Representative Huebert:

I am a life-long Kansas citizen.

I am concerned about the increasing number of vaccines being mandated by the KDHE for our Kansas school children. These drugs come with very large folded inserts that list the potential of serious risks. No one knows in advance who could become harmed. As the school mandated vaccine schedule continues to increase, when will enough be enough?

It is morally wrong to force any person to be injected with a drug that could injure or cause death. We need voluntary choice and opt-out options available to all Kansas citizens.

Several mandated vaccines contain aborted fetal tissue. For example, the Hepatitis A vaccine contains aborted fetal tissue from the lung tissue of a 14-week-old aborted Caucasian male fetus (MRC-5). There are no safety studies that show injecting foreign DNA of another person into bodies is safe.

There are many of us Kansans who ethically object to the tissue of a baby from an abortion being injected into our bodies and our children or grandchildren's bodies. Is it reasonable that we should have the freedom to choose if we want the DNA of another person injected into our bodies?

If the state mandates vaccines, it should have the responsibility of proving that vaccines have been adequately tested and proven safe. Many required vaccines have not been tested with true placebos. No vaccine has been studied for its carcinogenic, mutagenic effect, or its effect on fertility (13.1 on the package insert). The effects of combined vaccines and the cumulative effects of repeated vaccines have never been studied.

In 1986 Congress passed the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act which is still in place today. This act has removed legal and financial liability from vaccine manufacturers for injuries caused by their products. It opened the door for vaccine manufacturers to produce sub-standard products by taking away their financial incentive to ensure safety. This also opened the door for the number of mandated vaccines on the required school schedule to triple.

The weight of favor regarding vaccines for many years has been entirely one sided towards the vaccine manufacturer and the medical model which promotes it heavily. Tens of thousands of parents have learned the hard way that the “one in a million” has struck home with their own family.

Many Kansas parents are being harassed and frightened in making parental health decisions. These parents are hiding, not coming out, wondering where they can move and feel safe. They love their children in a way the government cannot.

This letter explains just a few of my concerns. I have great distrust with the present unlimited power of the KDHE. I gratefully and wholeheartedly support the proposed legislation which will limit the power of the KDHE to mandate additional vaccines.

Thank you for introducing this bill on behalf of the health of our Kansas children.
