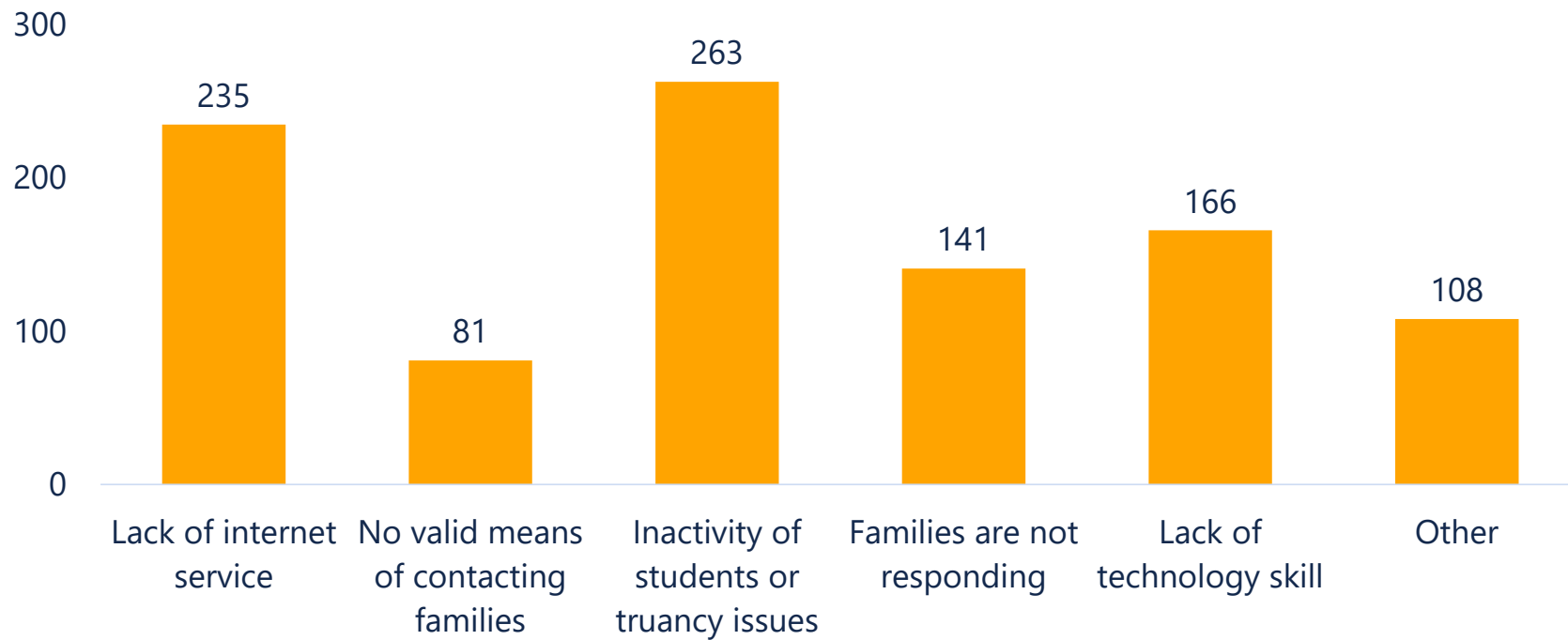

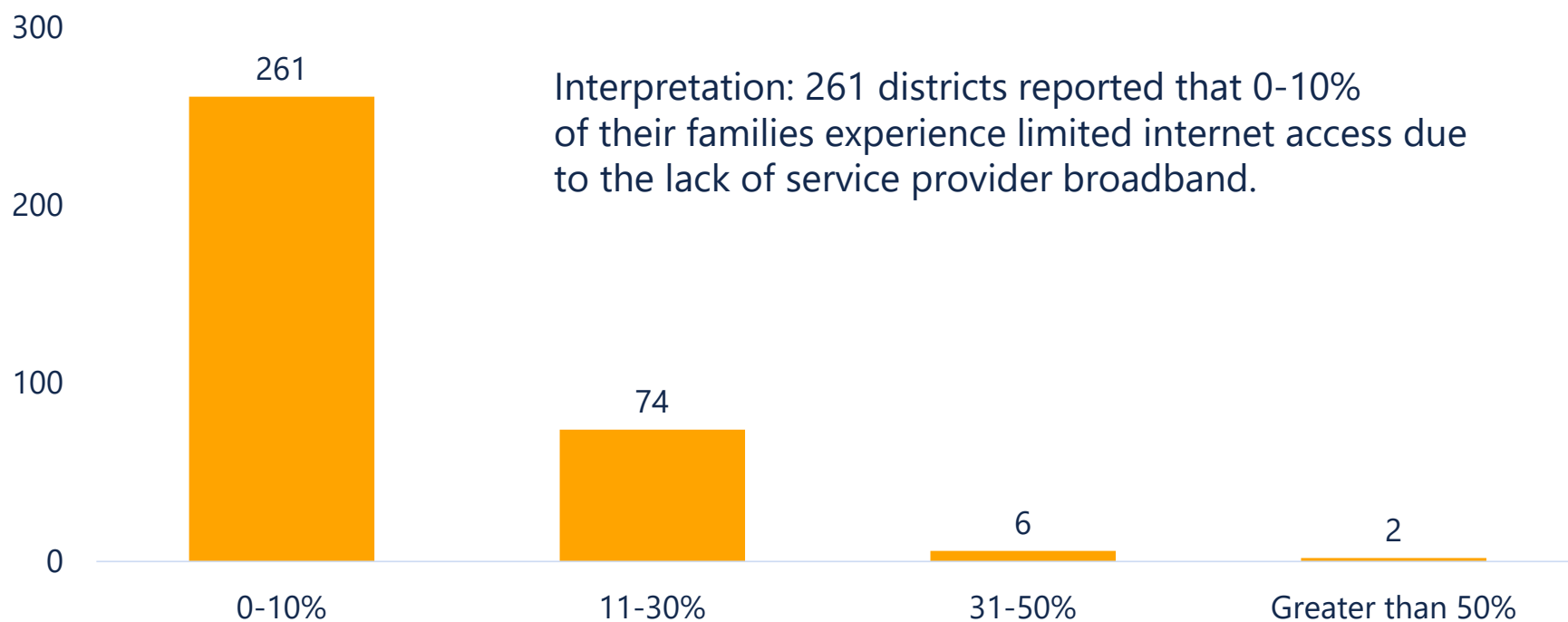
Total number of districts reporting barriers encountered while providing continuous learning opportunities

N=343 districts



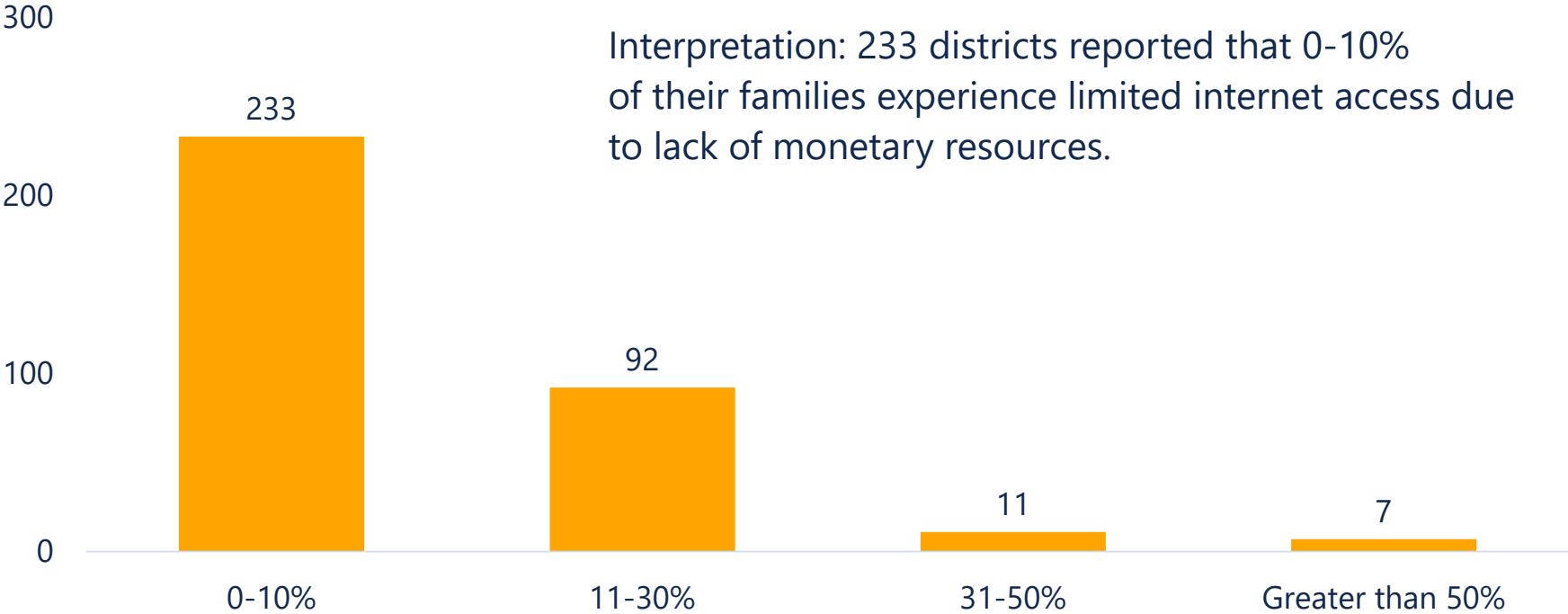
What percent of your families have no or limited access to internet capabilities due to lack of internet service provider broadband?

N= 343 districts

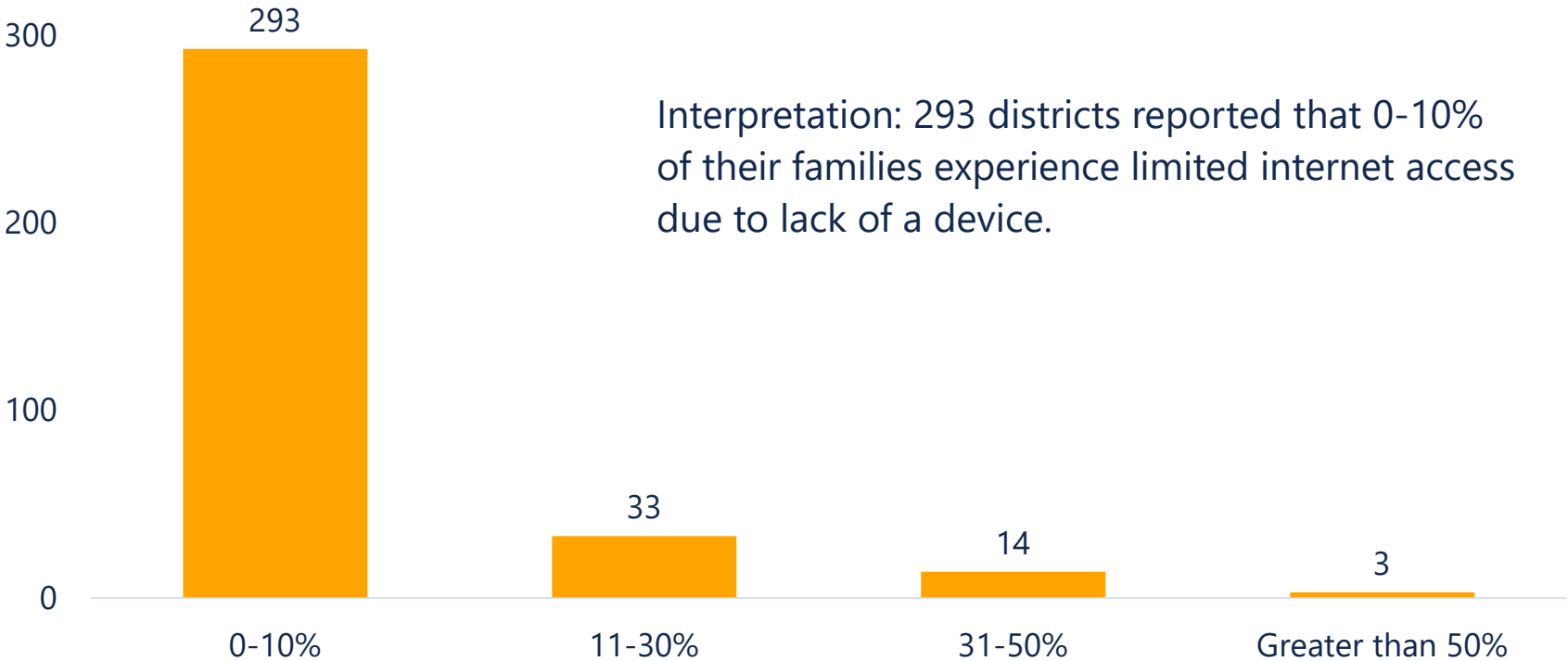


Interpretation: 233 districts reported that 0-10% of their families experience limited internet access due to lack of monetary resources.



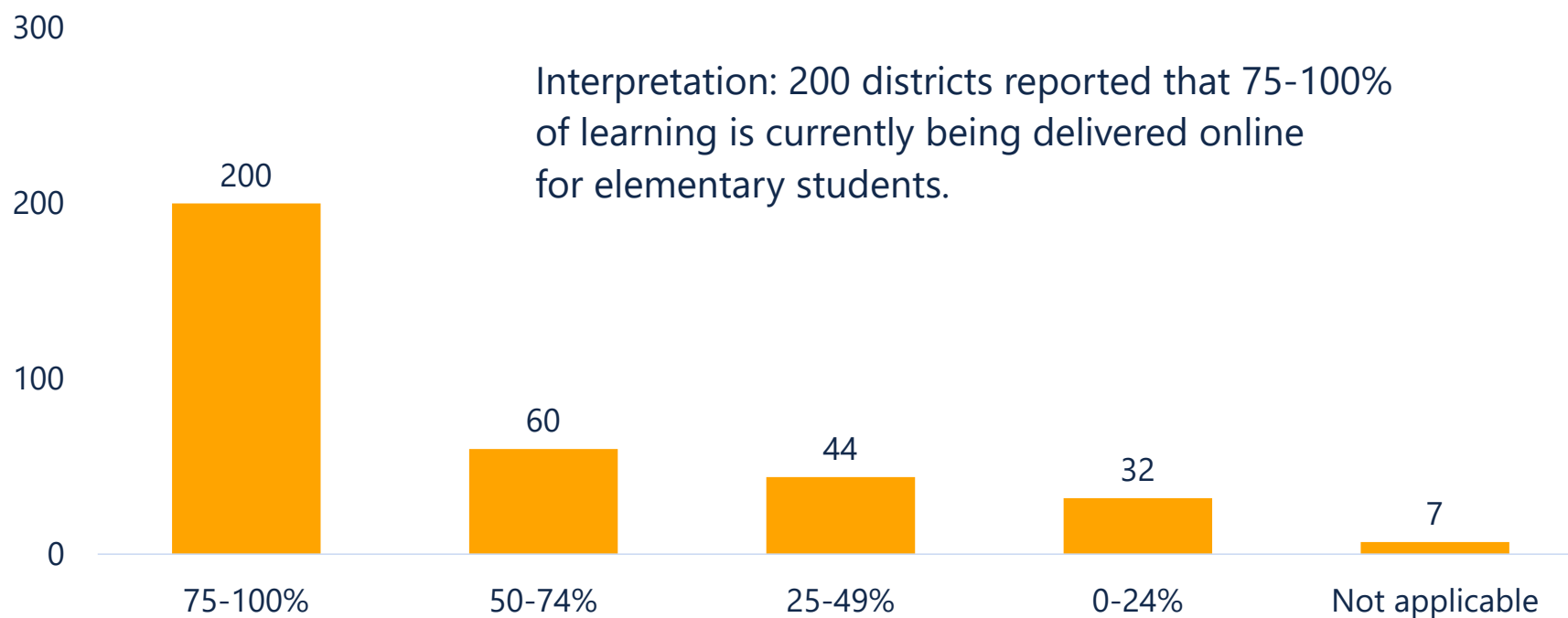
What percent of your families have no or limited access to internet capabilities due to lack of a device (laptop, iPad, etc.)?

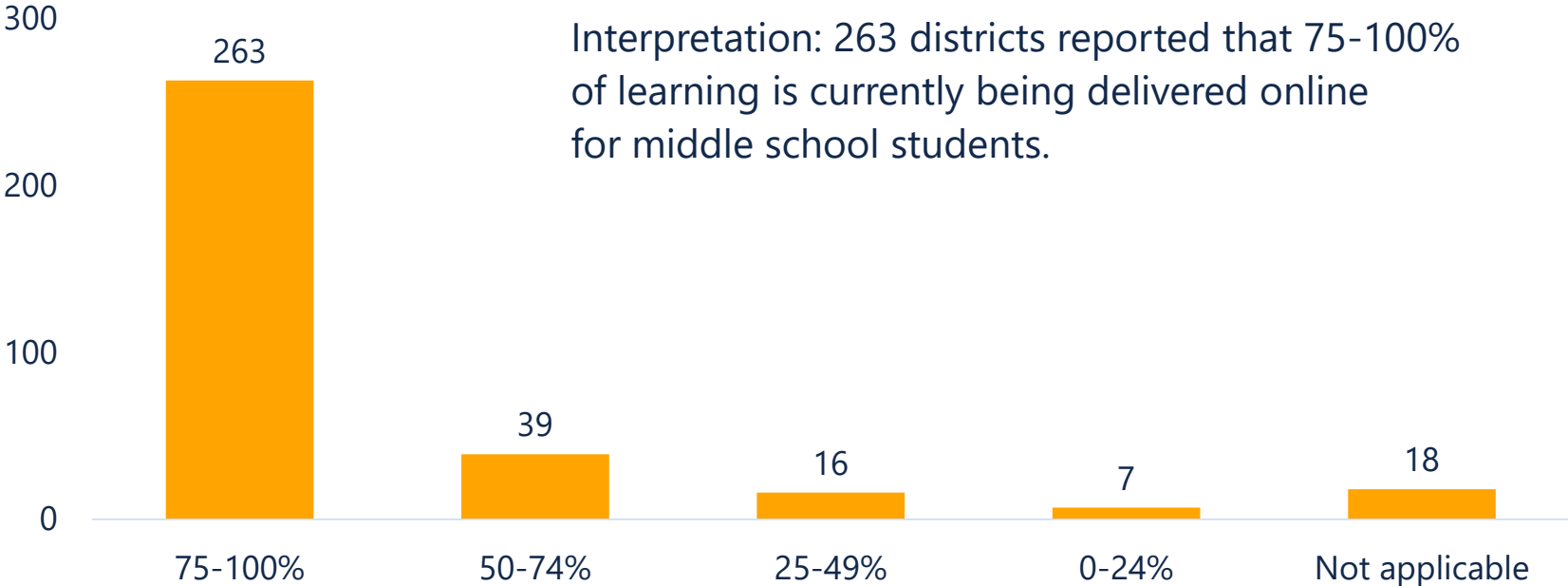
What percent of learning is currently being delivered online for elementary students?

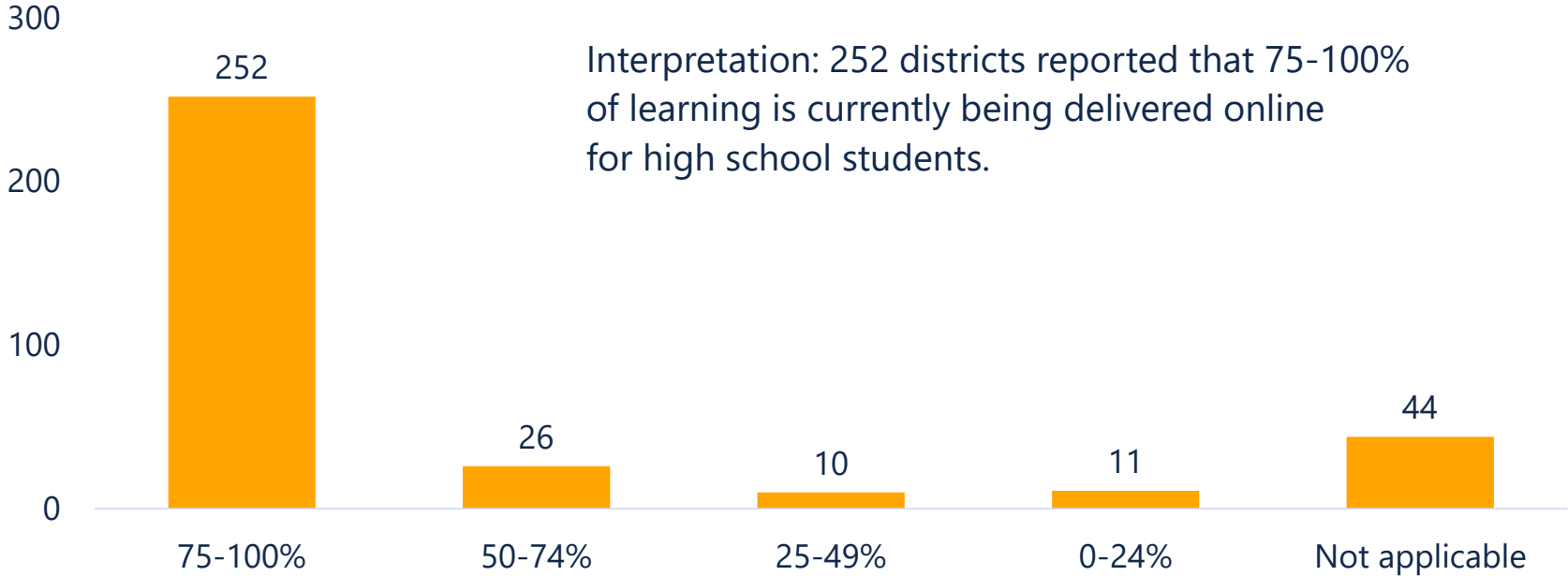
What percent of learning is currently being delivered online for middle school students?

N= 343 districts



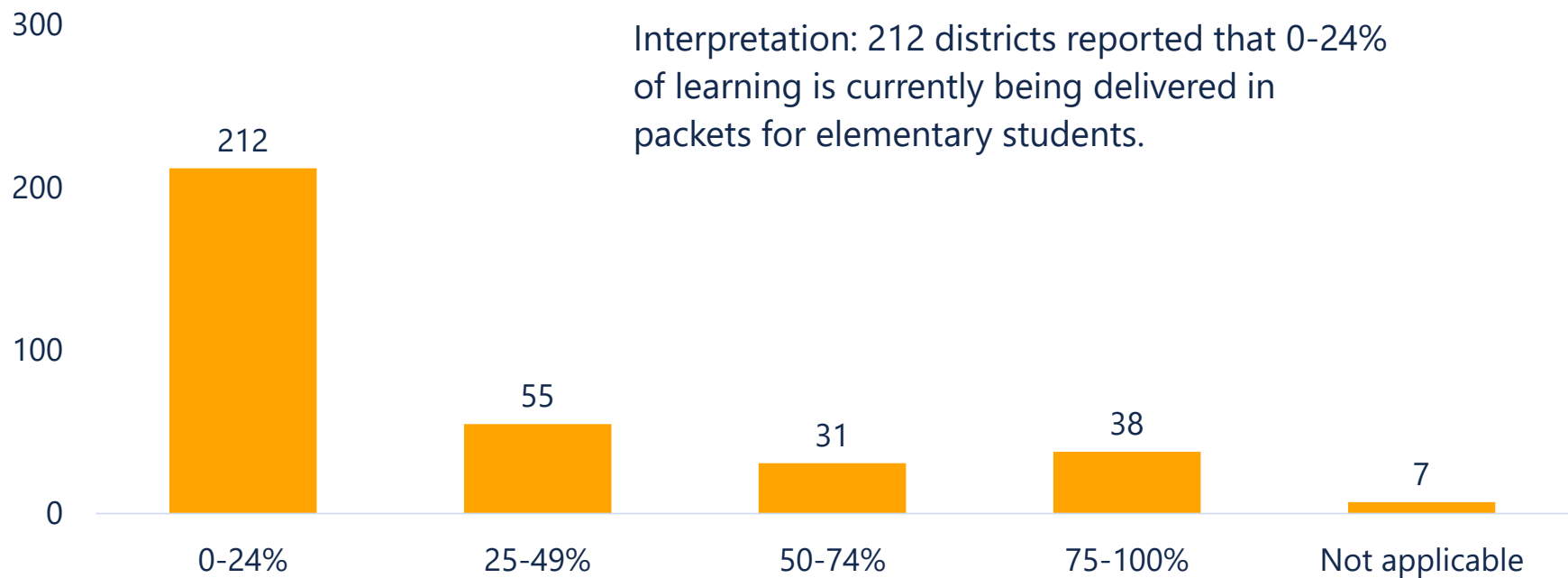
What percent of learning is currently being delivered online for high school students?

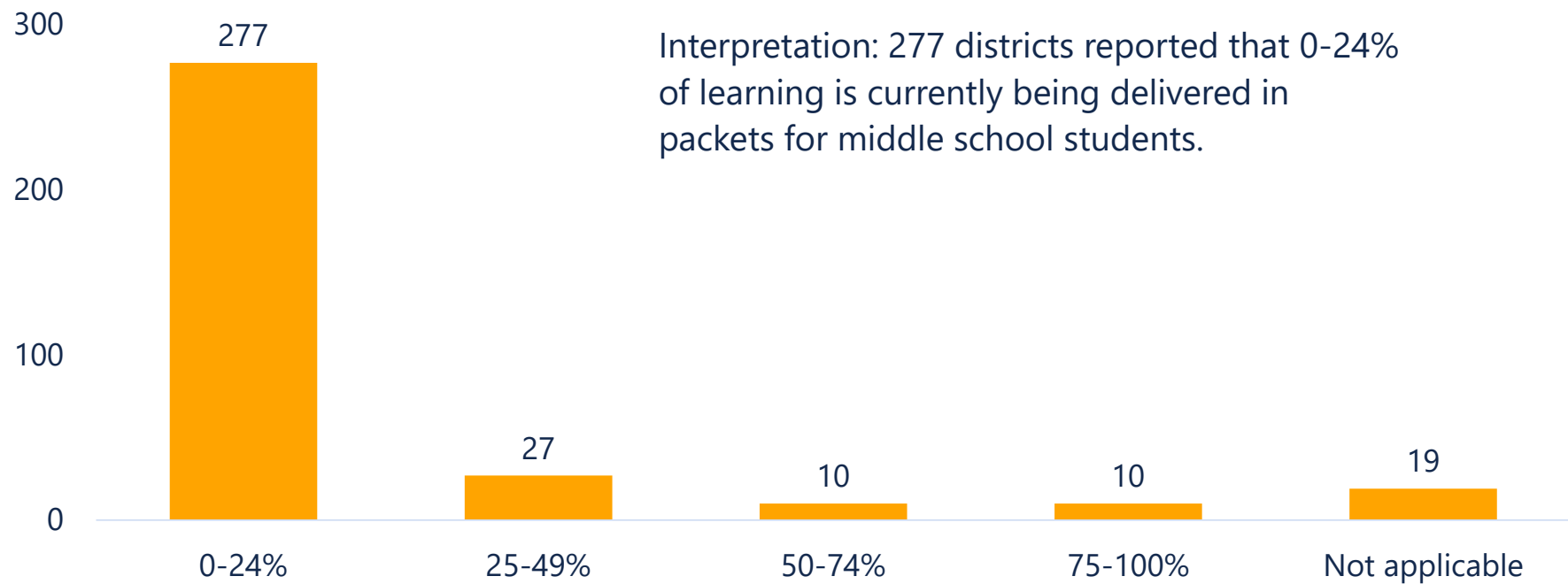
What percent of learning is currently being delivered in packets for elementary students?

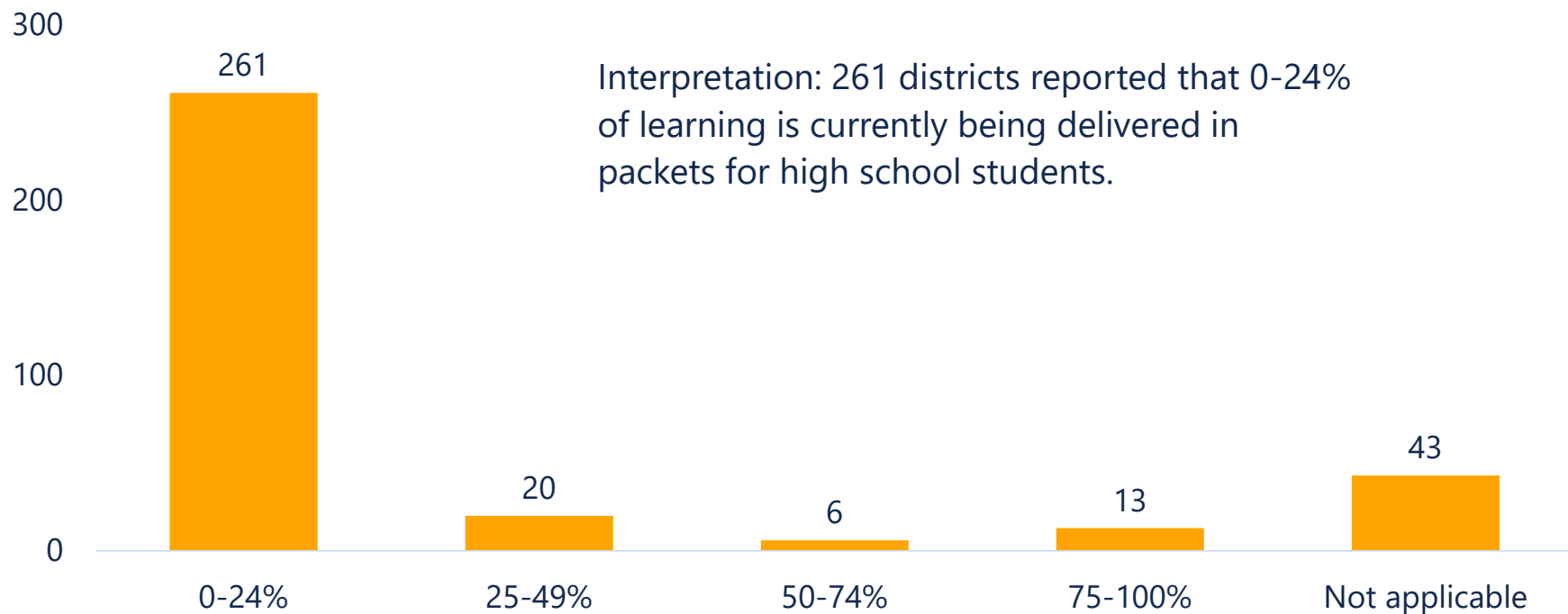


Interpretation: 277 districts reported that 0-24% of learning is currently being delivered in packets for middle school students.



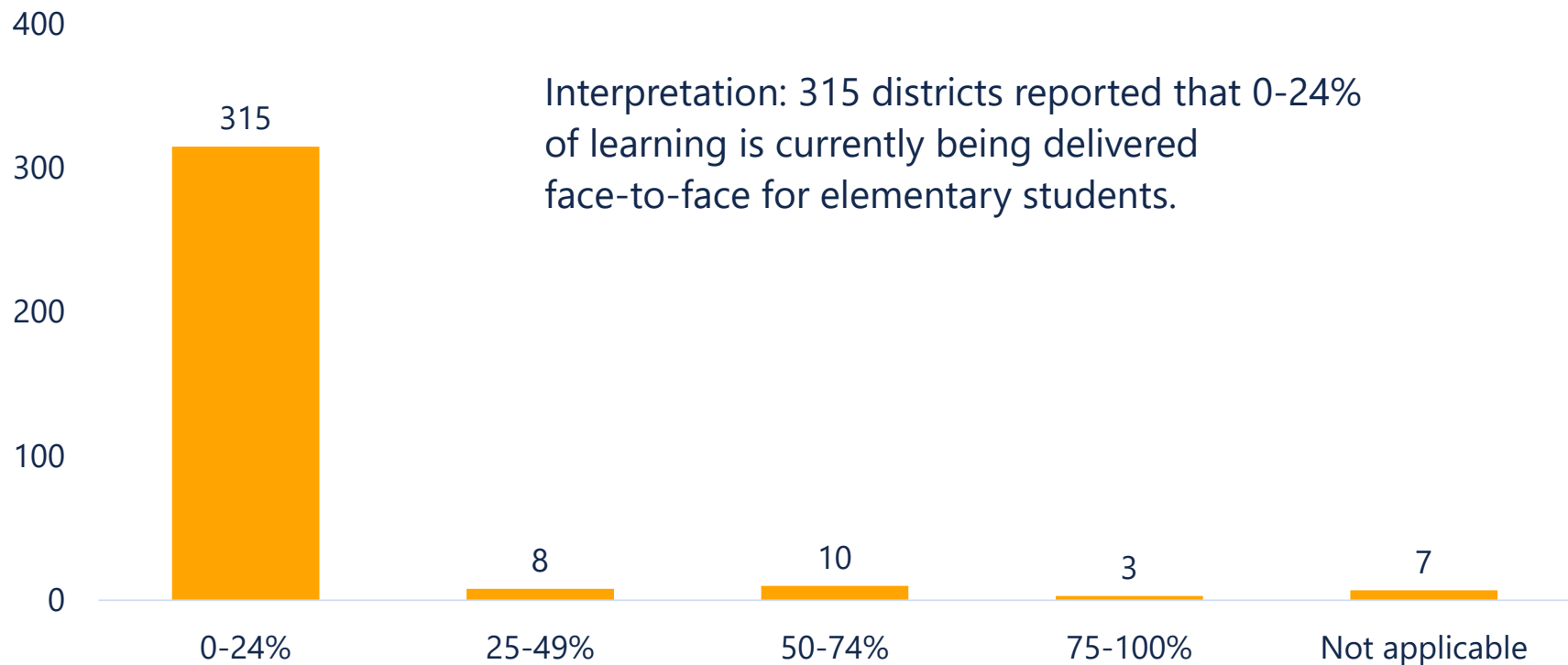
What percent of learning is currently being delivered in packets for high school students?

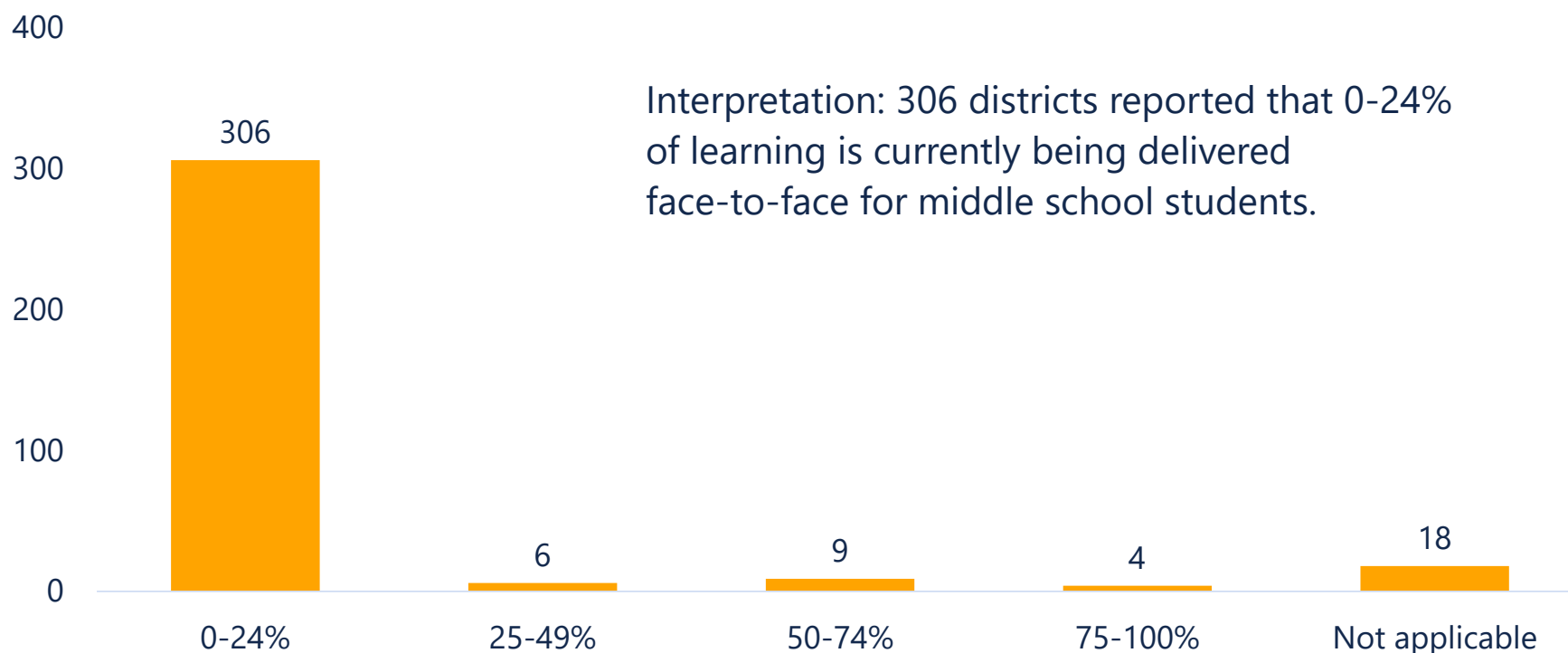
What percent of learning is currently being delivered face-to-face for elementary students?

N= 343 districts



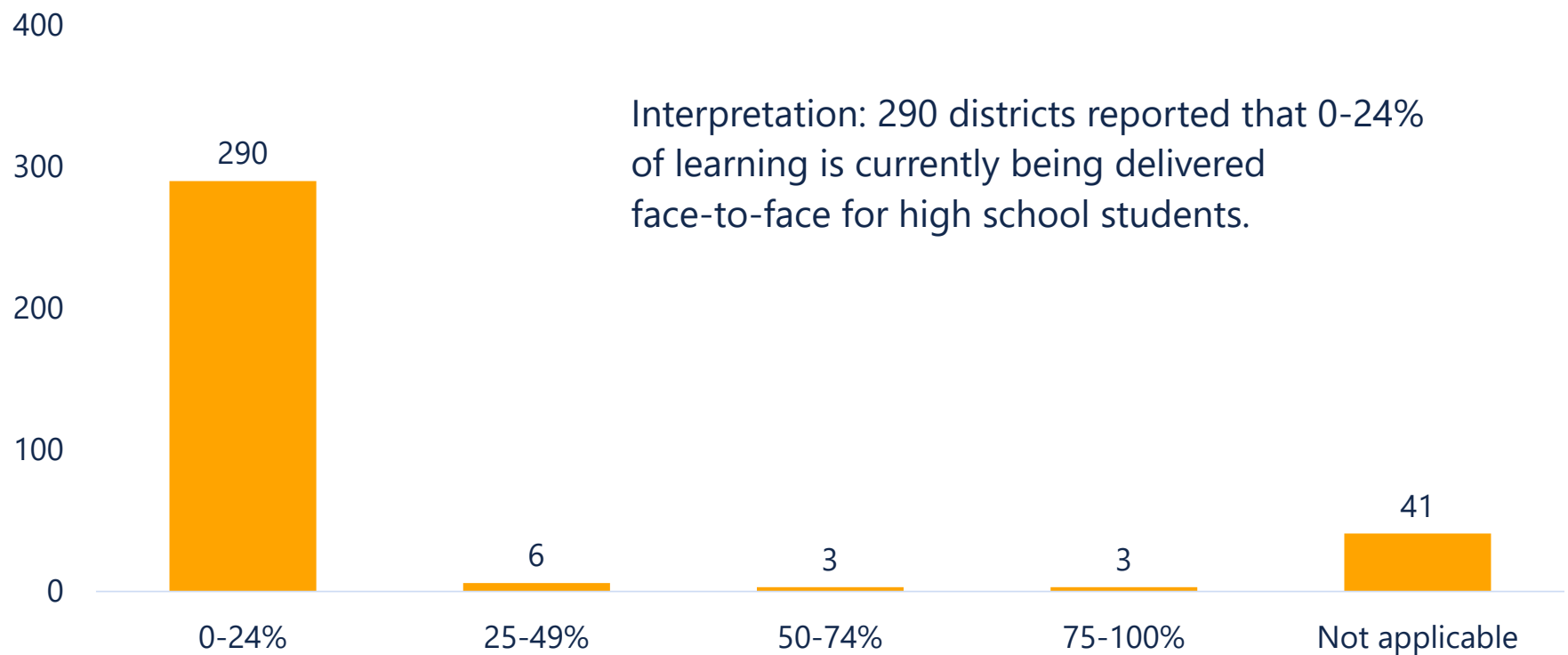
What percent of learning is currently being delivered face-to-face for middle school students?

Planning for Next Year

- We are cautiously optimistic we will be in school in August 2020



Planning for Next Year – Stage 1

- Currently have over 80 educators working on standards and assessments
 - Grade Band the standards
 - Pre-K-2, 3-4, 6-8 and 9-12
 - Deconstruct standards into priority and extended standards
 - Combine standards in Arts/Humanities and STEAM
 - Develop competencies for all learning standards



Planning for Next Year – Stage 1

- Recommend assessment levels to ensure learning at a “3” or “4” on competencies related to the learning standards
- **Formative and interim state assessments, MAP testing, AIMSweb, DIBELS and FastBridge will be examined to ensure levels “3” and “4” learning with competencies**



Planning for Next Year – Stage 2

- Starts on June 1, 2020
- **Hundreds of educators, parents, board members and legislators work on two distinct parts of the plan:**
 - **HOW to implement a new learning plan**
 - **What and How are the conditions for logistically opening schools and ensuring safety**
 - **Work to be completed by July 1, 2020**



Planning for Next Year – Stage 2

- **Work released and reviewed by all Kansas superintendents on Friday, July 10, 2020**
- **State Board receives report and votes on guidance plans on July 14-15, 2020**
- **If approved, entire Pre-K-12 field receives guidance document(s) to start planning for 2020-21 school year**
