AN ACT concerning physical therapists; evaluation and treatment of 2 patients; amending K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-2921 and repealing the 3 existing section.

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5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-2921 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 65-2921. (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), (c) 8 or (d), a physical therapist may evaluate patients without physician referral 9 but may initiate treatment only after approval by a licensed physician, a 10 licensed podiatrist, a licensed physician assistant or a licensed advanced practice registered nurse working pursuant to the order or direction of a 11 12 licensed physician, a licensed chiropractor, a licensed dentist or licensed 13 optometrist in appropriately related cases. Physical therapists may initiate 14 physical therapy treatment with the approval of a practitioner of the 15 healing arts duly licensed under the laws of another state and may provide 16 such treatment based upon an order by such practitioner in any setting in 17 which physical therapists would be authorized to provide such treatment 18 with the approval of a physician licensed by the board, notwithstanding-19 any provisions of the Kansas healing arts act or any rules and regulations 20 adopted by the board thereunder and initiate physical therapy treatment on 21 a patient without referral from a licensed health care practitioner. If 22 treating a patient without a referral from a licensed health care 23 practitioner and the patient is not progressing toward documented 24 treatment goals as demonstrated by objective, measurable or functional 25 improvement, or any combination thereof, after 10 patient visits or in a 26 period of 15 business days from the initial treatment visits following the 27 initial evaluation visit, the physical therapist shall obtain a referral from 28 an appropriate licensed health care practitioner prior to continuing 29 treatment. The physical therapist shall transmit to the licensed health care 30 practitioner, identified by the patient, a copy of the initial evaluation no 31 later than five business days after the evaluation is performed.

32 (b) Physical therapists may evaluate and treat a patient for no more 33 than 30 consecutive calendar days without a referral under the following 34 conditions: (1) The patient has previously been referred to a physical-35 therapist for physical therapy services by a person authorized by thissection to approve treatment; (2) the patient's referral for physical therapy 36

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was made within one year from the date a physical therapist implements a
 program of physical therapy treatment without a referral; (3) the physical
 therapy being provided to the patient without referral is for the same-

therapy being provided to the patient without ferenal is for the same injury, disease or condition as indicated in the referral for such previous injury, disease or condition; and (4) the physical therapist transmits to the physician or other practitioner identified by the patient a copy of the initial evaluation no later than five business days after treatment commences.
Treatment of such patient for more than 30 consecutive calendar days shall only be upon the approval of a person authorized by this section to approve treatment.

(e) Physical therapists may provide, without a referral, services which
 do not constitute treatment for a specific condition, disease or injury to: (1)
 Employees solely for the purpose of education and instruction related to
 workplace injury prevention; or (2) the public for the purpose of fitness,
 health promotion and education.

(d) (c) Physical therapists may provide services without a referral to
 special education students who need physical therapy services to fulfill the
 provisions of their individualized education plan (IEP) or individualized
 family service plan (IFSP).

(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a hospital or
ambulatory surgical center from requiring a physician order or referral
for physical therapy services for a patient currently being treated in such
facility.

(e) When a patient self-refers to a physical therapist pursuant to this
section, the physical therapist, prior to commencing treatment, shall
provide written notice to the patient that a physical therapy diagnosis is
not a medical diagnosis by a physician.

(f) Physical therapists shall perform wound debridement services
 only after approval by a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery
 or other licensed health care practitioner in appropriately related cases.

(g) As used in this section, "licensed health care practitioner" means a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery, a licensed podiatrist, a licensed physician assistant or a licensed advanced practice registered nurse working pursuant to the order or direction of a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery, a licensed chiropractor, a licensed dentist or licensed optometrist in appropriately related cases.
