 AN ACT concerning certain licensing boards; relating to licensure and military service members; amending K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-1116 and 65-6129 and repealing the existing sections.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-1116 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 65-1116. (a) *Qualification*. An applicant for a license to practice 8 as a licensed practical nurse shall:

9 (1) Have graduated from an approved school of practical nursing or 10 professional nursing in the United States or its territories or from a school 11 of practical nursing or professional nursing in a foreign country which is 12 approved by the board as defined in rules and regulations;

(2) have obtained other qualifications not in conflict with this act asthe board may prescribe by rule and regulation; and

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(3) file with the board a written application for a license.

(b) If the board finds in evaluating any applicant that such applicant is
deficient in qualification or in the quality of such applicant's educational
experience, the board may require such applicant to fulfill such remedial
or other requirements as the board may prescribe.

20 (c) *License*. (1) The board shall issue a license to an applicant to 21 practice as a practical nurse who has:

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(A) Met the qualifications set forth in subsections (a) and (b);

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(B) passed a written examination as prescribed by the board; and

(C) no disqualifying factors under K.S.A. 65-1120, and amendmentsthereto.

(2) The board may issue a license to practice nursing as a practical nurse to an applicant who has been duly licensed as a practical nurse by examination under the laws of another state or territory if, in the opinion of the board, the applicant meets the qualifications required of a practical nurse in this state. Verification of the applicant's licensure status shall be required from the original state of licensure.

32 (3) The board may authorize the educational requirement under
33 subsection (a)(1) to be waived for an applicant who has attained a passing
34 score on the national council licensure examination for practical nurses

1 and provided evidence to the board of such applicant's practical nursing

2 experience with the military. To qualify for such a waiver, the applicant must have been a member of the army, navy, marine corps, air force, air or army national guard, coast guard or any branch of the military reserves of the United States, and separated from such military service underhonorable conditions with an honorable discharge. If such applicant was separated from such military service under honorable conditions

8 (general) discharge and meets the requirements of this paragraph, the
 9 board may authorize the educational requirements under subsection
 10 (a)(1) be waived.

11 (3)(4) Refresher course. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (a) and (b), an applicant for a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse who has not been licensed to practice practical nursing for five years preceding application shall be required to successfully complete a refresher course as defined by the board.

16 (4)(5) *Renewal license.* A licensed practical nurse licensed under this 17 act shall be eligible for renewal licenses upon compliance with K.S.A. 65-1117, and amendments thereto.

19 (5)(6) Licensure examination within 24 months of graduation. (A) 20 Persons who do not take the licensure examination within 24 months after 21 graduation shall petition the board for permission prior to taking the 22 licensure examination. The board may require the applicant to submit and 23 complete a plan of study prior to taking the licensure examination.

(B) Persons who are unsuccessful in passing the licensure examination within 24 months after graduation shall petition the board for permission prior to subsequent attempts. The board may require the applicant to submit and complete a plan of study prior to taking the licensure examination a subsequent time. The study plan shall contain subjects related to deficiencies identified on the failed examination profiles.

31 (6)(7) An application for initial licensure or endorsement will be held
 32 awaiting completion of meeting qualifications for a time period specified
 33 in rules and regulations.

(d) *Title and abbreviation.* Any person who holds a license to practice
as a licensed practical nurse in this state shall have the right to use the title,
"licensed practical nurse," and the abbreviation, "L.P.N." No other person
shall assume the title or use the abbreviation or any other words, letters,
signs or figures to indicate that the person is a licensed practical nurse.

(e) *Temporary permit.* The board may issue a temporary permit to
practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse for a period not to exceed 120
days. A temporary permit for 120 days may be issued to an applicant for
licensure as a licensed practical nurse who is a graduate of a practical
school of nursing in a foreign country after verification of licensure in that

1 foreign country and approval of educational credentials.

2 (f) Exempt license. The board may issue an exempt license to any 3 licensee as defined in rules and regulations who makes written application 4 for such license on a form provided by the board, who remits a fee as 5 established pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1118, and amendments thereto, and who 6 is not regularly engaged in the practice of practical nursing in Kansas but 7 volunteers practical nursing service or is a charitable health care provider 8 as defined by K.S.A. 75-6102, and amendments thereto. Each exempt 9 licensee shall be subject to all provisions of the nurse practice act, except 10 as otherwise provided in this subsection (f). Each exempt license may be renewed biennially subject to the provisions of this section. The holder of 11 12 the exempt license shall not be required to submit evidence of satisfactory completion of a program of continuing nursing education for renewal. To 13 14 convert an exempt license to an active license, the exempt licensee shall meet all the requirements of subsection (c) or K.S.A. 65-1117, and 15 16 amendments thereto. The board shall have authority to write rules and 17 regulations to carry out the provisions of this section.

18 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-6129 is hereby amended to read as 19 follows: 65-6129. (a) (1) Application for an attendant's certificate shall be 20 made to the board. The board shall not grant an attendant's certificate 21 unless the applicant meets the following requirements:

(1) (A) (i) Has successfully completed coursework required by the
 rules and regulations adopted by the board; or

(B) (ii) has successfully completed coursework in another jurisdiction
 that is substantially equivalent to that required by the rules and regulations
 adopted by the board; *or*

27 (C) (iii) has provided evidence that such applicant holds a current 28 and active certification with the national registry of emergency medical 29 technicians, completed emergency medical technician training as a member of the army, navy, marine corps, air force, air or army national 30 31 guard, coast guard or any branch of the military reserves of the United 32 States that is substantially equivalent to that required by the rules and 33 regulations adopted by the board, and such applicant separated from such 34 military service under honorable conditions with an honorable 35 discharge;

36 (2) (A) (B) (i) has passed the examination required by the rules and
 37 regulations adopted by the board; or

(B) (ii) has passed the certification or licensing examination in
 another jurisdiction that has been approved by the board; and

40 (3) (C) has paid an application fee required by the rules and 41 regulations adopted by the board.

42 (2) The board may grant an attendant's certificate to any 43 applicant who meets the requirements under subsection (a)(1)(A)(iii)

but was separated from such military service under honorable conditions (general) discharge<u>if such applicant satisfies the</u> requirements under subsections (a)(1)(A)(ii) and (a)(1)(A)(iii).

4 5 (b) (1) The board shall not grant a temporary attendant's certificate unless the applicant meets the following requirements:

6 (A) If the applicant is certified or licensed as an attendant in another 7 jurisdiction, but the applicant's coursework is determined not to be 8 substantially equivalent to that required by the board, such temporary 9 certificate shall be valid for one year from the date of issuance or until the 10 applicant has completed the required coursework, whichever occurs first; 11 or

12 (B) if the applicant has completed the required coursework, has taken 13 the required examination, but has not received the results of the 14 examination, such temporary certificate shall be valid for 120 days from 15 the date of the examination.

16 (2) An applicant who has been granted a temporary certificate shall 17 be under the direct supervision of a physician, a physician's assistant, a 18 professional nurse or an attendant holding a certificate at the same level or 19 higher than that of the applicant.

(c) The board shall not grant an initial emergency medical technicianintermediate certificate, advanced emergency medical technician certificate, mobile intensive care technician certificate or paramedic certificate as a result of successful course completion in the state of Kansas, unless the applicant for such an initial certificate is certified as an emergency medical technician.

(d) An attendant's certificate shall expire on the date prescribed by the
board. An attendant's certificate may be renewed for a period of two years
upon payment of a fee as prescribed by rule and regulation of the board
and upon presentation of satisfactory proof that the attendant has
successfully completed continuing education as prescribed by the board.

(e) All fees received pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be
remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A.
75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance,
the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to
the credit of the emergency medical services operating fund established by
K.S.A. 65-6151, and amendments thereto.

(f) If a person who was previously certified as an attendant applies
for an attendant's certificate after the certificate's expiration, the board may
grant a certificate without the person completing an initial course of
instruction or passing a certification examination if the person has
completed education requirements and has paid a fee as specified in rules
and regulations adopted by the board.
