1 AN ACT concerning colleges and universities, relating to tuition; 2 amending K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 76-729 and repealing the existing section. 3

4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

5 Section 1. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 76-729 is hereby amended to read as 6 follows: 76-729. (a) (1) Persons enrolling at the state educational 7 institutions under the control and supervision of the state board of regents 8 who, if such persons are adults, have been domiciliary residents of the 9 state of Kansas or, if such persons are minors, whose parents have been domiciliary residents of the state of Kansas for at least 12 months prior to 10 enrollment for any term or session at a state educational institution are 11 12 residents for fee purposes. A person who has been a resident of the state of 13 Kansas for fee purposes and who leaves the state of Kansas to become a 14 resident of another state or country shall retain status as a resident of the 15 state of Kansas for fee purposes if the person returns to domiciliary 16 residency in the state of Kansas within 60 months of departure. All other 17 persons are nonresidents of the state of Kansas for fee purposes.

18 (2) The provisions of this subsection shall be applicable to any person 19 enrolling at a state educational institution from and after July 1, 2006. Any 20 person who (A) qualifies as a resident of the state of Kansas for fee 21 purposes under the provisions of this subsection, (B) attended a state 22 educational institution during academic year 2006-2007 and (C) paid fees 23 as if such person was not a resident of the state of Kansas, may apply to 24 such state educational institution to be reimbursed in an amount equal to 25 the difference between the amount the person paid in fees and the amount 26 the person would have paid if such person had been treated as a resident of 27 the state of Kansas. Such reimbursement shall be paid by the state 28 educational institution at which such person was enrolled during academic 29 vear 2006-2007.

30 (3) The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a person who
31 is deemed a resident for fee purposes pursuant to K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 7632 731a, and amendments thereto.

(b) The state board of regents may authorize the following persons, orany class or classes thereof, and their spouses and dependents to pay an

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1 amount equal to resident fees:

- (1) Persons who are employees of a state educational institution;
- (2) persons who are in military service;

4 (3) persons who are domiciliary residents of the state, who were in-5 active military service prior to becoming domiciliary residents of the state, 6 who were present in the state for a period of not less than two years during 7 their tenure in active military service, whose domiciliary residence was-8 established in the state within 30 days of discharge or retirement from 9 active military service under honorable conditions, but whose domiciliary 10 residence was not timely enough established to meet the residenceduration requirement of subsection (a); 11

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(4) persons having special domestic relations circumstances;

13 (5)(3) persons who have lost their resident status within six months of 14 enrollment;

15 (6)(4) persons who are not domiciliary residents of the state, who 16 have graduated from a high school accredited by the state board of 17 education within six months of enrollment, who were domiciliary residents 18 of the state at the time of graduation from high school or within 12 months 19 prior to graduation from high school, and who are entitled to admission at 20 a state educational institution pursuant to K.S.A. 72-116, and amendments 21 thereto;

22 (7)(5) persons who are domiciliary residents of the state, whose 23 domiciliary residence was established in the state for the purpose of 24 accepting, upon recruitment by an employer, or retaining, upon transfer 25 required by an employer, a position of full-time employment at a place of 26 employment in Kansas, but the domiciliary residence of whom was not 27 timely enough established to meet the residence duration requirement of 28 subsection (a), and who are not otherwise eligible for authorization to pay 29 an amount equal to resident fees under this subsection; and

30 (8)(6) persons who have graduated from a high school accredited by 31 the state board of education within six months of enrollment and who, at 32 the time of graduation from such a high school or while enrolled and in 33 attendance at such a high school prior to graduation therefrom, were 34 dependents of a person in military service within the state; if the person, 35 whose dependent is eligible for authorization to pay an amount equal to 36 resident fees under this provision, does not establish domiciliary residence 37 in the state upon retirement from military service, eligibility of the 38 dependent for authorization to pay an amount equal to resident fees shall 39 lapse; and

40 (9) persons who have retired or have been honorably discharged from
 41 military service, had a permanent change of station order for active duty in
 42 Kansas during such military service and live in Kansas at the time of
 43 enrollment.

1 (c) (1) The state board of regents shall authorize the following class 2 of persons to pay an amount equal to resident fees:

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(A) Persons who are in military service;

4 (B) persons who are domiciliary residents of the state at the time of 5 enrollment, were in active military service for a period of not less than 36 6 months prior to becoming domiciliary residents of the state and have been 7 discharged or retired from military service under honorable conditions; 8 and

9 (C) any dependent or spouse of a person in military service who is 10 reassigned from Kansas to another duty station so long as such dependent 11 or spouse continues to reside in Kansas.

12 (2) So long as a persondependent or spouse of a person in military 13 service, as described in paragraph (1) of this subsection, remains 14 continuously enrolled, exclusive of summer sessions, a person who 15 qualifies to pay resident fees by virtue of being a spouse or dependent of a 16 person in military service shall not lose such status because of a divorce or 17 the death of a spouse.

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(d) As used in this section:

(1) "Parents" means and includes natural parents, adoptive parents,stepparents, guardians and custodians.

21 (2) "Guardian" has the meaning ascribed thereto by provided by 22 K.S.A. 59-3051, and amendments thereto.

(3) "Custodian" means a person, agency or association granted legal
 custody of a minor under the revised Kansas code for care of children.

(4) "Domiciliary resident" means a person who has present and fixed
residence in Kansas where the person intends to remain for an indefinite
period and to which the person intends to return following absence.

(5) "Full-time employment" means employment requiring at least1,500 hours of work per year.

30 (6) "Dependent" means: (A) A birth child, adopted child or stepchild;31 or

(B) any child other than the foregoing who is actually dependent in
 whole or in part on the person in military service and who is related to
 such individual by marriage or consanguinity.

(7) "Military service" means: (A) Any active service in any armed
service of the United States; or (B) membership in the Kansas army or air
national guard.

38 (8) "Academic year" means the twelve-month period ending June 30.
