

2016 Kansas Statutes

41-355. Vineyard permit. (a) Any person engaged in business as a vineyard with not less than 100 vines may apply to the director for an annual vineyard permit.

(b) A vineyard permit shall authorize the sale in the original, unopened container and the serving by the drink of wine on the premises specified in the permit. A vineyard permit also shall authorize the permit holder to conduct wine tastings in accordance with K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 41-308d, and amendments thereto, on the premises specified in the permit. All wine sold or served by the permit holder shall be produced, in whole or in part, using grapes grown by the permit holder and shall be manufactured by a farm winery.

(c) Any wine not consumed on the premises shall be disposed of by the permit holder or, prior to its removal from the property, securely resealed and placed in a tamper-proof, transparent bag which is sealed in a manner that makes it visibly apparent if the bag is subsequently opened.

(d) Permits issued under this section shall be valid for one year from the date of issuance.

(e) The annual fee for a vineyard permit shall be \$100.

(f) The secretary may adopt rules and regulations as necessary to implement the provisions of this section.

(g) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas liquor control act.
