AN ACT concerning criminal procedure; prohibiting the use of drones by law enforcement agencies.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

- Section 1. (a) No law enforcement agency shall use a drone to obtain evidence or other information.
- (b) No drone shall be operated in this state while carrying a lethal payload.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the use of drones to counter a high risk of a terrorist attack, provided, the United States department of homeland security has determined that credible intelligence indicates that there is such a risk of a terrorist attack, and a search warrant has been obtained for such use of a drone.
- (d) Any person aggrieved by a law enforcement agency whose actions violate this section shall have a civil cause of action against such law enforcement agency, and shall be entitled to recover from any such law enforcement agency:
 - (1) Actual damages;
 - (2) punitive damages;
 - (3) equitable relief; and
- (4) reasonable attorney fees.
- (e) Any evidence obtained in violation of this section, and any evidence derived therefrom is inadmissible in any trial, hearing or other proceeding in or before any court, grand jury, department, officer, agency, regulatory body, legislative committee or other authority of this state, or a political subdivision thereof.
 - (f) As used in this section:
 - (1) "Drone" means a powered, aerial vehicle that:
- (A) Does not carry a human operator;
 - (B) uses aerodynamic forces to provide vehicle lift;
 - (C) is able to fly autonomously or be piloted remotely;
 - (D) is expendable or recoverable; and
 - (E) is capable of carrying either a lethal or nonlethal payload.
 - (2) "Law enforcement agency" means any office or agency of the state, or any municipality thereof, whose duties include the prevention or detection of crime and the enforcement of the criminal or traffic laws of

this state or of any municipality thereof.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
