AN ACT concerning utilities; relating to electric transmission lines, right to construct.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section:

- (1) "Incumbent electric transmission owner" means any Kansas electric utility, its affiliates or subsidiaries, as recognized by the state corporation commission as a public utility, or any electric cooperative, municipal power agency or municipal utility that owns, operates and maintains electric facilities in this state. If there are two or more incumbent electric transmission owners of a local electric transmission line, the term "incumbent electric transmission owner" shall include each owner.
- (2) "Local electric transmission line" means any line or extension of a line with a rating of greater than 100 kilovolts and less than 200 kilovolts or any related transmission facilities and controls.
- (3) "Southwest power pool" means the southwest power pool regional transmission organization or its federally recognized successor.
- (b) An incumbent electric transmission owner has the right to construct, own and maintain a new local electric transmission line that: (1) Has been approved for construction by the southwest power pool in any southwest power pool plan; and (2) connects to existing electric transmission lines owned by the incumbent.
- (c) The right to construct, own and maintain a new local electric transmission line that will interconnect to existing electric transmission lines that are owned by two or more incumbent electric transmission owners shall belong individually and equally to each incumbent electric transmission owner, unless otherwise agreed upon in writing by the incumbent electric transmission owners.
- (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect an incumbent electric transmission owner's use and control of its existing property rights, including, but not limited to, the incumbent electric transmission owner's ability to assign its rights to construct, own and maintain an electric transmission line described in subsection (b). The retention, modification or transfer of existing property rights described in subsection (b) shall remain subject to the relevant state law recognizing the property right.
