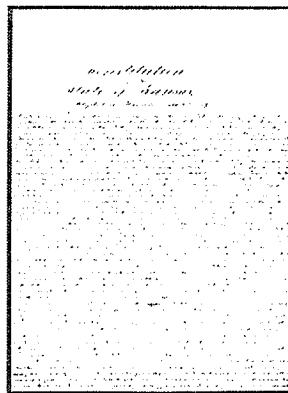


These ballots were used to vote for or against slavery in an early version of the Kansas constitution.

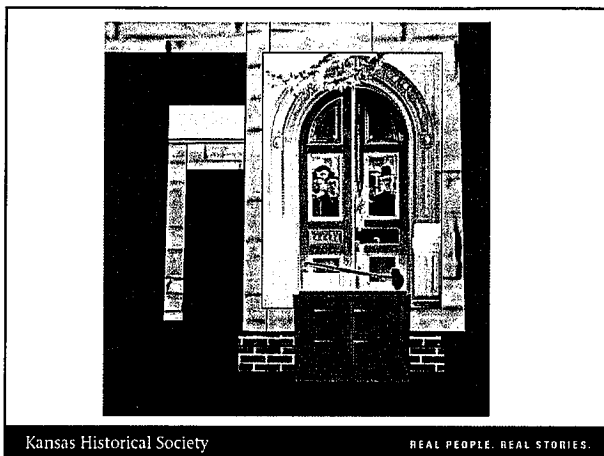


The Populists barricaded the hall preventing Republicans from entering. The next morning the Republicans marched on the Capitol and demanded entry to the House. The Republican Speaker of the House smashed the doors to the hall and took control. In retaliation the Populists took control of the east wing and surrounded the Capitol shutting off electricity and phones.




East Room Rotunda




The Kansas banner was used until the adoption of the Kansas flag in 1927.
