SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2125 by House Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2125 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, every licensee operating a motor vehicle must display his or her license to law enforcement or officers of the Division of Vehicles upon demand. HB 2125 would require licensees to deliver the license to law enforcement or officers of the Division of Vehicles upon demand.

The Department of Revenue indicates enactment of HB 2125 would have no fiscal effect on the Department. The Judicial Branch estimates enactment of HB 2125 would have a negligible fiscal effect on the courts and the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training estimates no fiscal effect on law enforcement operations. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2125 is not reflected in *The FY 2020 Governor's Budget Report*.
