SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 461 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 461 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 461 would make technical corrections to reconcile conflicting amendments to statutes that were amended more than once during the current and prior legislative sessions. The bill would require the Division of Motor Vehicles of the Department of Revenue to include a question on the Driver's License Application that asks if the applicant is willing to be listed as an organ, eye, or tissue donor. Additionally, the bill would add the crime of aggravated internet trading in child pornography of a child less than 14 years of age to the list of crimes requiring a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of not less than 25 years.

The Kansas Bureau of Investigation, Department of Revenue, Sentencing Commission, and Office of Judicial Administration indicate that enactment of SB 461 would have no fiscal effect.
