AN ACT concerning education; relating to school finance; transportation weighting calculation; amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5148 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5148 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-5148. (a) (1) The transportation weighting of each school district shall be determined by the state board as follows: 0 8 4 8 6
