SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2336 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2336 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2336 would require courts to administer a risk assessment tool to juveniles before placing them in a detention center, under a house arrest program, in the custody of the Department of Corrections Juvenile Services, in a sanctions house, or in a juvenile correctional facility.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates that HB 2336 could require additional court services officers to be trained in the use of the Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory, which is the juvenile risk assessment tool. It is estimated that the training would increase expenditures but that existing funding from the Correctional Supervision Fund would be used to cover any costs that may occur. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2336 is not reflected in *The FY 2016 Governor's Budget Report*.
