SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 6 by Senator Faust-Goudeau

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 6 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Beginning July 1, 2009, it became lawful for individuals to apply for restricted driving privileges in lieu of suspension through a written request to the Division of Vehicles with an accompanying \$25 application fee. Upon approval, the privileges could be restricted for up to one year or until the terms of the traffic citation were met. If the driver failed to comply, the court was authorized to terminate the driving privileges. However, once the driver satisfied the terms, the Division was required to terminate the suspension after receiving electronic notification from the court. These statutes sunset January 1, 2012, and SB 6 would extend them through January 1, 2016.

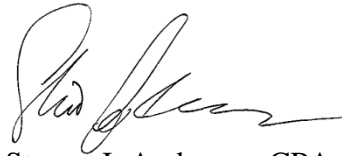
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The Department of Revenue estimates that SB 6 would increase revenue to the Division of Vehicles Operating Fund by \$7,500 in FY 2014 and by approximately a similar amount in FY 2015. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 6 is not reflected in *The FY 2014 Governor's Budget Report*.
