall be 8 9 deemed to have assigned to the secretary on behalf of the state any 10 accrued, present or future rights to support from any other person such applicant may have in such person's own behalf or in behalf of any other 11 12 family member for whom the applicant is applying for or receiving aid. In 13 any case in which an order for child support has been established and the 14 legal custodian and obligee under the order surrenders physical custody of 15 the child to a caretaker relative without obtaining a modification of legal 16 custody and support rights on behalf of the child are assigned pursuant to 17 this section, the surrender of physical custody and the assignment shall 18 transfer, by operation of law, the child's support rights under the order to 19 the secretary on behalf of the state. Such assignment shall be of all 20 accrued, present or future rights to support of the child surrendered to the 21 caretaker relative. The assignment of support rights shall automatically 22 become effective upon the date of approval for or receipt of such aid 23 without the requirement that any document be signed by the applicant, 24 recipient or obligee. By applying for or receiving aid to families with 25 dependent children, or by surrendering physical custody of a child to a 26 caretaker relative who is an applicant or recipient of such assistance on the 27 child's behalf, the applicant, recipient or obligee is also deemed to have 28 appointed the secretary, or the secretary's designee, as an attorney in fact to 29 perform the specific act of negotiating and endorsing all drafts, checks, 30 money orders or other negotiable instruments representing support 31 payments received by the secretary in behalf of any person applying for, 32 receiving or having received such assistance. This limited power of 33 attorney shall be effective from the date the secretary approves the 34 application for aid and shall remain in effect until the assignment of 35 support rights has been terminated in full.

(d) Eligibility requirements for general assistance, the cost of which *is not shared by the federal government.* (1) General assistance may be
granted to eligible persons who do not qualify for financial assistance in a
program in which the federal government participates and who satisfy the
additional requirements prescribed by or under this subsection (d).

(A) To qualify for general assistance in any form a needy person must
 have insufficient income or resources to provide a reasonable subsistence
 compatible with decency and health and, except as provided for

1 transitional assistance, be a member of a family in which a minor child or a pregnant woman resides or be unable to engage in employment. The 2 3 secretary shall adopt rules and regulations prescribing criteria for 4 establishing when a minor child may be considered to be living with a 5 family and whether a person is able to engage in employment, including 6 such factors as age or physical or mental condition. Eligibility for general 7 assistance, other than transitional assistance, is limited to families in which 8 a minor child or a pregnant woman resides or to an adult or family in 9 which all legally responsible family members are unable to engage in 10 employment. Where a husband and wife are living together the combined income or resources of both shall be considered in determining the 11 12 eligibility of either or both for such assistance unless otherwise prohibited 13 by law. The secretary in determining need of any applicant for or recipient 14 of general assistance shall not take into account the financial responsibility 15 of any individual for any applicant or recipient of general assistance unless such applicant or recipient is such individual's spouse or such individual's 16 17 minor child or a minor stepchild if the stepchild is living with such 18 individual. In determining the need of an individual, the secretary may 19 provide for income and resource exemptions.

(B) To qualify for general assistance in any form a needy person must
be a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted to the United
States and must be residing in the state of Kansas.

(2) General assistance in the form of transitional assistance may be granted to eligible persons who do not qualify for financial assistance in a program in which the federal government participates and who satisfy the additional requirements prescribed by or under this subsection (d), but who do not meet the criteria prescribed by rules and regulations of the secretary relating to inability to engage in employment or are not a member of a family in which a minor or a pregnant woman resides.

30 (3) In addition to the other requirements prescribed under this 31 subsection (d), the secretary shall adopt rules and regulations which 32 establish community work experience program requirements for eligibility 33 for the receipt of general assistance in any form and which establish 34 penalties to be imposed when a work assignment under a community work 35 experience program requirement is not completed without good cause. The 36 secretary may adopt rules and regulations establishing exemptions from 37 any such community work experience program requirements. A first time 38 failure to complete such a work assignment requirement shall result in 39 ineligibility to receive general assistance for a period fixed by such rules 40 and regulations of not more than three calendar months. A subsequent 41 failure to complete such a work assignment requirement shall result in a 42 period fixed by such rules and regulations of ineligibility of not more than 43 six calendar months.

1 (4) If any person is found guilty of the crime of theft under the 2 provisions of K.S.A. 39-720, and amendments thereto, such person shall 3 thereby become forever ineligible to receive any form of general 4 assistance under the provisions of this subsection (d) unless the conviction 5 is the person's first conviction under the provisions of K.S.A. 39-720, and 6 amendments thereto, or the law of any other state concerning welfare 7 fraud. First time offenders convicted of a misdemeanor under the 8 provisions of such statute shall become ineligible to receive any form of 9 general assistance for a period of 12 calendar months from the date of 10 conviction. First time offenders convicted of a felony under the provisions of such statute shall become ineligible to receive any form of general 11 12 assistance for a period of 60 calendar months from the date of conviction. 13 If any person is found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of any 14 state other than the state of Kansas of a crime involving welfare fraud, 15 such person shall thereby become forever ineligible to receive any form of 16 general assistance under the provisions of this subsection (d) unless the 17 conviction is the person's first conviction under the law of any other state 18 concerning welfare fraud. First time offenders convicted of a misdemeanor 19 under the law of any other state concerning welfare fraud shall become ineligible to receive any form of general assistance for a period of 12 20 21 calendar months from the date of conviction. First time offenders 22 convicted of a felony under the law of any other state concerning welfare 23 fraud shall become ineligible to receive any form of general assistance for 24 a period of 60 calendar months from the date of conviction.

25 (e) *Requirements for medical assistance for which federal monevs or* state moneys or both are expended. (1) When the secretary has adopted a 26 27 medical care plan under which federal moneys or state moneys or both are 28 expended, medical assistance in accordance with such plan shall be 29 granted to any person who is a citizen of the United States or who is an 30 alien lawfully admitted to the United States and who is residing in the state 31 of Kansas, whose resources and income do not exceed the levels 32 prescribed by the secretary. In determining the need of an individual, the 33 secretary may provide for income and resource exemptions and protected 34 income and resource levels. Resources from inheritance shall be counted. 35 A disclaimer of an inheritance pursuant to K.S.A. 59-2291, and 36 amendments thereto, shall constitute a transfer of resources. The secretary 37 shall exempt principal and interest held in irrevocable trust pursuant to subsection (c) of K.S.A. 16-303, and amendments thereto, from the 38 39 eligibility requirements of applicants for and recipients of medical 40 assistance. Such assistance shall be known as medical assistance.

41 (2) For the purposes of medical assistance eligibility determinations
 42 on or after July 1, 2004, if an applicant or recipient owns property in joint
 43 tenancy with some other party and the applicant or recipient of medical

assistance has restricted or conditioned their interest in such property to a
 specific and discrete property interest less than 100%, then such
 designation will cause the full value of the property to be considered an
 available resource to the applicant or recipient.

5 (3) (A) Resources from trusts shall be considered when determining 6 eligibility of a trust beneficiary for medical assistance. Medical assistance 7 is to be secondary to all resources, including trusts, that may be available 8 to an applicant or recipient of medical assistance.

9 (B) If a trust has discretionary language, the trust shall be considered to be an available resource to the extent, using the full extent of discretion, 10 the trustee may make any of the income or principal available to the 11 12 applicant or recipient of medical assistance. Any such discretionary trust 13 shall be considered an available resource unless: (i) At the time of creation 14 or amendment of the trust, the trust states a clear intent that the trust is 15 supplemental to public assistance; and (ii) the trust: (a) Is funded from 16 resources of a person who, at the time of such funding, owed no duty of 17 support to the applicant or recipient of medical assistance; or (b) is funded 18 not more than nominally from resources of a person while that person 19 owed a duty of support to the applicant or recipient of medical assistance.

(C) For the purposes of this paragraph, "public assistance" includes,
 but is not limited to, medicaid, medical assistance or title XIX of the social
 security act.

23 (4) (A) When an applicant or recipient of medical assistance is a party 24 to a contract, agreement or accord for personal services being provided by 25 a nonlicensed individual or provider and such contract, agreement or 26 accord involves health and welfare monitoring, pharmacy assistance, case 27 management, communication with medical, health or other professionals, 28 or other activities related to home health care, long term care, medical assistance benefits, or other related issues, any moneys paid under such 29 30 contract, agreement or accord shall be considered to be an available 31 resource unless the following restrictions are met: (i) The contract, agreement or accord must be in writing and executed prior to any services 32 33 being provided; (ii) the moneys paid are in direct relationship with the fair 34 market value of such services being provided by similarly situated and 35 trained nonlicensed individuals; (iii) if no similarly situated nonlicensed 36 individuals or situations can be found, the value of services will be based 37 on federal hourly minimum wage standards; (iv) such individual providing 38 the services will report all receipts of moneys as income to the appropriate 39 state and federal governmental revenue agencies; (v) any amounts due 40 under such contract, agreement or accord shall be paid after the services 41 are rendered; (vi) the applicant or recipient shall have the power to revoke 42 the contract, agreement or accord; and (vii) upon the death of the applicant 43 or recipient, the contract, agreement or accord ceases.

1 (B) When an applicant or recipient of medical assistance is a party to 2 a written contract for personal services being provided by a licensed health 3 professional or facility and such contract involves health and welfare 4 monitoring, pharmacy assistance, case management, communication with 5 medical, health or other professionals, or other activities related to home 6 health care, long term care, medical assistance benefits or other related 7 issues, any moneys paid in advance of receipt of services for such 8 contracts shall be considered to be an available resource.

9 (5) Any trust may be amended if such amendment is permitted by the 10 Kansas uniform trust code.

(f) Eligibility for medical assistance of resident receiving medical 11 12 care outside state. A person who is receiving medical care including longterm care outside of Kansas whose health would be endangered by the 13 14 postponement of medical care until return to the state or by travel to return 15 to Kansas, may be determined eligible for medical assistance if such 16 individual is a resident of Kansas and all other eligibility factors are met. 17 Persons who are receiving medical care on an ongoing basis in a long-term 18 medical care facility in a state other than Kansas and who do not return to 19 a care facility in Kansas when they are able to do so, shall no longer be 20 eligible to receive assistance in Kansas unless such medical care is not 21 available in a comparable facility or program providing such medical care 22 in Kansas. For persons who are minors or who are under guardianship, the 23 actions of the parent or guardian shall be deemed to be the actions of the 24 child or ward in determining whether or not the person is remaining 25 outside the state voluntarily.

26 (g) Medical assistance; assignment of rights to medical support and *limited power of attorney; recovery from estates of deceased recipients.*(1) 27 Except as otherwise provided in K.S.A. 39-786 and 39-787, and 28 29 amendments thereto, or as otherwise authorized on and after September-30, 1989, under section 303, and amendments thereto, of the federal 30 31 medicare catastrophic coverage act of 1988, whichever is applicable, by 32 applying for or receiving medical assistance under a medical care plan in 33 which federal funds are expended, any accrued, present or future rights to 34 support and any rights to payment for medical care from a third party of an applicant or recipient and any other family member for whom the 35 36 applicant is applying shall be deemed to have been assigned to the 37 secretary on behalf of the state. The assignment shall automatically 38 become effective upon the date of approval for such assistance without the 39 requirement that any document be signed by the applicant or recipient. By applying for or receiving medical assistance the applicant or recipient is 40 41 also deemed to have appointed the secretary, or the secretary's designee, as 42 an attorney in fact to perform the specific act of negotiating and endorsing 43 all drafts, checks, money orders or other negotiable instruments, 1

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representing payments received by the secretary in behalf of any person applying for, receiving or having received such assistance. This limited power of attorney shall be effective from the date the secretary approves the application for assistance and shall remain in effect until the assignment has been terminated in full. The assignment of any rights to payment for medical care from a third party under this subsection shall not prohibit a health care provider from directly billing an insurance carrier for services rendered if the provider has not submitted a claim covering such services to the secretary for payment. Support amounts collected on behalf of persons whose rights to support are assigned to the secretary only under this subsection and no other shall be distributed pursuant to subsection (d) of K.S.A. 39-756, and amendments thereto, except that any amounts designated as medical support shall be retained by the secretary for

repayment of the unreimbursed portion of assistance. Amounts collected pursuant to the assignment of rights to payment for medical care from a third party shall also be retained by the secretary for repayment of the unreimbursed portion of assistance.

18 (2) The amount of any medical assistance paid after June 30, 1992, 19 under the provisions of subsection (e) is (A) a claim against the property or 20 any interest therein belonging to and a part of the estate of any deceased 21 recipient or, if there is no estate, the estate of the surviving spouse, if any, 22 shall be charged for such medical assistance paid to either or both, and (B) 23 a claim against any funds of such recipient or spouse in any account under 24 K.S.A. 9-1215, 9-1216, 17-2263, 17-2264, 17-5828 or 17-5829, and 25 amendments thereto. There shall be no recovery of medical assistance 26 correctly paid to or on behalf of an individual under subsection (e) except 27 after the death of the surviving spouse of the individual, if any, and only at 28 a time when the individual has no surviving child who is under 21 years of age or is blind or permanently and totally disabled. Transfers of real or 29 30 personal property by recipients of medical assistance without adequate 31 consideration are voidable and may be set aside. Except where there is a 32 surviving spouse, or a surviving child who is under 21 years of age or is 33 blind or permanently and totally disabled, the amount of any medical 34 assistance paid under subsection (e) is a claim against the estate in any 35 guardianship or conservatorship proceeding. The monetary value of any 36 benefits received by the recipient of such medical assistance under long-37 term care insurance, as defined by K.S.A. 40-2227, and amendments 38 thereto, shall be a credit against the amount of the claim provided for such 39 medical assistance under this subsection (g). The secretary of health and 40 environment is authorized to enforce each claim provided for under this 41 subsection (g). The secretary of health and environment shall not be 42 required to pursue every claim, but is granted discretion to determine 43 which claims to pursue. All moneys received by the secretary of health

and environment from claims under this subsection (g) shall be deposited 1 2 in the social welfare fund. The secretary of health and environment may 3 adopt rules and regulations for the implementation and administration of 4 the medical assistance recovery program under this subsection (g).

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(3) By applying for or receiving medical assistance under the 6 provisions of article 7 of chapter 39 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, such 7 individual or such individual's agent, fiduciary, guardian, conservator, 8 representative payee or other person acting on behalf of the individual 9 consents to the following definitions of estate and the results therefrom:

10 (A) If an individual receives any medical assistance before July 1, 2004, pursuant to article 7 of chapter 39 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, 11 which forms the basis for a claim under subsection (g)(2), such claim is 12 13 limited to the individual's probatable estate as defined by applicable law; 14 and

15 (B) if an individual receives any medical assistance on or after July 1, 16 2004, pursuant to article 7 of chapter 39 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, which forms the basis for a claim under subsection (g)(2), such claim shall 17 18 apply to the individual's medical assistance estate. The medical assistance 19 estate is defined as including all real and personal property and other 20 assets in which the deceased individual had any legal title or interest 21 immediately before or at the time of death to the extent of that interest or 22 title. The medical assistance estate includes, without limitation assets 23 conveyed to a survivor, heir or assign of the deceased recipient through 24 joint tenancy, tenancy in common, survivorship, transfer-on-death deed, 25 pavable-on-death contract, life estate, trust, annuities or similar 26 arrangement.

27 (4) The secretary of social and rehabilitation services health and 28 environment or the secretary's designee is authorized to file and enforce a 29 lien against the real property of a recipient of medical assistance in certain situations, subject to all prior liens of record. The lien must be filed in the 30 31 office of the register of deeds of the county where the real property is 32 located and must contain the legal description of all real property in the 33 county subject to the lien. This lien is for payments of medical assistance 34 made by the department of social and rehabilitation services to the 35 recipient who is an inpatient in a nursing home or other medical 36 institution. Such lien may be filed only after notice and an opportunity for 37 a hearing has been given. Such lien may be enforced only upon competent 38 medical testimony that the recipient cannot reasonably be expected to be 39 discharged and returned home. A six-month period of compensated 40 inpatient care at a nursing home, nursing homes or other medical 41 institution shall constitute a determination by the department of social and rehabilitation services that the recipient cannot reasonably be expected to 42 43 be discharged and returned home. To return home means the recipient

1 leaves the nursing or medical facility and resides in the home on which the 2 lien has been placed for a period of at least 90 days without being 3 readmitted as an inpatient to a nursing or medical facility. The amount of 4 the lien shall be for the amount of assistance paid by the department of 5 social and rehabilitation services after the expiration of six months from 6 the date the recipient became eligible for compensated inpatient care at a 7 nursing home, nursing homes or other medical institution until the time of 8 the filing of the lien and for any amount paid thereafter for such medical 9 assistance to the recipient.

10 (5) The lien filed by the secretary *of health and environment* or the 11 secretary's designee for medical assistance correctly received may be 12 enforced before or after the death of the recipient by the filing of an action 13 to foreclose such lien in the Kansas district court or through an estate 14 probate court action in the county where the real property of the recipient 15 is located. However, it may be enforced only:

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(A) After the death of the surviving spouse of the recipient;

(B) when there is no child of the recipient, natural or adopted, who is20 years of age or less residing in the home;

(C) when there is no adult child of the recipient, natural or adopted,who is blind or disabled residing in the home; or

(D) when no brother or sister of the recipient is lawfully residing in
the home, who has resided there for at least one year immediately before
the date of the recipient's admission to the nursing or medical facility, and
has resided there on a continuous basis since that time.

(6) The lien remains on the property even after a transfer of the title
 by conveyance, sale, succession, inheritance or will unless one of the
 following events occur:

(A) The lien is satisfied. The recipient, the heirs, personal
representative or assigns of the recipient may discharge such lien at any
time by paying the amount of the lien to the secretary *of health and environment* or the secretary's designee;

32 (B) the lien is terminated by foreclosure of prior lien of record or33 settlement action taken in lieu of foreclosure;

If the recipient is readmitted to a nursing or medical facility during this period, and does return home after being released, another 90 1 days must be completed before the lien can be dissolved.

2 (7) If the secretary of social and rehabilitation services health and 3 environment or the secretary's designee has not filed an action to foreclose 4 the lien in the Kansas district court in the county where the real property is 5 located within 10 years from the date of the filing of the lien, then the lien 6 shall become dormant, and shall cease to operate as a lien on the real estate 7 of the recipient.
