AN ACT concerning pharmacy students; establishing the pharmacy 2 student loan act; relating to loan forgiveness. 3 4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 5 Section 1. The provisions of sections 1 through 9, and amendments 6 thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the pharmacy student loan act. 7 As used in sections 1 through 9, and amendments thereto: Sec. 2. 8 "Act" means the pharmacy student loan act; (a) 9 "approved postgraduate residency training program" means a (b) residency training program in general pediatrics, general internal 10 medicine, family medicine, family practice, emergency medicine or 11 12 fellowship training in geriatric medicine; 13 "service commitment area" means: (1) Any community within any (c) 14 county in Kansas other than Douglas, Johnson, Sedgwick, Shawnee or 15 Wyandotte county; (2) any state pharmacy; (3) the full-time faculty of the university of Kansas school of pharmacy; or (4) any community within 16 17 Wyandotte county for purposes of any practice obligation under an 18 agreement entered into by a person who is enrolled for the first time after 19 July 1, 2013, in a course of study leading to a pharmacy degree. 20 Sec. 3. The university of Kansas school of pharmacy shall review and 21 evaluate the criteria used in the determination of pharmacologically 22 underserved areas of the state for the purpose of the pharmacy student loan 23 act. On or before January 14, 2014, the university of Kansas school of 24 pharmacy shall submit a report to the legislature relating to such review and evaluation and any other information deemed necessary by the school 25 26 of pharmacy. 27 Sec. 4. (a) There is hereby established the pharmacy student loan 28 program at the university of Kansas school of pharmacy. 29 (b) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, the university of 30 Kansas school of pharmacy may make pharmacy student loans in 31 accordance with the provisions of this act to undergraduate students 32 enrolled in or admitted to the university of Kansas school of pharmacy in a 33 course of instruction leading to the degree of doctor of pharmacy who 34 enter into a written pharmacy student loan agreement with the university 35 of Kansas school of pharmacy in accordance with section 5, and 36 amendments thereto

1 (c) Each pharmacy student loan agreement under this act shall 2 provide to the person receiving the loan the payment of all tuition and a 3 stipend for living expenses in an amount of up to \$2,000 per month for 4 each month enrolled in such school during a year. Subject to the maximum 5 amount, the amount of the monthly stipend shall be determined on an 6 annual basis by the student receiving the loan.

7 (d) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, pharmacy student 8 loan agreements under this act may be entered into on an annual basis and 9 shall provide the payment of the amounts specified under subsection (c) 10 for one year unless otherwise terminated before such period of time. Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, an undergraduate student 11 enrolled in or admitted to the university of Kansas school of pharmacy in a 12 course of instruction leading to the degree of doctor of pharmacy may 13 receive a separate loan under this act for each separate year the student 14 15 enters into a written pharmacy student loan agreement with the university 16 of Kansas school of pharmacy in accordance with section 5, and amendments thereto. Loans may be awarded retroactively for any 17 18 academic year that a student has completed successfully at the university 19 of Kansas school of pharmacy, but for which a loan had not previously 20 been awarded. Retroactive loans shall be in an amount equal to the amount 21 of tuition paid by the student, plus a stipend in an amount not to exceed the 22 maximum amount of the stipend for such academic year multiplied by the 23 number of months for which the student was enrolled at the school of 24 pharmacy during such year. For each separate year a student receives a 25 loan under this act, the student shall engage in the full-time practice of 26 pharmacy in an appropriate service commitment area for a period of 12 27 months unless such obligation is otherwise satisfied as provided in section 28 8, and amendments thereto.

(e) Pharmacy student loans shall be awarded on a priority basis as
follows: First to qualified applicants who are Kansas residents at the time
of entry into the university of Kansas school of pharmacy; and second, to
qualified applicants who are not Kansas residents at the time of entry into
the university of Kansas school of pharmacy. As used in this subsection,
"Kansas residents" means persons who meet the residence requirements
established in K.S.A. 76-729, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 5. A pharmacy student loan agreement entered into by the university of Kansas school of pharmacy and an undergraduate student enrolled in or admitted to the university of Kansas school of pharmacy in a course of instruction leading to the degree of doctor of pharmacy for the purpose of receiving a pharmacy student loan under this act shall require that the person receiving the loan:

42 (a) Complete the required course of instruction and receive the degree43 of doctor of pharmacy;

(b) apply for and obtain a license to practice pharmacy in Kansas;

(c) engage in the full-time practice of pharmacy and surgery for a
period of 12 months within a service commitment area, except as
otherwise provided in subsection (c) of section 6, and amendments thereto,
for service as a full-time faculty member of the university of Kansas
school of pharmacy;

7 (d) commence such full-time practice of pharmacy within nine 8 months after completion of an approved postgraduate residency training 9 program and licensure in a service commitment area and continue such 10 full-time practice in such service commitment area for a consecutive 11 period of months equal to the total number of months required under the 12 agreement;

(e) agree that the service commitment for each agreement entered into
under this act is in addition to the service commitment contained in any
other agreement which has been or may be entered into under this act for
the purpose of obtaining a pharmacy student loan or under other
agreements for the purpose of obtaining scholarship aid;

18 (f) maintain records and make reports to the university of Kansas 19 school of pharmacy to document the satisfaction of the obligation under 20 such agreement to engage in the full-time practice of pharmacy within a 21 service commitment area and to continue such full-time practice in such 22 service commitment area for a consecutive period of months equal to the 23 total number of months required under the agreement; and

(g) upon failure to satisfy an agreement to engage in the full-time
practice of pharmacy within a service commitment area for the required
period of time under any such agreement, the person receiving a pharmacy
student loan under this act shall repay amounts to the university of Kansas
school of pharmacy as provided in section 7, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 6. (a) Upon the selection of a service commitment area for the purposes of satisfying a service obligation under a pharmacy student loan agreement entered into under this act, the person so selecting shall inform the university of Kansas school of pharmacy of the service commitment area selected.

34 (b) A person serving in a service commitment area pursuant to any 35 agreement under this act may serve all or part of any commitment in the 36 service commitment area initially selected by such person. If such person 37 moves from one service commitment area to another service commitment 38 area, such person shall notify the university of Kansas school of pharmacy 39 of such person's change of service commitment area. Service in any such 40 service commitment area shall be deemed to be continuous for the purpose 41 of satisfying any agreement entered into under this act.

42 (c) A person receiving a pharmacy student loan under this act, may43 satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of pharmacy in a

1 service commitment area if the person serves as a full-time faculty 2 member of the university of Kansas school of pharmacy and serves two 3 years for each one year of such obligation, or the equivalent thereof on a 4 two-for-one basis, except that, at the time any person commences 5 satisfying such service obligation as a full-time faculty member pursuant 6 to this subsection, the number of persons satisfying service commitments 7 or service obligations, pursuant to agreements under the pharmacy student 8 loan act, as full-time faculty members pursuant to this subsection shall not 9 exceed the number equal to 25% of the total number of full-time faculty 10 members of the university of Kansas school of pharmacy.

Sec. 7. (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraphs (2), (3), (4) 11 12 and (5) of this subsection (a) or in section 8, and amendments thereto, upon the failure of any person to satisfy the obligation to engage in the 13 14 full-time practice of pharmacy within a service commitment area of this state for the required period of time under any pharmacy student loan 15 agreement entered into under this act, such person shall repay to the 16 17 university of Kansas school of pharmacy in accordance with subsection (b) 18 an amount equal to the total of (A) the amount of money received by such 19 person pursuant to such agreement, or the amount of money determined 20 under rules and regulations of the university of Kansas plus (B) annual 21 interest at a rate of 15% from the date such money was received.

22 (2) If at any time a person is failing to satisfy an obligation to engage 23 in the full-time practice of pharmacy in Kansas for the required period of 24 time under an agreement entered into under this act because such person is 25 engaged in the full-time practice of pharmacy in a state other than Kansas. 26 or within Kansas in an area that is not a service commitment area or in the 27 practice of pharmacy which does not otherwise comply with the agreement 28 entered into under this act, and if such person is subject to or currently 29 making repayments under this section and if such person subsequently 30 commences the practice of pharmacy in this state which is in a service 31 commitment area or which otherwise complies with the agreement entered 32 into under this act, the balance of the repayment amount, including interest 33 thereon, from the time of such commencement of practice until the 34 obligation of such person is satisfied, or until the time such person again 35 becomes subject to repayments, shall be waived. All repayment amounts 36 due prior to such commencement of practice, including interest thereon, 37 shall continue to be payable as provided in this section. If subsequent to 38 such commencement of practice, the person fails to satisfy such obligation, 39 the person again shall be subject to repayments, including interest thereon, 40 as otherwise provided in this section.

41 (3) If, during the time a person is satisfying the service requirement
42 of an agreement entered into under this act, such person desires to engage
43 in less than the full-time practice of pharmacy within a service

1 commitment area of the state and remain in satisfaction of such service 2 requirement, such person may make application to the chancellor of the 3 university of Kansas or the designee of the chancellor for permission to 4 engage in less than such full-time practice of pharmacy. Upon a finding of 5 exceptional circumstances made by the chancellor of the university of 6 Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, such person may be authorized 7 to engage in less than the full-time practice of pharmacy within a service 8 commitment area of the state for the remaining required period of time 9 under such agreement and for an additional period of time which shall be 10 equal to the length of the originally required period of time multiplied by the decimal fraction which is equal to the reduction of the full-time 11 12 practice of pharmacy to be authorized hereunder, multiplied by two. In any 13 such determination of the period required to be engaged in the less than 14 full-time practice of pharmacy, the decimal fraction utilized shall not 15 exceed 0.5 and any person granted permission to engage in less than the 16 full-time practice of pharmacy in accordance with the provisions of this 17 paragraph (4) shall be required to engage in at least the half-time practice 18 of pharmacy.

(b) For any repayment requirement under this section, the person
shall repay an amount totaling the entire amount to be repaid under all
such agreements for which such obligations are not satisfied, including all
amounts of interest at the rate prescribed. The repayment shall be made in
not more than 10 equal annual installment payments.

24 (c) All installment payments under this section shall commence six 25 months after the date of the action or circumstance that causes the failure of the person to satisfy the obligations of such agreements, as determined 26 27 by the university of Kansas school of pharmacy based upon the 28 circumstances of each individual case. In all cases, if an installment 29 payment becomes 91 days overdue, the entire amount outstanding shall 30 become immediately due and payable, including all amounts of interest at 31 the rate prescribed.

32 (d) The total repayment obligation imposed under all agreements 33 entered into under this act may be satisfied by the person who entered into 34 the agreements at any time prior to graduation from the university of 35 Kansas school of pharmacy by making a single lump-sum payment equal to the total of (1) the entire amount to be repaid under all such agreements 36 37 upon failure to satisfy the obligations under such agreements to practice in 38 Kansas, plus (2) all amounts of interest thereon at the rate prescribed to the 39 date of payment.

40 (e) The university of Kansas school of pharmacy shall remit all 41 moneys received under this section to the state treasurer in accordance 42 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon 43 receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the pharmacy loan repayment
 fund.

3 (f) There is hereby created in the state treasury the pharmacy loan 4 repayment fund. All expenditures from the pharmacy loan repayment fund 5 shall be for pharmacy student loans under the pharmacy student loan act 6 and for the expenses of administration of the pharmacy student loan act 7 and shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of 8 the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or by a person designated by 9 10 the chancellor.

Sec. 8. (a) An obligation to engage in the practice of pharmacy in 11 accordance with an agreement under this act shall be postponed: (1) 12 During any required period of active military service; (2) during any 13 period of service as a part of volunteers in service to America (VISTA); (3) 14 during any period of service in the peace corps; (4) during any period of 15 service commitment to the United States public health service; (5) during 16 17 any period of religious missionary work conducted by an organization 18 exempt from tax under subsection (c) of section 501 of the federal internal 19 revenue code of 1986; or (6) during any period of temporary medical 20 disability during which the person obligated is unable because of such 21 medical disability to practice pharmacy. Except for clause (6) of this 22 subsection (a), an obligation to engage in the practice of pharmacy in 23 accordance with an agreement under this act shall not be postponed more 24 than five years from the time the practice of pharmacy was to have been 25 commenced under any such agreement. An obligation to engage in the practice of pharmacy in accordance with an agreement under this act shall 26 27 be postponed under clause (6) of this subsection (a) during the period of 28 time the medical disability exists.

(b) An obligation to engage in the practice of pharmacy in accordance with an agreement under this act shall be satisfied: (1) If the obligation to engage in the practice of pharmacy in accordance with an agreement under this act has been completed; (2) if the person obligated dies; or (3) if, because of permanent physical disability, the person obligated is unable to practice pharmacy.

35 Sec. 9. Each loan agreement entered into under the pharmacy student 36 loan act after the effective date of this act and prior to June 30, 2013, for 37 the 2012-2013 academic year, shall be given retroactive effect so that each 38 pharmacy student entering into such a loan agreement receives payments 39 for all tuition for the entire 2012-2013 academic year and a stipend for 40 living expenses for each month enrolled in the university of Kansas school 41 of pharmacy during the 2012-2013 academic year, all in accordance with 42 the loan agreement, as though the loan agreement had been entered into at 43 the beginning of the 2012-2013 academic year.
