 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to application and ballot signature
 requirements for disabled voters; amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 25-1122, 25-1124 and 25-1128 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 25-1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county 8 election officer where the person is a resident, or where the person is 9 authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for 10 an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only 11 to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as 12 otherwise provided by law.

(b) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to
be transmitted in person, the voter shall provide identification pursuant to
K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto.

16 (c) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to 17 be transmitted by mail, the voter shall provide with the application for an 18 advance voting ballot the voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license 19 number, nondriver's identification card number or a photocopy of any 20 other identification provided by K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto.

(d) A voter may vote a provisional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409,
and amendments thereto, if:

(1) The voter is unable or refuses to provide current and valididentification; or

25 (2) the name and address of the voter provided on the application for 26 an advance voting ballot do not match the voter's name and address on the 27 registration book. The voter shall provide a valid form of identification as 28 defined in K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto, to the county election 29 officer in person or provide a copy by mail or electronic means before the 30 meeting of the county board of canvassers. At the meeting of the county 31 board of canvassers the county election officer shall present copies of 32 identification received from provisional voters and the corresponding 33 provisional ballots. If the county board of canvassers determines that a 34 voter's identification is valid and the provisional ballot was properly cast, 35 the ballot shall be counted.

(e) No county election officer shall provide an advance voting ballot

to a person who is requesting an advance voting ballot to be transmitted bymail unless:

3 (1) The county election official verifies that the signature of the 4 person matches that on file in the county voter registration records, except 5 that verification of the voter's signature shall not be required if a voter has 6 a disability preventing the voter from signing. Signature verification may 7 occur by electronic device or by human inspection. In the event that the 8 signature of a person who is requesting an advance voting ballot does not 9 match that on file, the county election officer shall attempt to contact the 10 person and shall offer the person another opportunity to provide the person's signature for the purposes of verifying the person's identity. If the 11 county election officer is unable to reach the person, the county election 12 13 officer may transmit a provisional ballot, however, such provisional ballot may not be counted unless a signature is included therewith that can be 14 15 verified; and

16 (2) the person provides such person's full Kansas driver's license 17 number, Kansas nondriver's identification card number issued by the division of vehicles, or submits such person's application for an advance 18 voting ballot and a copy of identification provided by K.S.A. 25-2908, and 19 20 amendments thereto, to the county election officer for verification. If a 21 person applies for an advance voting ballot to be transmitted by mail but 22 fails to provide identification pursuant to this subsection or the 23 identification of the person cannot be verified by the county election 24 officer, the county election officer shall provide information to the person 25 regarding the voter rights provisions of subsection (d) and shall provide 26 the person an opportunity to provide identification pursuant to this 27 subsection. For the purposes of this act, Kansas state offices and offices of 28 any subdivision of the state will allow any person seeking to vote by an 29 advance voting ballot the use of a photocopying device to make one 30 photocopy of an identification document at no cost.

(f) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to thevoter by mail shall be filed only at the following times:

(1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August
in both even-numbered and odd-numbered years, between April 1 of such
year and the Tuesday of the week preceding such primary election.

36 (2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday following the 37 first Monday in November in both even-numbered and odd-numbered 38 years, between 90 days prior to such election and the Tuesday of the week 39 preceding such general election.

40 (3) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a
41 primary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for election
42 of officers at such election.

43 (4) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a

primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice
 thereof and the Tuesday of the week preceding such question submitted
 election, except that if the question submitted election is held on a day
 other than a Tuesday, the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots
 shall be one week before such election.

6 (5) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified by 7 the secretary of state.

8 The county election officer of any county may receive applications 9 prior to the time specified in this subsection and hold such applications 10 until the beginning of the prescribed application period. Such applications 11 shall be treated as filed on that date.

12 (g) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election office, 13 applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the Tuesday next 14 15 preceding the election and on each subsequent business day until no later 16 than 12 noon on the day preceding such election. If the county election 17 officer so provides, applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer also may be 18 19 filed on the Saturday preceding the election. Upon receipt of any such 20 properly executed application, the county election officer shall deliver to 21 the voter such ballots and instructions as are provided for in this act.

An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the close of the polls on election day.

The county election officer may designate places other than the central county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for advance voting ballots. Ballots and instructions shall be delivered to the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by this subsection.

(h) Any person having a permanent disability or an illness which has been diagnosed as a permanent illness is hereby authorized to make an application for permanent advance voting status. Applications for permanent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such information as is required for application for advance voting ballots and also shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to permanent advance voting status.

40 (i) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this
41 section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such
42 officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such
43 applications, together with their correct post office address and the

1 precinct, ward, township or voting area in which the persons claim to be 2 registered voters or to be authorized by law to vote as former precinct 3 residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Names and 4 addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The county 5 election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names and addresses 6 of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status. All such lists 7 shall be available for inspection upon request in compliance with this 8 subsection by any registered voter during regular business hours. The 9 county election officer upon receipt of the applications shall enter upon a 10 record kept by such officer the name and address of each applicant, which record shall conform to the list above required. Before inspection of any 11 12 advance voting ballot application list, the person desiring to make the 13 inspection shall provide to the county election officer identification in the form of driver's license or other reliable identification and shall sign a log 14 15 book or application form maintained by the officer stating the person's 16 name and address and showing the date and time of inspection. All records 17 made by the county election officer shall be subject to public inspection, 18 except that the voter identification information required by subsections (b) 19 and (c) and the identifying number on ballots and ballot envelopes and 20 records of such numbers shall not be made public.

21 (i) If a person on the permanent advance voting list fails to vote in 22 four consecutive general elections held on the Tuesday succeeding the first 23 Monday in November of each even-numbered and odd-numbered year, the 24 county election officer may mail a notice to such voter. The notice shall 25 inform the voter that the voter's name will be removed from the permanent 26 advance voting list unless the voter renews the application for permanent 27 advance voting status within 30 days after the notice is mailed. If the voter 28 fails to renew such application, the county election officer shall remove the 29 voter's name from the permanent advance voting list. Failure to renew the 30 application for permanent advance voting status shall not result in removal 31 of the voter's name from the voter registration list.

(k) The secretary of state may adopt rules and regulations in order to
 implement the provisions of this section and to define valid forms of
 identification.

35 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 25-1124 is hereby amended to read as 36 follows: 25-1124. (a) Upon receipt of the advance voting ballot, the voter 37 shall cast such voter's vote as follows: The voter shall make a cross or 38 check mark in the square or parentheses opposite the name of each 39 candidate or question for whom the voter desires to vote. The voter shall 40 make no other mark, and shall allow no other person to make any mark, upon such ballot. If the advance voting ballot was transmitted by mail, the 41 42 voter personally shall place the ballot in the ballot envelope bearing the 43 same number as the ballot and seal the envelope. The voter shall complete

the form on the ballot envelope and shall sign the same. Except as provided by K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto, the ballot envelope shall be mailed or otherwise transmitted to the county election officer. If the advance voting ballot was transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer or at a satellite advance voting site, the

6 voter may deposit such ballot into a locked ballot box without an envelope. 7 (b) Any voter who has an illness or physical disability or who is not 8 proficient in reading the English language-that and is unable to apply for 9 or mark or transmit an advance voting ballot, or any voter who has a 10 disability preventing the voter from signing an application or the form on the ballot envelope, may request assistance by a person who has signed a 11 12 statement required by subsection (d) in applying for or marking an advance voting ballot, or in signing an application or the form on the 13 ballot envelope if the voter has a disability preventing the voter from 14 15 signing.

16 (c) Any voted ballot may be transmitted to the county election officer 17 by the voter or by another person designated in writing by the voter, 18 except if the voter has a disability preventing the voter from writing and 19 signing a statement, the written and signed statement required by 20 subsection (d) shall be sufficient. Any such voted ballot shall be 21 transmitted to the county election officer before the close of the polls on 22 election day.

23 (d) The county election officer shall allow a person to assist a voter 24 who has an illness or physical disability or who is not proficient in reading 25 the English language in applying for or marking an application or advance 26 voting ballot, or to sign for a voter who has a disability preventing the 27 voter from signing an application or advance voting ballot form, provided 28 a written statement is signed by the person who renders assistance to the 29 voter who has an illness or physical disability or who is not proficient in 30 reading the English language and such statement is submitted to the county 31 election officer with the application or ballot. The statement shall be on a 32 form prescribed by the secretary of state and shall contain a statement 33 from the person providing assistance that the person has not exercised 34 undue influence on the voting decision of the voter who has an illness or 35 physical disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language 36 and that the person providing assistance has completed the application-or, 37 marked the ballot, or signed the application or ballot form as instructed by 38 the voter.

(e) Any person assisting a voter who has an illness or physical
disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language in
applying for or marking an advance voting ballot, or in signing an
application or advance voting ballot form for a voter who has a disability
preventing the voter from signing the application or advance voting ballot

form, who knowingly fails to sign and submit the statement required by
 this section or who exercises undue influence on the voting decision of
 such voter shall be guilty of a severity level 9, nonperson felony.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 25-1128 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-1128. (a) No voter shall knowingly mark or transmit to the county election officer more than one advance voting ballot, or set of one of each kind of ballot, if the voter is entitled to vote more than one such ballot at a particular election.

9 (b) Except as provided in K.S.A. 25-1124, and amendments thereto, 10 no person shall knowingly interfere with or delay the transmission of any advance voting ballot application from a voter to the county election 11 12 officer, nor shall any person mail, fax or otherwise cause the application to 13 be sent to a place other than the county election office. Any person or group engaged in the distribution of advance voting ballot applications 14 shall mail, fax or otherwise deliver any application signed by a voter to the 15 16 county election office within two days after such application is signed by 17 the applicant.

(c) Except as otherwise provided by law, no person other than the
 voter, shall knowingly mark, sign or transmit to the county election officer
 any advance voting ballot or advance voting ballot envelope.

(d) Except as otherwise provided by law, no person shall knowingly sign an application for an advance voting ballot for another person. This provision shall not apply if a voter has a disability preventing the voter from signing an application or if an immediate family member signs an application on behalf of another immediate family member with proper authorization being given.

(e) No person, unless authorized by K.S.A. 25-1122 or K.S.A. 251124, and amendments thereto, shall knowingly intercept, interfere with,
or delay the transmission of advance voting ballots from the county
election officer to the voter.

(f) No person shall knowingly and falsely affirm, declare or subscribe
to any material fact in an affirmation form for an advance voting ballot or
set of advance voting ballots.

34 (g) A voter may return such voter's advance voting ballot to the 35 county election officer by personal delivery or by mail. Upon written 36 designation by the voter, a person other than the voter may return the 37 advance voting ballot by personal delivery or mail, except that a written 38 designation shall not be required from a voter who has a disability 39 preventing the voter from writing or signing a written designation. Any such person designated by the voter shall sign a statement that such person 40 has not exercised undue influence on the voting decisions of the voter and 41 agrees to deliver the ballot as directed by the voter. 42

43 (h) Violation of any provision of this section is a severity level 9,

- nonperson felony. 1
