AN ACT concerning state officers and employees; relating to furloughs or
reduction in compensation; the Kansas public employees retirement
system and systems thereunder, *{excluding certain non-covered employees;}* computation of benefits; amending K.S.A. 74-49,115 *{and K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-4932}* and repealing the existing<u>section</u> *{sections}*.

8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

9 {Section 1. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-4932 is hereby amended to read as 10 follows: 74-4932. As used in this act, unless the context otherwise 11 requires:

12 (1) "Accumulated contributions" means the sum of all 13 contributions by a member to the system which shall be credited to such 14 member's account, with interest allowed thereon, plus such member's 15 contributions transferred from the school employees savings fund of the 16 state school retirement system;

17 (2) "compensation" means the same as defined in subsection (9) of
 18 K.S.A. 74-4902, and amendments thereto;

(3) "school year" means the twelve-month period beginning
 September 1 and ending August 31;

21 (4) "employee" means any employee of a participating employer 22 which is an eligible employer, as specified in K.S.A. 74-4931, and 23 amendments thereto, whose employment is not seasonal or temporary 24 and whose employment requires at least 630 hours of work per year or 25 3.5 hours of work per day for at least 180 days or any employee who is 26 concurrently employed by two or more eligible employers, as specified in 27 K.S.A. 74-4931, and amendments thereto, whose combined employment 28 is not seasonal or temporary and whose combined employment requires 29 at least 630 hours of work per year or 3.5 hours of work per day for at 30 least 180 days. Employee shall not include:

(a) Any employee who is covered by or eligible for or who will
become eligible for retirement benefits under any retirement plan or
system provided by K.S.A. 74-4925, and amendments thereto;

34 (b) any employee who is a contributing member of the United States

1 *civil service retirement system;*

2 (c) any employee or class of employees specifically exempt by law, 3 except those persons who were formerly employees of one or more of the 4 participating employers which are eligible employers as specified in 5 K.S.A. 74-4931, and amendments thereto, who are covered by and have 6 contributions on deposit with the state school retirement system and who 7 have not retired under that system on the day next preceding entry date;

(d) any employee who on entry date is covered by or eligible for or 8 will become eligible for retirement benefits under a separate retirement 9 system authorized or established under K.S.A. 72-1758 to 72-1769, 10 inclusive, and amendments thereto or K.S.A. 72-6780, and amendments 11 thereto, except that this paragraph (d) shall not include any employee, 12 who before September 1, 1974, elects to become a member of the Kansas 13 public employees retirement system as provided in K.S.A. 74-4935a, and 14 15 amendments thereto:-or

16 (e) on and after July 1, 1975, no person who is otherwise eligible for membership in the Kansas public employees retirement system shall 17 be barred from such membership by reason of coverage by, eligibility for 18 19 or future eligibility for a retirement annuity under the provisions of 20 K.S.A. 74-4925, and amendments thereto. However, no person shall 21 receive service credit under the Kansas public employees retirement 22 system for any period of service for which benefits accrue or are granted 23 under a retirement annuity plan under the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4925. 24 and amendments thereto: or

(f) any employee who takes a leave of absence and is not currently
working for an eligible employer in a covered position with the Kansas
public employees retirement system which meets the requirements of
subsection (4).

(5) "executive director" means the managing officer of the system
as defined in subsection (16) of K.S.A. 74-4902, and amendments
thereto;

32 (6) "military service" means the same as defined in subsection (22) 33 of K.S.A. 74-4902, and amendments thereto, and includes such service 34 when followed by return to employment with the same or another 35 participating employer on or before the beginning of the next school 36 year following discharge or separation from such military service;

(7) "normal retirement date" means the same as defined in
subsection (23) of K.S.A. 74-4902, and amendments thereto, as modified
by subsection (1) of K.S.A. 74-4937, and amendments thereto;

40 (8) "school employment" means the employment of a member
41 when employed by an eligible employer as specified in any of subsection
42 (1), (2) or (3) of K.S.A. 74-4931, and amendments thereto; and

43 (9) "USERRA" means the same as defined in subsection (34) of

1 K.S.A. 74-4902, and amendments thereto.}

2 Section 1. (Sec. 2.) K.S.A. 74-49,115 is hereby amended to read as 3 follows: 74-49,115. (a) When the compensation for any officer or 4 employee of the state, who retires, becomes disabled or dies-during the 5 period commencing_on the effective date of this act_July 1, 2014, and 6 ending June 30, 2007 2017, is reduced pursuant to law, when such officer 7 or employee voluntarily agrees to reduce such officer or employee's 8 compensation, or when any officer or employee of the state is placed on a 9 furlough without pay, the amount of compensation that would have been 10 paid if the rate of compensation had not been reduced or if the officer or employee had not been placed on the furlough shall continue to be 11 12 included as compensation for all purposes of computing retirement and 13 pension benefits and death and disability benefits as provided in article 26 14 of chapter 20 and article 49 of chapter 74 of the Kansas Statutes 15 Annotated, and amendments thereto, earned by such officer or employee 16 as provided by the Kansas public employees retirement system, the Kansas 17 police and firemen's retirement system and the retirement system for judges. Subject to the approval of the secretary of administration, the 18 19 director of accounts and reports shall prescribe procedures for the payment 20 and remittance of employer and employee contributions by the state 21 agency employing such employees. The board shall administer the 22 provisions of this section, with the cooperation of the director of personnel 23 services.

(b) The provisions of subsection (a) shall not be applicable to
compensation reductions attributable to: (1) Voluntary demotions of
employees in the classified service; (2) deferred compensation pursuant to
the plan authorized by K.S.A. 75-5523, and amendments thereto; or (3) to
compensation reductions attributable to the cafeteria plan authorized by
K.S.A. 75-6512, and amendments thereto.

30 (c) For the purposes of this section, "officer" and "employee" means 31 any officer or employee of the state, any member *or employee* of the 32 legislature or any employee of an institution under the supervision of the 33 board of regents *who are members of the Kansas public employees* 34 *retirement system, the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system or* 35 *the retirement system for judges.*
