

## Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2436

1 AN ACT concerning the boards of cosmetology and barbering; relating to  
2 dual-licensed facilities; amending K.S.A. 65-1907 and 74-1806 and  
3 repealing the existing sections.

5 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 65-1907 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-  
7 1907. (a) *Except as provided in subsection (b),* the chairperson, with the  
8 approval of the board, shall employ inspectors to inspect schools, salons  
9 and clinics and the inspectors shall perform all of the inspection duties of  
10 the board, as required by this act, rules and regulations of the board and  
11 sanitation standards adopted by the secretary of health and environment  
12 pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1,148, and amendments thereto. The board shall  
13 provide training to the inspectors to enable the inspectors to provide  
14 current information to school, salon and clinic personnel regarding  
15 requirements of applicable statutes and *rules and* regulations. It shall be  
16 the duty of the board to determine the number of hours and practice work  
17 required of students in each subject of cosmetology, nail technology,  
18 esthetics and electrology taught in a licensed school.

19 (b) *The chairperson of the board of cosmetology, with the approval of*  
20 *the board, may enter into an agreement with the chairperson of the board*  
21 *of barbering as to which board's inspectors shall inspect a dual-licensed*  
22 *salon and barber shop. Such designated inspectors shall perform all of the*  
23 *inspection duties of both boards, as required by the applicable statutes and*  
24 *rules and regulations of both boards and the sanitation standards adopted*  
25 *by the secretary of health and environment pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1,148,*  
26 *and amendments thereto. Such designated inspectors shall be trained by*  
27 *both boards as required pursuant to law.*

28 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 74-1806 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-  
29 1806. (a) *Except as provided in subsection (b),* the board shall meet  
30 immediately after appointment and determine the policies of the board and  
31 may conduct any business that may be before such board. Thereafter, the  
32 board shall meet as required by law, at times designated by the board and  
33 on the call of the administrative officer. The board shall keep a record of  
34 all its proceedings and a register of all applicants for licensure and all  
35 licensees. Members of the board attending meetings of such board, or  
36 attending a subcommittee meeting thereof authorized by such board, shall

1 be paid compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses  
2 as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto. The board shall  
3 adopt rules and regulations for the purpose of carrying out the provisions  
4 of this act. The administrative officer, with the approval of the board, shall  
5 have authority to employ inspectors and office personnel as may be  
6 deemed necessary to administer this act, and shall provide and maintain  
7 offices. The inspectors so appointed shall perform all of the inspection  
8 duties of the board. All employees of the board shall be within the  
9 classified service of the Kansas civil service act, with the exception of the  
10 administrative officer, who shall be in the unclassified service.

11 *(b) The chairperson of the board of barbering, with the approval of*  
12 *the board, may enter into an agreement with the chairperson of the board*  
13 *of cosmetology as to which board's inspectors shall inspect a dual-*  
14 *licensed salon and barber shop. Such designated inspectors shall perform*  
15 *all of the inspection duties of both boards, as required by the applicable*  
16 *statutes and rules and regulations of both boards and the sanitation*  
17 *standards adopted by the secretary of health and environment pursuant to*  
18 *K.S.A. 65-1,148, and amendments thereto. Such designated inspectors*  
19 *shall be trained by both boards as required pursuant to law.*

20 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 65-1907 and 74-1806 are hereby repealed.

21 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its  
22 publication in the statute book.
