In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2072 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2072 would increase fees paid into the Kansas Agricultural Remediation Fund of the Kansas Department of Agriculture.

The Department of Agriculture indicates that passage of HB 2072 would increase revenue deposited to the Kansas Agricultural Remediation Fund by \$1,455,000 for FY 2016. The specific fee increases are listed below:
