Notes from U.S. Census:

Finances are classified according to the Census Bureau's classification methodology as outlined in the Government Finance and Employment Classification Manual.

(1) Within insurance trust revenue, net earnings of state and locally-administered pension systems is a calculated statistic (the item code in the data file is X08), and thus can be positive or negative. Net earnings is the sum of earnings on investments plus gains on investments minus losses on investments. The change made in 2002 for asset valuation from book to market value in accordance with Statement 34 of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board is reflected in the calculated statistics.

Data are released on a flow basis and replaced when revised data are available. See the Federal, State, and Local Governments release schedule.
