1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for fiscal years ending  
2 June 30, 2014, June 30, 2015, June 30, 2016, June 30, 2017, and June  
3 30, 2018, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital  
4 improvement projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and  
5 limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements,  
6 procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2013  
7 Supp. 74-99b34, 79-34,156, 79-4227 and 79-4804 and repealing the  
8 existing sections.  
9

10 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

11 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2014, June 30,  
12 2015, June 30, 2016, June 30, 2017, and June 30, 2018, appropriations are  
13 hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and  
14 transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements,  
15 procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or  
16 authorized as provided in this act.

17 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate  
18 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by  
19 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the  
20 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

21 (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of subsection (a) of  
22 K.S.A. 75-6702, and amendments thereto.

23 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the  
24 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

36 which are lawfully credited to and available in any bond special revenue  
37 fund, which are not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by  
38 chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other  
39 appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature, are hereby  
40 appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the state agency  
41 for which the bond special revenue fund was established for the purposes  
42 authorized by law for expenditures from such bond special revenue fund.

43 (b) As used in this section, "bond special revenue fund" means any

1 special revenue fund or account thereof established in the state treasury  
2 prior to or on or after the effective date of this act for the deposit of the  
3 proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development finance authority, for  
4 the payment of debt service for bonds issued by the Kansas development  
5 finance authority, or for any related purpose in accordance with applicable  
6 bond covenants.

7       Sec. 102. *Federal grants.* (a) During the fiscal year ending June 30,  
8 2015, each federal grant or other federal receipt which is received by a  
9 state agency named in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or  
10 this act and which is not otherwise appropriated to that state agency for  
11 fiscal year 2015 by chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this  
12 act or other appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature,  
13 is hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2015 for that state agency for the  
14 purpose set forth in such federal grant or receipt, except that no  
15 expenditure shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against  
16 any such federal grant or other federal receipt, which has not been  
17 previously appropriated or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by  
18 the governor, for fiscal year 2015, until the governor has authorized the  
19 state agency to make expenditures from such federal grant or other federal  
20 receipt for fiscal year 2015.

21       (b) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be  
22 made by any state agency which is named in chapter 136 of the 2013  
23 Session Laws of Kansas or this act and which is not otherwise authorized  
24 by law to apply for and receive federal grants, expenditures may be made  
25 by such state agency from moneys appropriated for fiscal year 2015 by  
26 chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or any other  
27 appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature to apply for  
28 and receive federal grants during fiscal year 2015, which federal grants are  
29 hereby authorized to be applied for and received by such state agencies:  
30 *Provided*, That no expenditure shall be made from and no obligation shall  
31 be incurred against any such federal grant or other federal receipt, which  
32 has not been previously appropriated or reappropriated or approved for  
33 expenditure by the governor, until the governor has authorized the state  
34 agency to make expenditures therefrom.

35       Sec. 103. (a) Any correctional institutions building fund appropriation  
36 heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in chapter 136 of the  
37 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other appropriation act of the  
38 2014 regular session of the legislature, and having an unencumbered  
39 balance as of June 30, 2014, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for  
40 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the same uses and purposes as  
41 originally appropriated unless specific provision is made for lapsing such  
42 appropriation.

43       (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in

1 any account of the correctional institutions building fund that was  
2 encumbered for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2013.

3 Sec. 104. (a) Any Kansas educational building fund appropriation  
4 heretofore appropriated to any institution named in chapter 136 of the  
5 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other appropriation act of the  
6 2014 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered  
7 balance as of June 30, 2014, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for  
8 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the same use and purpose as  
9 originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such  
10 appropriation.

11 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in  
12 any account of the Kansas educational building fund that was encumbered  
13 for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2013.

14 Sec. 105. (a) Any state institutions building fund appropriation  
15 heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in chapter 136 of the  
16 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other appropriation act of the  
17 2014 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered  
18 balance as of June 30, 2014, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for  
19 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the same use and purpose as  
20 originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such  
21 appropriation.

22 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in  
23 any account of the state institutions building fund that was encumbered for  
24 any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2013.

25 Sec. 106. (a) Any transfers of money during the fiscal year ending  
26 June 30, 2015, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named  
27 in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or this act to the audit  
28 services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-1121, and  
29 amendments thereto, shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation  
30 imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.
