What's With The Slogan?

"Bridge the Gap" refers to Team Rubicon's primary mission of providing disaster relief between the moment a disaster happens and the point at which conventional aid organizations respond. The "gap" is primarily time: the crucial window following a disaster when victims have traditionally been without outside aid. When the "Gap" closes - once conventional aid organizations arrive - Team Rubicon moves on.

"We've stumbled onto something special: an improvement in the disaster response paradigm and an effective reintegration tool for our nation's heroes."



VERMONT/MARYLAND HURRICANE, SEPT. 2011

TR deployed in the fallout of Hurricane Irene, mobilizing five teams of veterans up and down the Eastern Seaboard; activating two teams to conduct debris clearing and community relief operations in Hollywood, MD and Grafton, VT.

BURMA HUMANITARIAN, AUGUST 2010 & 2011

Over two years TR deployed teams of medical trainers who taught over 125 Karen and Shan medics various trauma skills, empowering an underserved and displaced population

MISSOURI TORNADO, MAY 2011

TR was on the ground in 14 hours conducting search and rescue operations with local civil-military authorities.

ALABAMA TORNADO, APRIL 2011

TR established a military-style operations center for rural Walker County. TR developed workflows, phase lines and a volunteer coordination schedule which was lacking prior to TR's arrival.

SUDAN HUMANITARIAN, JANUARY 2011

TR's Dr. Glenn Geelhoed brokered a peace deal between two warring tribes in exchange for crucial medical training and supplies. TR medical volunteers conducted up to ten surgical cases per day.

PAKISTAN FLOODS, SEPTEMBER 2010

TR deployed despite Taliban threats of attacks on foreign aid workers. TR treated upwards of 3,000 people for water-borne and chronic diseases.

CHILE EARTHQUAKE/TSUNAMI, FEBRUARY 2010

TR was the only US NGO providing field triage and medical reconnaissance for the Chilean military near epicenter coastal communities.

HAITI EARTHQUAKE, JANUARY 2010 & 2011

TR operated mobile field triage clinics in regions deemed too difficult to reach, treating upwards of 3,500 acute injuries. In 2011 TR deployed again, establishing oral rehydration points in the aftermath of the cholera outbreak.
