Re: Testimony against House Bill 2454

Sen. Lynn and members of the Committee:

Whether the effort originates within the private sector (e.g., self-storage businesses) or the public sector (e.g., the City of Oskaloosa), I basically view all efforts to give businesses and governmental entities the option to place public notices online and only online or "in any other commercially reasonable manner" as moving away from transparency and toward secrecy at some level. Please give me a break! How many people do you know of who actually get up in the morning and say to themselves, "I need to get online as soon as possible and start looking for public notices so I don't miss out on any hearings today or any good buys down at Storage City."

This bill?
