1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for fiscal years ending
2 June 30, 2014, June 30, 2015, June 30, 2016, June 30, 2017, and June
3 30, 2018, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital
4 improvement projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and
5 limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements,
6 procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2013
7 Supp. 12-5256, 79-34,156, 79-4227 and 79-4804 and repealing the
8 existing sections.

10 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

11 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2014, June 30,
12 2015, June 30, 2016, June 30, 2017, and June 30, 2018, appropriations are
13 hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and
14 transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and
15 acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as
16 provided in this act.

17 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
18 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by
19 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the
20 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

21 (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of subsection (a) of
22 K.S.A. 75-6702, and amendments thereto.

23 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
24 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

3 Supp. 79-4806, and amendments thereto, an amount equal to 85% of the
4 balance of all moneys credited to the state gaming revenues fund shall be
5 transferred and credited to the state economic development initiatives
6 fund. Expenditures from the state economic development initiatives fund
7 shall be made in accordance with appropriations acts for the financing of
8 such programs supporting and enhancing the existing economic foundation
9 of the state and fostering growth through the expansion of current, and the
10 establishment and attraction of new, commercial and industrial enterprises
11 as provided by this section and as may be authorized by law and not less
12 than $\frac{1}{2}$ of such money shall be distributed equally among the
13 congressional districts of the state. Except as provided by subsection (g),
14 all moneys credited to the state economic development initiatives fund
15 shall be credited within the fund, as provided by law, to an account or
16 accounts of the fund which are created by this section.

17 (b) There is hereby created the Kansas capital formation account in
18 the state economic development initiatives fund. All moneys credited to
19 the Kansas capital formation account shall be used to provide, encourage
20 and implement capital development and formation in Kansas.

21 (c) There is hereby created the Kansas economic development
22 research and development account in the state economic development
23 initiatives fund. All moneys credited to the Kansas economic development
24 research and development account shall be used to promote, encourage
25 and implement research and development programs and activities in
26 Kansas and technical assistance funded through state educational
27 institutions under the supervision and control of the state board of regents
28 or other Kansas colleges and universities.

29 (d) There is hereby created the Kansas economic development
30 endowment account in the state economic development initiatives fund.
31 All moneys credited to the Kansas economic development endowment
32 account shall be accumulated and invested as provided in this section to
33 provide an ongoing source of funds which shall be used for economic
34 development activities in Kansas, including, but not limited to, continuing
35 appropriations or demand transfers for programs and projects which shall
36 include, but are not limited to, specific community infrastructure projects
37 in Kansas that stimulate economic growth.

38 (e) Except as provided in subsection (f), the director of investments
39 may invest and reinvest moneys credited to the state economic
40 development initiatives fund in accordance with investment policies
41 established by the pooled money investment board under K.S.A. 75-4232,
42 and amendments thereto, in the pooled money investment portfolio. All
43 moneys received as interest earned by the investment of the moneys

1 credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be
2 deposited in the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic
3 development endowment account of such fund.

4 (f) Moneys credited to the Kansas economic development
5 endowment account of the state economic development initiatives fund
6 may be invested in government guaranteed loans and debentures as
7 provided by law in addition to the investments authorized by subsection
8 (e) or in lieu of such investments. All moneys received as interest earned
9 by the investment under this subsection of the moneys credited to the
10 Kansas economic development endowment account shall be deposited in
11 the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic development
12 endowment account of the state economic development initiatives fund.

13 (g) *Except as provided further*, in each fiscal year, the director of
14 accounts and reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and
15 January 15 which in the aggregate equal \$2,000,000 from the state
16 economic development initiatives fund to the state water plan fund created
17 by K.S.A. 82a-951, and amendments thereto, ~~except that~~. No moneys shall
18 be transferred from the state economic development initiatives fund to the
19 state water plan fund on such dates during state fiscal year 2014 ~~or state~~
20 ~~fiscal year 2015~~. *In state fiscal year 2015, the director of accounts and*
21 *reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and January 15*
22 *which in the aggregate equal \$800,000 from the state economic*
23 *development initiatives fund to the state water plan fund*. No other moneys
24 credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be used
25 for: (1) Water-related projects or programs, or related technical assistance;
26 or (2) any other projects or programs, or related technical assistance,
27 which meet one or more of the long-range goals, objectives and
28 considerations set forth in the state water resource planning act.

32 application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such

36 Sec. 112. *Appeals to exceed expenditure limitations*. (a) Upon written
37 application to the governor and approval of the state finance council,
38 expenditures from special revenue funds may exceed the amounts
39 specified in this act.

40 (b) This section shall not apply to the expanded lottery act revenues
41 fund, the state economic development initiatives fund, the children's
42 initiative fund, the state water plan fund or the Kansas endowment for

1 Sec. 113. *Savings.* (a) Any unencumbered balance as of June 30,
2 2014, in any special revenue fund, or account thereof, of any state agency
3 named in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or this act
4 which is not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited for fiscal year
5 2015 by chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or any
6 other appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature, is

9 (b) This section shall not apply to the expanded lottery act revenues

13 fund, or the correctional institutions building fund, or to any account of
14 any of such funds.

15 Sec. 114. (a) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, all moneys
16 which are lawfully credited to and available in any bond special revenue
17 fund, which are not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by
18 chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or other
19 appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature, are hereby
20 appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for the state agency
21 for which the bond special revenue fund was established for the purposes
22 authorized by law for expenditures from such bond special revenue fund.

23 (b) As used in this section, "bond special revenue fund" means any
24 special revenue fund or account thereof established in the state treasury
25 prior to or on or after the effective date of this act for the deposit of the
26 proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development finance authority, for
27 the payment of debt service for bonds issued by the Kansas development
28 finance authority, or for any related purpose in accordance with applicable
29 bond covenants.

30 Sec. 115. *Federal grants.* (a) During the fiscal year ending June 30,
31 2015, each federal grant or other federal receipt which is received by a
32 state agency named in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or
33 this act and which is not otherwise appropriated to that state agency for
34 fiscal year 2015 by chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this
35 act or other appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature,
36 is hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2015 for that state agency for the
37 purpose set forth in such federal grant or receipt, except that no
38 expenditure shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against

1 (b) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be
2 made by any state agency which is named in chapter 136 of the 2013
3 Session Laws of Kansas or this act and which is not otherwise authorized
4 by law to apply for and receive federal grants, expenditures may be made
5 by such state agency from moneys appropriated for fiscal year 2015 by
6 chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas, this act or any other
7 appropriation act of the 2014 regular session of the legislature to apply for
8 and receive federal grants during fiscal year 2015, which federal grants are

3 any account of the state institutions building fund that was encumbered for

5 Sec. 119. (a) Any transfers of money during the fiscal year ending
6 June 30, 2015, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named
7 in chapter 136 of the 2013 Session Laws of Kansas or this act to the audit
8 services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-1121, and
9 amendments thereto, shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation
10 imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.
