AN ACT concerning elections; pertaining to certain primary elections; 1 2 amending K.S.A. 25-2102 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-2021, 25-2108a and 71-1415 and repealing the existing sections. 3 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-2021 is hereby amended to read as 6 follows: 25-2021. (a) A primary election shall be held if needed to-7 reduce the number of candidates for each office in the general election to 8 9 no more than three candidates. No primary election of school districtboard members shall be held unless by holding such primary two or more 10 persons will be eliminated as candidates for office. In the event there are 11 12 not more than three times the number of candidates as there are board. members to be elected, the names of the candidates for such office shall 13 14 not appear on the primary election ballots, and there shall be no primary 15 election for such office, but the names of such candidates shall be placed on the general school board election ballot. 16 17 In school districts in which a member district method of election is in effect, if there are more than three qualified candidates for any member 18 position in any member district, the county election officer shall call, and 19 20 there shall be held, a primary election in each such member district. The 21 names of the two candidates receiving the greatest number of votes for 22 any member position at the primary election shall appear on the ballots 23 in the general election. If there are three or fewer qualified candidates 24 for any member position, there shall not be a primary election and the 25 names of the candidates shall be placed on the ballots in the general 26 election. 27 (b) In school districts in which the election at large method of election is in effect, if there are more than three times the number of candidates as 28 there are board members to be elected, the county election officer shall 29 call, and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of twice the 30 number of candidates as there are board members to be elected who 31 received the greatest number of votes at the primary election shall appear 32 on the ballots in the general election. If there are not more than three 33 times the number of candidates as there are board members to be elected. 34 35 there shall not be a primary election and the names of the candidates 36 shall be placed on the ballots in the general election.

1 (c) If a member is to be elected to fill an unexpired term, the office 2 shall be listed separately on the ballots. If there are more than three candidates for such unexpired term, the county election officer shall call, 3 4 and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of the two candidates for such unexpired term receiving the greatest number of 5 votes shall appear on the ballots in the general election. If there are three 6 7 or fewer qualified candidates for the unexpired term of any member 8 position, there shall not be a primary election and the names of the 9 candidates shall be placed on the ballots in the general election.

(b) (d) On the ballots in general school elections, blank lines for the 10 name names of write-in candidates shall be printed at the end of the list of 11 candidates for each different office. The number of blank lines for such 12 elected office shall be equal to the number to be elected thereto. The 13 purpose of such blank lines shall be to permit the voter to insert the name 14 of any person not printed on the ballot for whom such voter desires to 15 vote for such office. No lines for write-in candidates shall appear on 16 17 primary school election ballots.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-2102 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-2102. (a) "General election" means the election held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November of even-numbered years, the elections held for officers on the first Tuesday in April, and in the case of special elections of any officers to fill vacancies, the election at which any such officer is finally elected.

(b) "Primary election" means the election held on the first Tuesday
in August of even-numbered years, the election held five weeks preceding
the election on the first Tuesday in April, and any other preliminary
election at which part of the candidates for special election to any
national, state, county, city or school office are eliminated by the process
of the election but at which no officer is finally elected.

30 (c) "District method" means the election of city officers where the city
31 is divided into member districts.

32 (d) "Election at large method" means the election of city officers33 without member districts.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-2108a is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-2108a. (a) There shall be a primary election of city officers on the Tuesday preceding by five weeks the first Tuesday in April of every year that such city has a city election, except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) *or subsection (c)* of this section.

39 (b) A primary election shall be held if needed to reduce the number
 40 of candidates for each office in the general election to no more than three
 41 candidates. No primary election of city officers shall be held unless by
 42 holding such primary two or more persons will be eliminated as 43 candidates for office. In the event there are not more than three times the

number of candidates as there are officers to be elected, the names of the
 candidates for such office shall not appear on the primary election ballots,
 and there shall be no primary election for such office, but the names of
 such candidates shall be placed on the general eity election ballot.

5 (b) In college districts in which the election at large method of 6 election is in effect, if there are more than three times the number of 7 candidates as there are trustees to be elected, the county election officer 8 shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of twice 9 the number of candidates as there are trustees to be elected who receive the greatest number of votes at the primary election shall appear on the 10 ballots in the general election. If there are not more than three times the 11 12 number of candidates as there are trustees to be elected, there shall not be a primary election and the names of the candidates shall be placed on 13 14 the ballots in the general election.

(c) If a member is to be elected to fill an unexpired term, the office 15 shall be listed separately on the ballots. If there are more than three 16 candidates for such unexpired term, the county election officer shall call, 17 18 and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of the two 19 candidates for such unexpired term receiving the greatest number of votes shall appear on the ballots in the general election. If there are three 20 21 or fewer qualified candidates for the unexpired term of any member position, there shall not be a primary election and the names of the 22 23 candidates shall be placed on the ballots in the general election.

(d) On the ballots in general college district elections, blank lines for 24 the names of write-in candidates shall be printed at the end of the list of 25 candidates for each different office. The number of blank lines for each 26 elected office shall be equal to the number of candidates to be elected 27 28 thereto. The purpose of such blank lines shall be to permit the voter to insert the name of any person not printed on the ballot for whom such 29 voter desires to vote for such office. No lines for write-in candidates shall 30 31 appear on primary college district election ballots.

32 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 71-1415 is hereby amended to read as 33 follows: 71-1415. (a) A primary election shall be held if needed to reduce the number of candidates for each office in the general election to no-34 more than three candidates. No primary election of trustees shall be held 35 unless by holding such primary two or more persons will be eliminated as 36 candidates for office. In the event there are not more than three times the 37 number of candidates as there are trustees to be elected, the names of the 38 eandidates for such office shall not appear on the primary election ballots, 39 and there shall be no primary election for such office, but the names of 40 such candidates shall be placed on the general election ballot for the 41 42 board of trustees

(b) In the general election, there shall appear on the ballots a line

appropriate for write-in candidates. No lines for write-in candidates shall
 appear on the primary election ballots.

In college districts in which a district method of election is in effect, if 3 4 there are more than three qualified candidates for any member position, the county election officer shall call, and there shall be held, a primary 5 election in each such member district. The names of the two candidates 6 7 receiving the greatest number of votes for any member position at the primary election shall appear on the ballots in the general election. If 8 there are three or fewer qualified candidates for any member position, 9 there shall not be a primary election and the names of the candidates 10 shall be placed on the ballots in the general election. 11

(b) In college districts in which the election at large method of 12 election is in effect, if there are more than three times the number of 13 candidates as there are trustees to be elected, the county election officer 14 shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of twice 15 the number of candidates as there are trustees to be elected who receive 16 17 the greatest number of votes at the primary election shall appear on the 18 ballots in the general election. If there are not more than three times the 19 number of candidates as there are trustees to be elected, there shall not be a primary election and the names of the candidates shall be placed on 20 the ballots in the general election. 21

22 (c) If a member is to be elected to fill an unexpired term, the office shall be listed separately on the ballots. If there are more than three 23 candidates for such unexpired term, the county election officer shall call, 24 25 and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of the two candidates for such unexpired term receiving the greatest number of 26 votes shall appear on the ballots in the general election. If there are three 27 or fewer qualified candidates for the unexpired term of any member 28 position, there shall not be a primary election and the names of the 29 candidates shall be placed on the ballots in the general election. 30

31 (d) On the ballots in general college district elections, blank lines for 32 the names of write-in candidates shall be printed at the end of the list of 33 candidates for each different office. The number of blank lines for each elected office shall be equal to the number of candidates to be elected 34 thereto. The purpose of such blank lines shall be to permit the voter to 35 insert the name of any person not printed on the ballot for whom such 36 voter desires to vote for such office. No lines for write-in candidates shall 37 appear on primary college district election ballots 38

39 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 25-2102 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-2021, 25-2108a 40 and 71-1415 are hereby repealed.

41 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 42 publication in the statute book.
