AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to driver's licenses; creating
 the temporary visitor's driver's license; amending K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8 237, 8-240 and 8-1324 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) The division of vehicles shall issue a limited class
C driver's license, limited instruction permit or limited and restricted
license when the following conditions are satisfied:

9 (1) A limited class C driver's license or instruction permit shall be 10 issued to an applicant 17 years of age or older who is otherwise eligible for 11 a driver's license or instruction permit pursuant to K.S.A. 8-237, 8-239 or 12 8-240, and amendments thereto, and who satisfies the requirements set 13 forth in subsection (b). A limited driver's license issued under this 14 subsection shall be subject to all of the requirements set forth pursuant to 15 K.S.A. 8-247, and amendments thereto; or

16 (2) a limited and restricted class C driver's license shall be issued to 17 an applicant who is at least 15 years of age but less than 17 years of age 18 who is otherwise eligible for a restricted driver's license or instruction 19 permit pursuant to K.S.A. 8-2,100 or 8-2,101, and amendments thereto, 20 and who satisfies the requirements set forth in subsection (b).

(b) (1) The division shall issue a limited driver's license, limited and
restricted license, or limited instruction permit to any individual who is
deemed to be a resident of Kansas pursuant to K.S.A. 8-234a(a)(2), and
amendments thereto; and

(A) has not been issued a social security number; or

(B) does not provide satisfactory documentary evidence of citizenship
or lawful presence pursuant to K.S.A. 8-240(b)(2)(A), and amendments
thereto.

(2) An applicant who applies for a limited driver's license, limited and restricted license or limited instruction permit shall present with the application a valid passport from the applicant's country of citizenship or a valid consular identification document, as defined by subsection (d) or other proof of identity deemed acceptable by the department.

34 (c) (1) A limited driver's license, limited and restricted license or 35 limited instruction permit issued under this section shall contain a notice 36 on its face that the license or permit is not acceptable for any of the purposes specified by the real id act of 2005 P.L. 109-13, or for the
 purposes of voting, the purchase of a firearm or establishing the holder's
 eligibility for public benefits.

4 (2) Any person to whom the division may issue a limited driver's 5 license, limited and restricted license or limited instruction permit, 6 pursuant to subsection (a), shall be subject to any and all provisions of the 7 motor vehicle driver's license act and the uniform act regulating traffic on 8 highways and any and all rules and regulations issued by the division to the same extent as any person issued a driver's license, unless otherwise 9 provided, including, but not limited to, the mandatory insurance 10 requirements and penalties set forth in K.S.A. 40-3101 et seq., and 11 amendments thereto. 12

13 (3) Possession or presentation of a limited driver's license, limited and restricted license or limited instruction permit issued pursuant to this 14 section, rather than a driver's license or instruction permit issued pursuant 15 to K.S.A. 8-239, 8-240, 8-2,100 or 8-2,101, and amendments thereto, shall 16 17 not be used to consider an individual's citizenship or immigration status 18 and shall not be used as a basis for any investigation, criminal or 19 otherwise, and shall not be used as the basis for an arrest, citation or 20 detention.

(4) Information provided in an application for a limited driver's
license, limited and restricted license or limited instruction permit is not a
public record and shall not be disclosed by the division, unless required by
court order. Pursuant to K.S.A. 45-229, and amendments thereto, the
exception to the Kansas open records act contained in subsection (c) shall
expire on June 30, 2019, unless the legislature reviews and reenacts these
provisions prior to June 30, 2019.

(d) As used in this section, "consular identification document" means
an official identification card issued by a foreign government that meets all
of the following requirements:

(1) The identification card is issued through the foreign government's
 consular offices for the purpose of identifying a foreign national who is
 living outside the foreign jurisdiction.

(2) The foreign government requires the foreign national to provide
 proof of nationality that is within the foreign government's jurisdiction and
 proof of identity to obtain the identification card.

37 (3) The foreign government includes all of the following security38 features in the identification card:

- (A) A unique identification number;
- 40 (B) an optically variable feature such as a hologram or color-shifting 41 inks;
- 42 (C) an ultraviolet image;

- (E) machine-readable technology;
- 2 (F) microprinting;
 - (G) secure laminate; and

(H) integrated photograph and signature.

5 (4) The identification card includes on its face the name of the 6 individual to whom it is issued, the date of issuance, the date of expiration, 7 the name of the issuing consular office or foreign government and the 8 unique identification number. The identification card must include an 9 English translation of the data fields.

10 (5) The issuing consular office or foreign government has filed with 11 the division a copy of the foreign government's standard consular 12 identification document and a certification of the procedures that are used 13 to satisfy the requirements pursuant to subsections (b) and (c).

(e) The secretary of revenue shall promulgate rules and regulationsnecessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

16 (f) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the motor 17 vehicle driver's license act.

18 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-237 is hereby amended to read as 19 follows: 8-237. The division of vehicles shall not issue any driver's license 20 to any person:

(a) Who is under the age of 17 years, except that the division may
issue a restricted class C or M license, as provided in K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 82,101, and amendments thereto, or a farm permit, under K.S.A. 8-296, and
amendments thereto.

(b) Who is under the age of 18 years, except as provided in K.S.A. 82,147, and amendments thereto, for the purpose of driving a commercial or
class A or B motor vehicle.

(c) Whose license is currently revoked, suspended or canceled in this
or any other state, except as provided in K.S.A. 8-256, and amendments
thereto.

(d) Who is a habitual drunkard, habitual user of narcotic drugs or
habitual user of any other drug to a degree which renders the user
incapable of safely driving a motor vehicle.

(e) Who has previously been adjudged to be afflicted with or
suffering from any mental disability or disease and who, at the time of
making application for a driver's license, has not been restored to capacity
in the manner provided by law. Application of this limitation to any person
known to have suffered any seizure disorder is subject to the provisions of
K.S.A. 8-247, and amendments thereto.

40 (f) Who is required by the motor vehicle drivers' license act to take an 41 examination, unless the person has successfully passed the examination.

42 (g) Who is at least 16 years of age and less than 17 years of age, who 43 is applying for a driver's license for the first time since reaching 16 years

1 of age and who, three times or more, has been adjudged to be a traffic 2 offender under the Kansas juvenile code or a juvenile offender under the 3 revised Kansas juvenile justice code, by reason of violation of one or more 4 statutes regulating the movement of traffic on the roads, streets or 5 highways of this state, except that, in the discretion of the director, the 6 person may be issued a driver's license which is restricted in the manner 7 the division deems to be appropriate. No person described by this 8 subsection shall be eligible to receive a driver's license which is not 9 restricted until the person has reached the age of 17 years.

10 (h) Who has not submitted proof of age or proof of identity, as 11 required by K.S.A. 8-240, and amendments thereto.

(i) Whose presence in the United States is in violation of federal
immigration laws, unless such person is applying for a limited driver's *license, limited and restricted license or limited instruction permit pursuant to section 1, and amendments thereto.*

16 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-240 is hereby amended to read as 17 follows: 8-240. (a) (1) Every application for an instruction permit shall be 18 made upon a form furnished by the division of vehicles and accompanied 19 by a fee of \$2 for class A, B, C or M and \$5 for all commercial classes. 20 Every other application shall be made upon a form furnished by the 21 division and accompanied by an examination fee of \$3, unless a different 22 fee is required by K.S.A. 8-241, and amendments thereto, and by the 23 proper fee for the license for which the application is made. If the 24 applicant is not required to take an examination the examination fee shall 25 not be required. The examination shall consist of three tests, as follows: (A) Vision; (B) written; and (C) driving. If the applicant fails the vision 26 27 test, the applicant may have correction of vision made and take the vision 28 test again without any additional fee. If an applicant fails the written test, 29 the applicant may take such test again upon the payment of an additional 30 examination fee of \$1.50. If an applicant fails the driving test, the 31 applicant may take such test again upon the payment of an additional 32 examination fee of \$1.50. If an applicant fails to pass all three of the tests 33 within a period of six months from the date of original application and 34 desires to take additional tests, the applicant shall file an application for 35 reexamination upon a form furnished by the division, which shall be 36 accompanied by a reexamination fee of \$3, except that any applicant who 37 fails to pass the written or driving portion of an examination four times 38 within a six-month period, shall be required to wait a period of six months 39 from the date of the last failed examination before additional examinations 40 may be given. Upon the filing of such application and the payment of such 41 reexamination fee, the applicant shall be entitled to reexamination in like 42 manner and subject to the additional fees and time limitation as provided 43 for examination on an original application. If the applicant passes the

reexamination, the applicant shall be issued the classified driver's license
 for which the applicant originally applied, which license shall be issued to
 expire as if the applicant had passed the original examination.

4 (2) Applicants for class M licenses who have completed prior 5 motorcycle safety training in accordance with department of defense 6 instruction 6055.04 (DoDI 6055.04) are not required to complete further 7 written and driving testing pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection.

8 (b) (1) For the purposes of obtaining any driver's license or 9 instruction permit, an applicant shall submit, with the application, proof of 10 age and proof of identity as the division may require. The applicant also shall provide a photo identity document, except that a non-photo identity 11 12 document is acceptable if it includes both the applicant's full legal name 13 and date of birth, and documentation showing the applicant's name, the 14 applicant's address of principal residence and the applicant's social security 15 number. The applicant's social security number shall remain confidential 16 and shall not be disclosed, except as provided pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2012, 17 and amendments thereto. If the applicant does not have a social security 18 number the applicant shall provide proof of lawful presence and Kansas 19 residency unless the applicant is applying for either a limited driver's license, limited and restricted license or limited instruction permit 20 21 pursuant to section 1, and amendments thereto. The division shall assign a 22 distinguishing number to the license or permit.

23 (2) (A) Except as provided in subsection (B), the division shall not 24 issue any driver's license or instruction permit to any person who fails to 25 provide proof that the person is lawfully present in the United States. Before issuing a driver's license or instruction permit to a person, the 26 27 division shall require valid documentary evidence that the applicant: (A)(i)28 Is a citizen or national of the United States; (B)(ii) is an alien lawfully 29 admitted for permanent or temporary residence in the United States; (C) (*iii*) has conditional permanent resident status in the United States; (D)(iv)30 31 has an approved application for asylum in the United States or has entered 32 into the United States in refugee status; (E)(v) has a valid, unexpired 33 nonimmigrant visa or nonimmigrant visa status for entry into the United 34 States; (F)(vi) has a pending application for asylum in the United States; 35 (G)(vii) has a pending or approved application for temporary protected 36 status in the United States; (H)(viii) has approved deferred action status; or 37 (H)(ix) has a pending application for adjustment of status to that of an alien 38 lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States or 39 conditional permanent resident status in the United States.

(B) The division shall issue a limited driver's license, limited and
restricted license or limited instruction permit to any applicant who fulfills
the requirements set forth in section 1, and amendments thereto.

43 (3) If an applicant provides evidence of lawful presence set out in

1 subsections (b)(2)(E) (b)(2)(A)(v) through (2)(E)(A)(ix), or is an alien 2 lawfully admitted for temporary residence under subsection $\frac{(b)(2)(B)}{(b)}$ (b) 3 (2)(A)(ii), the division may only issue a driver's license to the person under 4 the following conditions: (A) A driver's license issued pursuant to this 5 subparagraph shall be valid only during the period of time of the 6 applicant's authorized stay in the United States or, if there is no definite 7 end to the period of authorized stay, a period of one year; (B) a driver's 8 license issued pursuant to this subparagraph shall clearly indicate that it is 9 temporary and shall state the date on which it expires; (C) no driver's 10 license issued pursuant to this subparagraph shall be for a longer period of time than the time period permitted by subsection (a) of K.S.A. 8-247(a), 11 12 and amendments thereto; and (D) a driver's license issued pursuant to this 13 subparagraph may be renewed, subject at the time of renewal, to the same 14 requirements and conditions as set out in this subsection (b) for the 15 issuance of the original driver's license.

(4) The division shall not issue any driver's license or instruction
permit to any person who is not a resident of the state of Kansas, except as
provided in K.S.A. 8-2,148, and amendments thereto.

(5) The division shall not issue a driver's license to a person holding a
driver's license issued by another state without making reasonable efforts
to confirm that the person is terminating or has terminated the driver's
license in the other state.

(6) The parent or guardian of an applicant under 16 years of age shallsign the application for any driver's license submitted by such applicant.

25 (c) Every application shall state the full legal name, date of birth, 26 gender and address of principal residence of the applicant, and briefly 27 describe the applicant, and shall state whether the applicant has been 28 licensed as a driver prior to such application, and, if so, when and by what 29 state or country. Such application shall state whether any such license has 30 ever been suspended or revoked, or whether an application has ever been 31 refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such suspension, revocation 32 or refusal. In addition, applications for commercial drivers' licenses and 33 instruction permits for commercial licenses must include the following: 34 The applicant's social security number; the person's signature; the person's colored digital photograph; certifications, including those required by 49 35 36 C.F.R. § 383.71(a), effective January 1, 1991; a consent to release driving 37 record information; and, any other information required by the division.

(d) When an application is received from a person previously licensed
in another jurisdiction, the division shall request a copy of the driver's
record from the other jurisdiction. When received, the driver's record shall
become a part of the driver's record in this state with the same force and
effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state in the original
instance.

1 (e) When the division receives a request for a driver's record from 2 another licensing jurisdiction the record shall be forwarded without 3 charge. 4 (f) A fee shall be charged as follows: 5 (1) For a class C driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years of 6 age, but less than 65 years of age, \$18; 7 (2) for a class C driver's license issued to a person 65 years of age or 8 older, \$12; 9 (3) for a class M driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years of 10 age, but less than 65 years of age, \$12.50; (4) for a class M driver's license issued to a person 65 years of age or 11 12 older, \$9; 13 (5) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person who is at least 21 years of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$24; 14 (6) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person 65 years of 15 16 age or older, \$16; 17 (7) for any class of commercial driver's license issued to a person 21 18 years of age or older, \$18; or 19 (8) for class A, B, C or M, or a farm permit, or any commercial driver's license issued to a person less than 21 years of age. \$20. 20 21 A fee of \$10 shall be charged for each commercial driver's license 22 endorsement, except air brake endorsements which shall have no charge. 23 A fee of \$3 per year shall be charged for any renewal of a license issued 24 prior to the effective date of this act to a person less than 21 years of age. 25 If one fails to make an original application or renewal application for a driver's license within the time required by law, or fails to make 26 27 application within 60 days after becoming a resident of Kansas, a penalty 28 of \$1 shall be added to the fee charged for the driver's license. (g) Any person who possesses an identification card as provided in 29 K.S.A. 8-1324, and amendments thereto, shall surrender such 30 31 identification card to the division upon being issued a valid Kansas driver's 32 license or upon reinstatement and return of a valid Kansas driver's license. 33 (h) The division shall require that any person applying for a driver's 34 license submit to a mandatory facial image capture. 35 (i) The director of vehicles may issue a temporary driver's license to an applicant who cannot provide valid documentary evidence as defined 36 37 by subsection (b)(2), if the applicant provides compelling evidence 38 proving current lawful presence. Any temporary license issued pursuant to 39 this subsection shall be valid for one year. 40 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-1324 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1324. (a) Any resident who does not hold a current valid Kansas 41 driver's license may make application to the division of vehicles and be 42 43 issued one identification card.

1 (b) For the purpose of obtaining an identification card, an applicant 2 shall submit, with the application, proof of age, proof of identity and proof 3 of lawful presence. An applicant shall submit with the application a photo 4 identity document, except that a non-photo identity document is acceptable 5 if it includes both the applicant's full legal name and date of birth, and 6 documentation showing the applicant's name, the applicant's address of 7 principal residence and the applicant's social security account number. The 8 applicant's social security number shall remain confidential and shall not 9 be disclosed, except as provided pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2014, and 10 amendments thereto. If the applicant does not have a social security number, the applicant shall provide proof of lawful presence and Kansas 11 12 residency. The division shall assign a distinguishing number to the 13 identification card. Before issuing an identification card to a person, the 14 division shall make reasonable efforts to verify with the issuing agency the issuance, validity and completeness of each document required to be 15 presented by the applicant to prove age, identity and lawful presence. 16

17 (c) The division shall not issue an identification card to any person 18 who fails to provide proof that the person is lawfully present in the United 19 States. If an applicant provides evidence of lawful presence as set out in 20 subsections (b)(2)(E) through (2)(I) of K.S.A. 8-240(b)(2)(A)(v) through 21 (A)(ix), and amendments thereto, or is an alien lawfully admitted for 22 temporary residence under subsection (b)(2)(B) of K.S.A. 8-240(b)(2)(A) 23 (ii), and amendments thereto, the division may only issue a temporary 24 identification card to the person under the following conditions: (A) A 25 temporary identification card issued pursuant to this subparagraph shall be 26 valid only during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in 27 the United States or, if there is no definite end to the period of authorized 28 stay, a period of one year; (B) a temporary identification card issued 29 pursuant to this subparagraph shall clearly indicate that it is temporary and 30 shall state the date upon which it expires; (C) no temporary identification 31 card issued pursuant to this subparagraph shall be for a longer period of 32 time than the time period permitted by K.S.A. 8-1325, and amendments 33 thereto; and (D) a temporary identification card issued pursuant to this 34 subparagraph may be renewed, subject at the time of renewal, to the same 35 requirements and conditions set forth in this subsection (c) for the issuance 36 of the original temporary identification card.

(d) The division shall not issue an identification card to any person
who holds a current valid Kansas driver's license unless such driver's
license has been physically surrendered pursuant to the provisions of
subsection (c) of K.S.A. 8-1002(e), and amendments thereto.

41 (e) The division shall refuse to issue an identification card to a person
42 holding a driver's license or identification card issued by another state
43 without confirmation that the person is terminating or has terminated the

1 license or identification card.

2 (f) The parent or guardian of an applicant under 16 years of age shall 3 sign the application for an identification card submitted by such applicant.

4 (g) (1) The division shall require payment of a fee of \$14 at the time 5 application for an identification card is made, except that persons who are 6 65 or more years of age or who are handicapped, as defined in K.S.A. 8-7 1,124, and amendments thereto, shall be required to pay a fee of only \$10. 8 In addition to the fees prescribed by this subsection, the division shall require payment of the photo fee established pursuant to K.S.A. 8-243, and 9 amendments thereto, for the cost of the photograph to be placed on the 10 identification card 11

(2) The division shall not require or accept payment of application or
photo fees under this subsection for any person 17 years of age or older for
purposes of meeting the voter identification requirements of K.S.A. 252908, and amendments thereto. Such person shall:

16 (A) Swear under oath that such person desires an identification card 17 in order to vote in an election in Kansas and that such person does not 18 possess any of the forms of identification acceptable under K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto. The affidavit shall specifically list the 20 acceptable forms of identification under K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments 21 thereto; and

(B) produce evidence that such person is registered to vote in Kansas.

(3) The secretary of revenue shall adopt rules and regulations in orderto implement the provisions of paragraph (2).

(h) All Kansas identification cards shall have physical security
 features designed to prevent tampering, counterfeiting or duplication for
 fraudulent purposes.

(i) For the purposes of K.S.A. 8-1324 through 8-1328, and
amendments thereto, a person shall be deemed to be a resident of the state
if:

The person owns, leases or rents a place of domicile in this state;
 the person engages in a trade, business or profession in this state;

(3) the person is registered to vote in this state;

(4) the person enrolls the person's child in a school in this state; or

(5) the person registers the person's motor vehicle in this state.

(j) The division shall require that any person applying for anidentification card submit to a mandatory facial image capture.

(k) (1) Any person who is a veteran may request that the division
issue to such person a nondriver identification card which shall include the
designation "VETERAN" displayed on the front of the nondriver
identification card at a location to be determined by the secretary of
revenue. In order to receive a nondriver identification card described in
this subsection, the veteran must provide proof of the veteran's military

service and honorable discharge or general discharge under honorable
 conditions, including a copy of the veteran's DD214 form or equivalent.

(2) As used in this subsection, "veteran" means a person who:

4 (A) Has served in: The army, navy, marine corps, air force, coast 5 guard, air or army national guard or any branch of the military reserves of 6 the United States; and

(B) has been separated from the branch of service in which the person
was honorably discharged or received a general discharge under honorable
conditions.

10 (3) The director of vehicles may adopt any rules and regulations 11 necessary to carry out the provisions of this subsection.

(1) The director of vehicles may issue a temporary identification card
 to an applicant who cannot provide valid documentary evidence as defined
 by subsection (c), if the applicant provides compelling evidence proving
 current lawful presence. Any temporary identification card issued pursuant
 to this subparagraph shall be valid for one year.

17 (m) Upon payment of the required fee, the division shall issue to every applicant qualifying under the provisions of this act an identification 18 19 card. Such identification card shall bear a distinguishing number assigned 20 to the cardholder, the full legal name, date of birth, address of principal 21 residence, a brief description of the cardholder, a colored digital 22 photograph of the cardholder, and a facsimile of the signature of the 23 cardholder. An identification card which does not contain the address of principal residence of the cardholder as required may be issued to persons 24 25 who are program participants pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 75-455, and 26 amendments thereto.

27 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 8-237, 8-240 and 8-1324 are hereby 28 repealed.

Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
