**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR  
HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 145**

As Recommended by House Committee on  
Redistricting

**Brief\***

House Sub. for House Sub. for SB 145 (Map Name: Kansas Six) would redraw the state's four congressional districts using data obtained from the 2010 Census.

The ideal size for each congressional district is 713,280 people. In Kansas Six, all four districts achieve a deviation of zero percent. The -1 deviation figures listed for the Third and Fourth Districts are the result of rounding.

Districts were built using counties, precincts, and census blocks. Kansas Six splits the following counties: Douglas between the First and Second Congressional Districts; Greenwood between the Second and Fourth Congressional Districts; and Miami between the Second and Third Congressional Districts.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

## **Background**

During the 2012 Session, the Kansas Legislature will redraw congressional, legislative, and State Board of Education districts. The congressional districts are redrawn using 2010 Census data. The Legislative and State Board of Education districts are redrawn using adjusted census data provided by the Secretary of State's Office.

The House Committee on Redistricting removed the contents of House Sub. for SB 145, a bill relating to election law, and inserted the bill language for Kansas Six.

A fiscal note was not provided for the bill.
