AN ACT concerning veterans; relating to Native American veterans' income tax settlement claims; authorizing a study of such claims.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The legislature hereby finds and declares:

- (1) Native Americans have had a long history of serving their country through active duty in the armed forces of the United States during periods of both war and peace and have made great sacrifices in fulfilling such duty;
- (2) Native American veterans domiciled on tribal lands during their periods of active military service may have been exempt from paying state income taxes on their military income, but may have had state income taxes improperly withheld from their military income; and
- (3) Native American veterans now are barred by the state statute of limitations from claiming refunds of state income taxes that may have been improperly withheld from their military income, and even if not barred by the statute of limitations, the passage of time extending to decades will make it difficult for many Native American veterans to meet strict standards of proof that such veterans are entitled to a refund of improperly withheld state income taxes.
- (b) The department of revenue shall conduct a study of the extent to which Native America veterans domiciled on tribal lands during the period of such veterans' active military service had state income taxes improperly withheld from their military income. If such improper withholding is found to have occurred, the department shall determine the amount of state income taxes improperly withheld, and the number and identity of Native American veterans, or survivors of such veterans, affected by the improper withholding of state income taxes. The department shall also study the cost of implementing and administering a Native American veterans' income tax settlement fund, which fund would be used for the settlement of the claims by Native American veterans', or survivors of such veterans, for state income taxes improperly withheld.
- (c) The department shall report its findings and any recommendations and conclusions to the legislature and the governor on January 15, 2018.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
