AN ACT concerning motion picture distribution and exhibition; relating to drive-in theaters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) A license agreement created or renewed after the effective date of this act which provides for a fee or other payment to a distributor based in whole or in part on the attendance at a theater or the box office receipts of a theater may not contain or be conditioned upon a guarantee of a minimum payment by an exhibitor to the distributor.

- (b) A license agreement created or renewed after the effective date of this act shall not contain or be conditioned upon a provision, agreement or understanding that the exhibitor shall advance any funds prior to the exhibition of the motion picture as security for the exhibitor's performance of the license agreement or to be applied to any payments that the exhibitor is required by the license agreement to make to the distributor.
- (c) Any provision of a license agreement created or renewed after the effective date of this act that waives any of the prohibitions of, or fails to comply with, this section is void and unenforceable.
- (d) A person aggrieved by a violation of this section may bring a civil action to enjoin further or continuing violations or to recover actual damages sustained as a result of a violation, together with costs of the action. In an action under this subsection, the court shall award reasonable attorney fees to a party who obtains injunctive relief or an award of damages.
- (e) Subsections (a) through (d) shall only apply to license agreements between distributors and independently owned drive-in movie theaters. For purposes of this section, a drive-in movie theater means an establishment designed to permit customers to remain in their motor vehicles while viewing a motion picture and primarily consisting of one or more of the following: A large outdoor screen, projection booth, concession stand and parking area for automobiles.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
