SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2013 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2013 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2013 would amend the current definition of the crime of perjury by deleting “subscribing as true and correct under penalty of perjury any statement required by KSA 75-5743.” KSA 75-5743 requires employers and labor organizations doing business in this state to submit information concerning each new employee to the Secretary of Labor within 20 business days of the hiring, rehiring, or return to work of the newly hired employee or within 20 business days from the date the newly hired employee first receives wages or other compensation from the employer.

Enactment of HB 2013 would have no fiscal effect.
