SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2690 by House Committee on Insurance and Financial Institutions

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2690 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2690 would amend current law to clarify elements related to licensure of Behavior Analysts and Assistant Behavior Analysts under the Applied Behavior Analyst Licensure Act.
