AN ACT concerning education; relating to school districts; requiring
 publication of bullying policies; report on bullying incidents at each
 attendance center; amending K.S.A. 72-6147 and repealing the existing
 section.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

7 Section 1. K.S.A. 72-6147 is hereby amended to read as follows: 728 6147. (a) As used in this section:

(1) "Bullying" means:

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10 (A) Any intentional gesture or any intentional written, verbal, 11 electronic or physical act or threat either by any student, staff member or 12 parent towards a student or by any student, staff member or parent towards 13 a staff member that is sufficiently severe, persistent or pervasive that such 14 gesture, act or threat creates an intimidating, threatening or abusive 15 educational environment that a reasonable person, under the 16 circumstances, knows or should know will have the effect of:

17 (i) Harming a student or staff member, whether physically or 18 mentally;

19 (ii) damaging a student's or staff member's property;

20 (iii) placing a student or staff member in reasonable fear of harm to 21 the student or staff member; or

(iv) placing a student or staff member in reasonable fear of damage tothe student's or staff member's property;

(B) cyberbullying; or

(C) any other form of intimidation or harassment prohibited by the
board of education of the school district in policies concerning bullying
adopted pursuant to this section or subsection (c) of K.S.A. 72-1138(e),
and amendments thereto.

(2) "Cyberbullying" means bullying by use of any electronic
communication device through means including, but not limited to, e-mail,
instant messaging, text messages, blogs, mobile phones, pagers, online
games and websites.

(3) "Parent" includes a guardian, custodian or other person withauthority to act on behalf of the child.

35 (4) "School district" or "district" means any unified school district36 organized and operating under the laws of this state.

4 (3) Any information published or distributed pursuant to paragraph 5 (1) shall include instructions for the public on how to obtain and view any 6 training and educational requirements or materials for students and 7 school staff members.

8 (f) (1) Each school district shall annually submit to the state board of 9 education a report containing the following information for each 10 attendance center within the school district for the preceding school year:

11 (A) The number of unique bullying incidents reported, including, but 12 not limited to, the number of unique victims, the number of unique 13 perpetrators and whether or not such incidents were anonymous or in-14 person;

15 *(B)* the types of bullying incidents reported, including, but not limited 16 to, physical bullying, verbal bullying, cyberbullying or indirect bullying; 17 and

18 (*C*) the number of reported bullying incidents resolved in each of the 19 following manners:

20 *(i) Counseling and remediation;*

- 21 *(ii) in-school suspension;*
- 22 (iii) out-of-school suspension;

23 *(iv) expulsion;*

24 (v) referral to law enforcement;

25 (vi) a finding of no bullying incident; and

26 (vii) any other method of resolution.

27 (2) [Each school district shall publish the report submitted pursuant

28 to paragraph (1) on the school district's website with a link prominently

29 posted on the homepage of such website. Each attendance center that has

30 its own website shall publish the information in the report submitted

31 pursuant to paragraph (1) that is specific to such attendance center on its-

32 website with a link prominently posted on the homepage of such website.

33 (3) The state board of education shall annually compile the reports 34 submitted pursuant to paragraph (1) and prepare a summary report that 35 shall be submitted to the senate committee on education and the house of 36 representatives committee on education.

37 (g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit or supersede or
38 in any manner affect or diminish the requirements of compliance by a staff
39 member with the provisions of K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 38-2223 or 38-2226,
40 and amendments thereto.
