SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 272 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 272 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 272 would require drivers to yield the right-of-way to authorized vehicles engaged in waste collection.

SB 272 has the potential for increasing litigation in the courts because of the new violation created by the bill. If it does, the Office of Judicial Administration indicates that there would be a fiscal effect on the operations of the court system. However, it is not possible to predict the number of additional court cases that would arise or how complex and time-consuming they would be. Therefore, a precise fiscal effect cannot be determined. In any case, the fiscal effect would most likely be accommodated within the existing schedule of court cases and would not require additional resources. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 272 is not reflected in *The FY 2019 Governor's Budget Report*.
